St Leonard's Churchyard

On Sunday 31st October we had a visit from the Basingstoke Conservation Volunteers (BCV) to help with the management of our Site of Importance for Nature Conservation (SINC).

These SINC areas of the churchyard are agriculturally unimproved land, the grassy areas being cut only once a year to encourage seeding, and therefore they retain an excellent variety of wildflowers and grasses. These areas also provide good habitats for other wildlife, and we are pleased to be able to manage this land for biodiversity.

We had a team of 8 BCV volunteers and 6 villagers carrying out tasks such as scything, raking, bramble management and brush cutting resulting in many arduous trips to the compost heap!!



We provided refreshments during the day for which they were very grateful.

It was a happy day and, after a very unpromising, wet and windy start, the sun shone on us!!

BDBC LOCAL PLAN UPDATE – HOUSING FIGURES

Ward Cllr Mark Ruffell argues for BDBC to challenge and reduce Government-imposed housing numbers. New housing delivery in the borough over recent decades has been very high.

Cllr Ruffell's new portfolio – for the Natural Environment and Climate Improvement – is the counterbalance to this: 'We must stand up to protect the natural environment. We must do something about this.'

'The Loddon unites us in a common cause – to achieve acceptance that we have a river system of major importance whose ecology is under threat – from its aquifer to its river valley beyond the sewage works, it is all interlinked. We cannot keep putting

this ever expanding pressure onto one small river.'

Maria Miller is urging us all to build a case for 'exceptional circumstances' which evidence the need for lower housing numbers. The levels of threat to our natural (and built) environments are such that the housing numbers currently proposed are unsustainable and incompatible with declared Ecological and Climate emergencies.

We urge everyone to write to our three Basing Ward Councilors to give them this mandate to challenge the housing numbers:

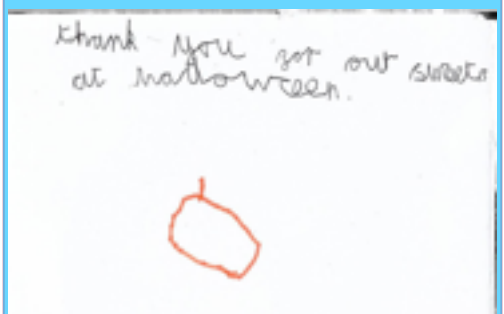
