

Traffic Stats 23 Mar – 19 Apr Tesco Bridge

The stats show that there is still a significant number of people speeding, particularly up the hill (279 vehicles more than 45mph – top speed 71 mph) out of the village towards Andover. Volumes of traffic are as high as ever.

The Parish Council has passed these stats (and more) to our Police Community Support Officer who will arrange for some speed gun sessions here and up the Hatherden Road where speeding remains prevalent. Let's do better!

Thank you for those who completed the online survey or the paper questionnaire in the spring edition of Charlton News. Not a huge response and so it is difficult to draw firm conclusions. But:

- Confirmed Quarterly Charlton News delivered to households was liked.
- Newsletter is available on Parish Council website and so there was a suggestion that individuals should be able to opt out of paper copy (saves paper). The mechanics of doing this would be considered.
- Some support for moving to a Community website with Parish Council as a page but no volunteer webmaster has yet come forward so this is on hold.
- A Charlton App had some support and may be looked at further.
