## **River Bank opposite Tesco**

Following advice from the Hampshire and IoW Wildlife Trust the Parish Council have a scheme to repair the river bank. It still needs approval from the Environment Agency but is hoped when the river flow reduces, to repair the bank with ecology in mind. We hope to able to see native wildflowers and more active wildlife as a result. The wooden railings across the bridge will soon be installed and it is hoped to encourage bankside flora and fauna to flourish by carefully increasing light to the stretch of the river that flows towards Charlie's Lake. Work is ongoing and thank you to the local residents for their continued cooperation.

## **Speedwatch**

An additional Speed Indicator has been installed on Goch Way. It faces traffic leaving the village but records traffic in and out of the village. Speeding is endemic in Charlton. The vast majority of road users comply but many do not. The warning signs cause many people to check and reduce speed so this is a good investment. It's even more effective if there is a person in Hi Vis jacket so Speedwatch needs to be reintroduced. Please contact Clive Ward if you would be willing to offer 30 mins of your time once a week. The Parish Council is still working with our local police to improve speed enforcement - 30 mph in modern cars seems very slow but the effect can be devastating. Hampshire is being lobbied to introduce 20 mph instead of 30mph in many locations – we will keep you posted if this gains momentum.

## **Climate Change**

The **Greening Campaign** is backed (and subsidized) by Hampshire County Council. It is not a political organization and not linked to any political organization or affiliated organization. Charlton Parish Council judges this to be something we should adopt and has requested Mike Cripps to launch the Campaign shortly. It is not rocket science but a structured approach to doing good things for the climate and the environment. It recognizes that all our lives are different but that everybody can do something to help.
