4. Matters Arising from 4th April 2017

Following the visit by PCSO James Goss and his colleagues, who were not involved with incidents within Egerton, Richard proposed setting up a meeting with PCSO Angie Burden who is involved with Egerton. Angie works as PCSO on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday and as Richard would like the Clerk to attend the meeting, whose work days are Tuesday and Thursday, Richard asked if the Clerk could attend to suit Angie. He also asked Peter if he could attend the meeting. The Clerk will liaise with Peter and Richard to try and set a meeting when all are available.

a) Footpaths and stiles:

Report No. 86 of the Egerton Footpaths Representative – June 2017 Outstanding Footpath Issues:

<u>A GREAT SUCCESS</u> to our longstanding request for a kissing gate at Bramley Farm (Olivers) along Coach Road. A beautiful metal kissing gate now gives fantastic access. Must try this path sometime!

- 1. **AW92 New Road to Orchard and Tumulus etc.** Spoke to Jonathon Harmer at the Parish Assembly. He is going to arrange for a pedestrian gate to be put in soon. Still *nothing yet*.
- 2. PROW323726 Rotten wood barrier at Raymond Shrubb's footpath. Still Work scheduled.
- 3. **PROW237696.** AW68 from Rockhill Road before Tim's house straight across adjacent to Rockdale Farm the stile there has rotten wooden struts which makes the plank very unstable and dangerous. Still *Awaiting Allocation*.
- 4. **PROW597453.** AW68 further along from above, marked as a stile but is a fence-type structure almost impossible to climb over, plus there is a metal sheep gate attached with string to that which you have to push forward to get it out of the way before you can attempt to climb over this structure. Still *Awaiting Allocation*.
- 5. **PROW276419.** AW91 the footpath to the side of Bedewell up the steps and straight ahead along field to point of woods at Egerton House. Fingerpost has fallen down. Still *Work Scheduled*.

- 6. **PROW818728.** AW81. From Stone Hill along the ridge to near the end of the path at Greenhill, the wooden stile has broken. Still *Awaiting Allocation*.
- 7. **PROW306422.** A villager reported a fallen wooden fingerpost along the Iden Lane byway towards the Pluckley end. Looks like rotten wood caused it to fall. Still *Allocated Awaiting Inspection*.
- 8. **PROW362453.** AW72. Claire reported that between Forstal Farm and Poplar Farm the fingerpost is broken. Reported in February but mistakenly omitted from these reports. Status as of this report is *Allocated Awaiting Inspection*.
- 9. **PROW236598.** (Jackie Grebby). AW93 Broken gate latch at Shepherd's Cottage making access to and from this part of the footpath impossible. *Awaiting Allocation*.
- 10.**PROW041997.** (Les Bidewell). AW141 (Pluckley part). Non-reinstatement of ploughed field making it difficult to walk. *Work Complete*.

Activity Since May Meeting

- 1. **Obstruction of Footpath (AW98) at Chapel Lane (Alison).** Alison reported a blockage on the third kissing gate from Chapel Lane at the property of Stormgard. At the time of checking this the gate obstructing the passage from that kissing gate was open so no action at present.
- 2. Blockage of Footpath (AW77) off Newland Green Leading to Mundy Bois Road Opposite Kingsland Lane (Alison). Alison reported obstruction over the footbridge along this footpath. Overhanging branches and stingers cleared to the small deviation on the left of the path due to a fallen tree directly over the line of the actual path at this point (only a few yards deviation).

- 2. Report No. 251906. Mud in drain at Iden in Iden Lane. KCC state "Works Completed".

- 4. Went on Highways fault reporting to log the bad pothole in the middle of the road down Bedlam Lane near Pond Cottage, Weeks Farm etc. but it had already been reported. 3 weeks have gone by but it has still not been done.
