**Village Coffee Morning** takes place each Tuesday morning from 11.30am-2.00pm in the Village Hall in Grafty Green. The Post Office is also there from 12.45-2.15pm. There are usually items for sale, eggs, honey, greetings cards, tea, jams and marmalade for example.

Any donations received at the coffee mornings are shared equally between St.Nicolas church and a charity chosen by the 'regulars'.

The Christmas Carol Service took place on the afternoon of Sunday 17th December. The church looked radiant in the light of many candles, greenery and flowers and two large Christmas trees. It was heartening to welcome so many friends, as we heard again the familiar bible readings and carols and spent time together enjoying the mulled wine and mince pies afterwards.

We now look forward to the **Crib Service on Christmas Eve and the Christmas Day service.**

# Minutes of a Planning Committee Meeting held in the village hall at 7:00 pm on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> December 2023

Present: Cllrs B Adams; T Andrews (Chair); N Eastwood; R Galton; R Turner

In attendance: Mrs V Ford (Clerk)

#### Cllr Galton opened the meeting at 7:04 pm

1. Chairman: RESOLVED: Cllr Andrews to chair the Planning Committee

2. Anybody filming or recording this meeting: none

3. Apologies for absence: none

4. Declarations:

(i) Declarations of Interest in items on the agenda:

Cllr Turner declared a personal interest in the planning application as he was for many years the owner/occupier of the property. He stated that he would not be speaking or voting on the matter.

(ii) Declarations of lobbying: none

 Approval of Minutes of the Planning Committee Meeting on 6<sup>th</sup> November 2023: approved and signed as a true and accurate record

6. Planning Application:

(i) Public Session: (2 members of the public – the applicants – present)

One of the applicants explained that the proposed single storey extension was intended to provide accommodation for an additional family member. They stated that they were very mindful of the listed status of the building. No modifications to the inside of the house were being proposed. The proposed roof would mirror that of the existing house.

(ii) 23/505294/FULL

PROPOSAL: erection single storey side and first floor extension, including installation of air source heat pump and solar panels. Insertion of new rear window; and 23/505295/LBC

PROPOSAL: Listed Building Consent internal and external alterations including the erection single storey side and first floor extension, including installation of air source heat pump and solar panels. Insertion of new rear window.

ADDRESS: Offens Farm, Headcorn Road, Grafty Green, ME17 2AP

Members observed that the inglenook fireplace wall had been omitted from the published plans. One of the applicants stated that the architect had originally omitted the wall but had produced amended plans, which showed it in place. Cllr Galton had obtained copies of the amended plans, which he distributed to all members.

The Chairman invited members to comment on the proposals. Cllr Galton stated that he could not see anything that would be a planning issue. The Chairman asked the applicants if a heritage report had been submitted; they confirmed all documents had been submitted.

RESOLVED: that the Parish Council did not wish to OBJECT or COMMENT.

The Chairman closed the meeting at 7:17 pm.



## Helen Whately - MP

'At this time of year, spring can feel like a long way off. Waking up with another frost on the ground, to grey skies and naked trees, muddy fields and flooded rivers, it's easy to forget just how lucky we are. Because when spring does roll around – no matter how many you've seen - it's impossible not to be blown away by just how beautiful our county becomes.

We are blessed to live in and around some of the most wonderful countryside on earth. It sustains so many local people's way of life and wellbeing, and it provides a setting for so many of the things that we do in our free time. It's no surprise that protecting it is one of the issues people write to me about most often.

Sadly, in recent years we have seen a worrying decline in nature and biodiversity, not just locally but across the UK. There are plenty of reasons for this - from climate change to pollution, modern farming practices to development. The good news is twofold. Firstly, we've seen time and again that given the chance nature can recover. It's proven to be far more resilient than we expected, and projects up and down the UK have shown its capacity to bounce back. Secondly, there is so much energy and ingenuity being channelled into solutions at a local and national level.

Since 2010 we have created or restored wildlife habitats the size of Dorset, and back in 2021 we went further by passing the world-leading Environment Act. It sets out legally binding targets to protect our environment, clean up our air and rivers and boost nature.

Here in Kent, we recently saw the launch of Making Space for Nature in Kent and Medway – our local plan to reverse the decline in biodiversity and create a network of wildlife-rich places. This is where you come in, because to get this right we'll need collaboration from government, businesses, landowners, and local communities – all working together to make a difference.

It's why I've made environmental improvements one of my 5 local priorities for Faversham and Mid Kent, and this month I'm writing to every Parish Council in the constituency with things we can do locally.

Community solar projects, planting trees, building electric charging points, restoring public spaces and so much more. I want as many people as possible to get involved, however they can and in any way they'd like.

Please do keep an eye out as we head towards spring for projects going on in your local area, or feel free to get in touch with my office to be kept up to date.

Together we can finally be the generation that leaves our natural environment in a better place than we inherited it.

# Boughton Malherbe Parish Council

Good news often seems to be in short supply but there was very good news at the end of November for the users of the weekly bus 59 'shoppers bus' when we were told:

Congratulations, we're going to fund your idea

We're really happy to tell you we will be funding your project following your application to the National Lottery Community Fund.

This means The National Lottery Community Fund is giving Boughton Malherbe Parish Council £7,800 to help your community thrive.

Representatives of Broomfield and Kingswood, Ulcombe and Boughton Malherbe Parish Councils have met regularly with our amazing bus service operator Nu-Venture and our own transport expert John Collins since December 2022, when the threat of losing the bus became apparent. We effectively formed a steering group. At our meeting in September 2023, we agreed to investigate sources of external funding other than Kent County Council's Community Transport Fund. We were fortunate indeed to receive a grant of £3,650 from that pot last year, leaving a shortfall of £1,530 to be met by the Parish Councils. This funding was subsequently agreed at the respective Council meetings and the once-weekly service was secured until March 2024!

We applied to the National Lottery Community Fund in October, saying we would like to continue to run our once-weekly community bus service into Maidstone. It may not sound much but it represents a lifeline for those residents who use it, many of them very regularly. It is a friendly hail-and-ride service, noisy with chatter. Most passengers are greeted by name as they board and everyone knows the drivers. In addition to practical transport, the scheme has potential to mitigate social isolation and loneliness in the rural communities it serves. According to the National Association of Local Councils, these are the two most significant health issues facing us. Our passenger numbers have been very encouraging to date, averaging 20 per

single journey. Without doubt, the 59 service brings people together to build strong relationships in and across the parishes it serves. Take a trip into Maidstone any Wednesday morning and you will experience this, guaranteed! The absence of any "regulars" is noticed and I understand leads to neighbours "checking up" on the absentees.

Most service users are concessionary pass holders. Reimbursement to the bus operator for accepting a pass is approximately 40% of full fare, so the service is highly unlikely to become self-supporting despite high passenger numbers.

Boughton Malherbe Parish Council is in the enviable position of holding £3,684 as Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL), "community payback" for development, which is tightly ringfenced but may be used to pay for the bus. However, Broomfield and Kingswood and Ulcombe Parish Councils do not have access to any CIL. Although the service is of course open for anyone to use, concern was expressed by Councillors that funding the bus places a disproportionate burden on the electorate as only a small percentage of our residents use it.

Which brings me back to the good news! The National Lottery Community Fund has provided all the money required to run the 59 bus as it exists now from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2024 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2025. And that's without any funding from the Parish Councils – apart from the odd hour of my time in administration, mainly working out if the latest road closures by South East Water will prevent the 59 serving Grafty Green and Ulcombe!!! (But Nu-Venture and I are working together on this problem!)

If you have never used the bus, I can only encourage you to do so. You now have until at least 31<sup>st</sup> March 2025 to give it a go ©. The bus times are on line at 59 082023.pdf (nu-venture.online)

## **Grafty Gourmet**

This is a great way of using up the leftover Turkey and Ham from your Christmas dinner. Of course, to make things easier, you can use shop brought pastry. The pie can be made a day ahead and stored in the fridge until baked.

### LEFT OVER TURKEY & HAM PIE

600g of cooked turkey, breast meat carved into slices, brown meat chopped 600g of cooked ham, carved into thick slices

#### For the sauce

75g of butter
2 leeks, cleaned, halved and finely sliced
A pinch of dried thyme
75g of plain flour
A splash cider vinegar
200ml of chicken stock
250ml of double cream
3 tablespoon of wholegrain mustard

1 tablespoon of chopped tarragon

### For the pastry

500g of plain flour, plus extra for dusting ½ teaspoon of dried sage 185g of cold butter, cubed 70g of suet 2 egg yolks, for glazing

- 1. To make the sauce, heat the butter in a saucepan, add the leeks and thyme and cook very gently for 10-15 mins until soft but not coloured. Stir in the flour and cook to a paste, then splash in the vinegar and simmer for a moment. Pour in the stock and bring to the boil, then add the cream and simmer until you have a thick sauce. Stir through the mustard, tarragon and chopped turkey, turn off the heat and leave to cool. Set aside.
- 2. To make the pastry, (if not using shop brought), tip the flour into a food processor with the sage and 1 teaspoon of salt. Add the butter and suet, and whizz to fine crumbs. With the motor running, slowly pour in 150ml cold water until the pastry just comes together. Tip onto a lightly floured surface and bring together into a dough. Cut just over a third of the pastry and cover while you roll out the rest to line an oiled 20cm springform tin, leaving an overhang.
- 3. Layer some sliced ham or turkey on the bottom, then spoon and spread over a thin layer of sauce and repeat the layers until you get to the top of the tin, finishing with a final layer of meat, then press down gently. Cut away another small ball of pastry from the remaining third. Roll out the larger piece until big enough to cover the pie with an overhang. Brush the edge of the pie with egg yolk, then lift on the pastry lid and press the edges to seal before trimming. Crimp all the way round. Cut a little hole in the middle of the pastry to let steam escape. Brush all over with more yolk and use the last bit of pastry to decorate the top.
- 4. Heat the oven to 180C (fan) with a baking sheet in it. Sit the pie tin on the hot sheet and bake for 45-50 mins. Leave until warm, remove from the tin and cut into thick wedges or cool and eat cold.





## **Christian Message January 2024**

Blue January. The month when credit card bills start to be repaid. The month when the twinkling lights come down but the weather can be grim. The month when calls to the Samaritans go up.

Well, I hope this isn't you. But if it is you, take heart. Spring inevitably comes and the warmth of summer is on the way. The Bible entreats us to "Cast our anxieties upon him (the Lord) because he cares for you" (1 Peter 5:7). That doesn't mean he will pay off our credit cards, but it does mean that God knows us (Psalm 139) and stands with us. The whole message of Christmas is that God, incredibly, came to us! God is for us. God is on our side. As we align ourselves to His will, God fights for us and is alongside us.

In the church in Boughton Malherbe, we are going to start sessions that are a guided space for reflection, for stillness, for withdrawing (at least for an hour) from everyday conflict, and for rediscovering peace and inner strength. (First Saturday of each month at 2 pm.) Part of the reason is that I have become very aware of how many people are struggling in these post-Covid days with busyness and stress and anxiety. Absolutely everybody who want to come is welcome to these. You don't need to be a churchgoer. You don't need to come regularly. You don't need to share anything with anybody else.

People seem to assume that meditation is the stuff of Buddhists and so on, but actually there's a massively strong Christian tradition for reflective stillness. The early Christians sometimes went out into the dessert and lived their lives there, sometimes sharing their wisdom with others who came to them. Jesus himself spent 40 days in the wilderness as he started his ministry. And modern neuroscience (look at the work of lain McGilchrist) points to the need for more open and abstract thinking for mental flourishing.

So take heart. Blue January? The sun is on the way! The light of Christ be with you.
