

Parish Council News

NEXT PC MEETING: Monday 4th March 7:30pm Village Voice

B4449 Update

Road Maintenance - Members of the Parish Council (PC) met with Paul Wilson Oxford County Council (OCC) regarding road and pavement maintenance. OCC has confirmed that work on these will be scheduled. Date to be confirmed – work has already started clearing the road edges higher up the B4449 towards Hardwick.

Man-hole covers issues. Charles has written to the relevant Utility companies requesting that they address the clanking problem.

20MPH limit – OCC has informed the Parish Council of the process to be undertaken to get a 20-mph limit implemented.

- 1. OCC need to assess the site for a reduced speed limit.
- 2. If OCC consider it suitable, then speed surveys are needed. The PC would need to pay £100 plus VAT, per survey. The survey is required to determine the mean traffic speed. If it is 24mph and below, a limit can be introduced. If 25mph and above then traffic calming must be implemented to bring the mean average down to 24mph, and below.
- 3. A change to a speed limit will require a Traffic Regulation Order, which will involve a consultation, both informal, undertaken by the PC, then formally by OCC. Depending on the outcome of the consultation, this will need to go to OCC Committee for approval, then to Legal for the order to be made. This process would cost the PC £2,600.
- Implementation costs, i.e. signing, a typical cost could be between £1,000 and £2,000, depending on the number of signs required, costs to be met by the Parish.
- 5. The costs of any traffic calming measures, if needed would also need to be met by the PC. A design fee for the traffic calming design will be required. A site assessment will need to be made to determine a cost estimate. The cost of traffic calming measures vary significantly but could involve significant costs.
- 6. The process can take anywhere between six months and a year, depending on the nature of the work required.

A 20mph zone is a big decision for our Community, that could be costly for us, so it won't be implemented unless there is clear support in the village.

Cycle Path Update

David Wallom has been appointed as chairman of the Parish council cyclepath working group. This group will work with OCC, initially to establish the viability of the preferred route and to obtain estimates for the creation of such a suitable

path before such issues as funding can be addressed. **B4449 Short-term closure**

The road from Hardwick to Stanton roundabout road (B4449) will be closed from 18th March to 30th March. It is to correct the large dip in the road close to the Linear Fisheries entrance.

Volunteers Needed

If you feel you could help to keep a few treacherous areas around the village, clear of snow and ice please let our Parish Clerk know (see Parish Council contact below) and she will add your name to the list. The PC provides salt. For the best results the salt should be applied before the snow falls. Whether you clear snow from your own paths or community areas please ensure you do so safely. OCC have provided a useful guide of their web site <u>Snow Guide Oxfordshire County Council</u>.

The public notice boards around the village are a brilliant way to keep in touch. Many thanks to the groups and individuals who help to keep them tidy, relevant and interesting.

Airfield Development

We have opened a new section on the Parish Council Website where we will place development news as we receive it because so much is happening at the moment.

Developer Funding

Most development has an impact on, or benefits from, existing infrastructure such as roads, schools, doctors, community and recreational facilities. Negative impacts may be mitigated by planning 'obligations' – commonly secured under Section 106 of the Town & Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended). The local planning authority may require a developer to enter an obligation to undertake works, provide affordable housing, fund additional services, etc.

Any planning obligation must meet the tests of being necessary to make the development acceptable in planning terms; directly related to the development; and fairly and reasonably related in scale and kind to the development.

When the Parish Council responds to large-scale development applications as a statutory consultee it is also part of the roles and responsibilities of your Parish Council to submit requests to the District Council to secure the S106 funding and input to routing agreement. S106 agreements and similar agreements have

benefited the Parish in recent years by providing :

- Most S106's provide additional funding towards current facilities such as our local primary and senior schools
- The Airfield Development funded the Guard Room as a community resource and considerable open space for community enjoyment.
- The Beaumont Green development funded the play equipment on Jubilee Field.
- The Butt's Piece development if it proceeds will provide £20k towards Village Hall Car Park maintenance

All new housing developments deliver community benefits as well as new members of our community,
