## **Parish Council Report**

Spring is officially here and, although the COVID-19 pandemic continues to dominate our attention, the planned relaxation of the lockdown rules and the return of warmer weather allows some room for optimism. At the time of writing the sun is shining, gardens are re-awakening and the wildlife is abundant. The Thames is always interesting in spring and it was thrilling to hear reports that two otters have been seen on the Moulsford stretch in the vicinity of the Beetle and Wedge. As this was in the middle of the day these elusive creatures

maybe feeling more at home!

The PC are pleased to see that improvements we requested have just been made to the Thames Path with the replacement of the two wooden bridges within the wooded section of the path to the south of Moulsford. We are now investigating what can be done to improve the conditions underfoot within the wooded area. This is a challenge as the problems are largely to do with exposed tree roots and water courses draining across the path that are a result of the high water table levels we have been experiencing. Wellies or walking boots are recommended until it dries out naturally!



The good news continues! The new sewage treatment plant in Underhill is installed. This has been a very long saga but we have almost got there. Commissioning of the new plant will take a couple of months as it becomes operational and builds up its effectiveness. All those who have past experience of the ground water flooding issues will be extremely relieved.

We understand that the Beetle and Wedge Boathouse plans to re-open on 12<sup>th</sup> April and will be following Covidsafe guidance by serving customers using undercover arrangements outdoors. They have had a really difficult time since Ben took ownership one year ago and we wish them well. An interesting development is the discussion underway to reinstate the Ferry between Moulsford and South Stoke. The B&W Boathouse have the rights to operate the ferry and, following discussions with the Environment Agency, they are looking at operations this year. The Boathouse are in consultation with the PC and we will share details with the village once these are known. In the meantime, if anyone has concerns regarding the reinstatement of the ferry please do get in touch via the Parish Clerk on <u>parishclerk@moulsford-pc.org.uk</u>.

There are many people that deserve recognition for their efforts during the Covid-19 pandemic and we would like to mention our Pavilion Management Committee. Every time the lockdown rules have changed the committee, under Nigel Mansford's Chairmanship, have had to examine the guidance, interpret what this means for Community Halls and take the actions required to comply. It has been an essential, frustrating and largely unseen effort for which we are extremely grateful.

## From the Vicar

#### My Dear Friends,

It is now a full year since lockdown started and 12 months ago, I don't suppose any of us foresaw that we would still be living in lockdown well into 2021. But at least now there is a bit of light on the horizon with the tremendous efforts being made in rolling out vaccinations and the real hope of us being able to return to something like normal life in the next few months.

In some ways it feels like our situation is reflected in *Holy Saturday* – the day between *Good Friday* and *Easter*. We are in that "in between time" with the worst of the pandemic behind us but still waiting for the joy of Easter with its hope of resurrection and new life. Of course, on that first *Holy Saturday*, Jesus' disciples believed that all their hopes had been dashed with the terrible death of their dearest friend and Saviour the day before. Even though Jesus had told them on many occasions that he would be arrested, tried and crucified but that on the third day he would rise again, it seems the disciples had been simply unable to take it in. And so, when they were faced with the awful reality of the crucifixion of Jesus, their hopes and their faith crumbled.

All that would change the next day when they were brought face to face with the even more momentous reality of the risen Lord Jesus. They could scarcely believe it – at first, they thought he must be a ghost. But as they embraced him and conversed with him and even shared food with him, not only on that first Easter day, but on many occasions in the following weeks, even the most sceptical amongst them were utterly convinced. So much so, that these ordinary men were willing to face imprisonment, torture and death rather than deny what they knew beyond all doubt to be true – that somehow Jesus had conquered death and was alive.

So really, we are not living through *Holy Saturday* but in the continuing reality of Easter itself, where Jesus continues to be as alive as he ever was. It maybe that you are like "doubting Thomas", who wasn't present when Jesus first appeared to the disciples and who famously said *"Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe.*" The following week Thomas had the opportunity to do just that, when Jesus appeared to the disciples again and this time Thomas was with them. As a result, he fell at Jesus' feet and said to him *"My Lord and my God"*.

None of us can see the risen Jesus face to face, but we do have the sworn testimony not only those first disciples but of hundreds of millions of Christians down through the ages and in our present time who have experienced the

love and peace and transforming power of the risen Lord Jesus.

Ultimately it is this that gives us real hope whatever the circumstances and whatever challenges we face. So do take the opportunity again this Easter to reflect on what happened at that first Easter nearly 2000 years ago. You may even like to attend one of our services whether in church or online or join us in watching the *Riding Lights* lockdown passion play, *Breaking Day* (details below).

Meanwhile, I wish you a very Happy Easter.

#### Update on progress of Giga-voucher scheme for Moulsford Andrew Harris

Thank you to everyone who contacted me about the scheme and I apologise for not up-dating you earlier.

After some initial optimistic progress, when we registered our application via the Openreach Community Fibre Partnerships and had it acknowledged, we have had a couple of setbacks.

Firstly we have been advised that the UK government has now withdrawn the Giga-voucher scheme in its current format and that a new funding format will apply from May 2021. I was told in January, on what I thought was good authority, that this change in funding approach would not affect the criteria under which Moulsford's application would be considered.

Unfortunately this information turned out to be incorrect and I am now led to believe that our chances of being included in the re-cast Giga-voucher scheme are remote.

Secondly, I had also had some difficulty in progressing our application to the next stage via Openreach's website which took some time to resolve. We should now receive "ball park" infrastructure costs in the next 2-3 weeks.

However it is not all doom and gloom. Alert villagers will have noticed that a new cabinet has appeared at the end of Glebe Close supplied by another telecoms company, Airband. The reason for this is related to the company putting in infrastructure for installing fibre under a different arrangement to properties in postcodes OX10 9HP, OX10 9JR and OX10 9JT.

We believe in principle that once these properties have fibre installed that extending the Airband network throughout the village should be feasible but as of yet I have no details on how this might be funded. However it does seem that Airband is now the more hopeful option.

As soon as I have more details I will publish them.

## **Oxford University Hospitals update**

A resume of the latest news about Covid and health innovations received from Oxford University Hospital (OUH).

<u>Hospital news</u>: The number of new Covid-19 cases admitted to Oxford hospitals are falling steadily due to the good up-take of vaccinations with over 7,000+ people have received their 2<sup>nd</sup> dose. It is anticipated that after Easter 40-49 year age group old will begin receiving vaccinations.

**Emergency Departments:** Building work to improve facilities at OUH and the Horton Hospital in Banbury have been completed giving additional, up-graded assessment facilities and private family rooms.

**Out Patient Appointments:** On 3<sup>rd</sup> March the OUH Trust launched its new on line facilities for patients to see details of their Out Patient appointments, reducing costs and environmental impact.

<u>Research</u> has shown that the common drug Budesonide used in the treatment for asthma patients reduces recovery time if given within 7 days of the onset of Covid symptoms, reducing the number of hospital admissions

and disease severity.

**<u>Resumption of hospital visiting:</u>** Now that levels of COVID-19 in our local community and in our hospitals are dropping, as from Monday 22 March visiting will be resumed.

The 'Rule of One' for our inpatients – one visitor, for one hour, per day, per patient will be reintroduced. As previously, any visitors will need to book the slot in advance with ward staff. Exceptions to this include:

- Maternity patients one birth partner only for labour and birth; 'Rule of One' visiting for other maternity inpatients; and one partner permitted for 12 week and 20 week scan appointments, fetal medicine appointments, and breech clinic appointments
- Children (up to and including the age of 17 years old) one parent or guardian for as long as required, but no siblings
- Patients in exceptional circumstances patients with mental health support needs, patients with learning disabilities, patients with communication support needs, patients who do not speak English as their first language, patients who require carers, and patients who are sadly at the end of their life.

Visitors are not permitted in our Emergency Departments, Emergency Assessment Units, and in outpatient departments unless there are exceptional circumstances.

All visitors are required to wear face/masks coverings while in the hospital buildings and adhere to guidance around hand hygiene and social distancing.




