260/23	UPDATE FROM UNITARY COUNCILLORS				
	Unitary Councillor Irving-Swift advised that West Northants Council are working on the financial position of their budget and they have a £2.788m deficit with 4 months to claw back funds otherwise they will be at risk of Section 114. It is reported in the news in the UK 1 in 4 councils have financial issues. Councillor Parker will have more information in December as the information is not yet available. WNC Community Grants are available up to £2500 – encourage local organisations to apply.  WNC website has information on low income/cost of living matters to help with funding and benefits. They also have a e-library on their website and once registered it provides accesses to books, magazines and newspapers free of charge.  Bus fares for fee paying passengers will be held at £2.00 per person until 2024.  The last accounts for Northampton County Council are about to be closed and an audit will start from afresh. The bus consultation underway will hopefully provide a good rural strategy and everyone is encouraged to respond to the consultation by 12 <sup>Th</sup> November.  The Local Area Partnerships (LAPS) are looking into how to support carers. Also area has an older population and rural areas including Clipston have cross border NHS Health and Social Care they would like to see a seamless service as currently services in different areas are not very well connected to share information. They would like to know of anyone in the village struggling with this issues including carers so that the matter can be flagged up for support.
