

Food Bank collection point in St. James'.

When the collection point was first established in 2016 a black plastic dustbin was placed inside the church, together with a list of items needed nearby. It was marvellously well supported, the bin often overflowing with donations, which would be taken to the central foodbank at the Parish Centre in Church Stretton by me and by Jill Wesson and Steve Johnson.

Then came the Covid pandemic.

We weren't allowed inside the church, which was locked, so the bin was moved into the porch, where it continues to this day, and still regularly received much needed items.

But shopping habits changed, with many of us having to resort to online grocery orders and deliveries, and although we are thankful that

the worst now appears to be over the changes in shopping patterns seem to have remained, the result being that scarcely any donations find their way into the bin in the porch. It's not all bad news though:- support at the Parish Centre remains as good as ever, and the collection points within the Co-op and the centre itself are still well used, so that despite increasing need, supplies continue to flow. To those who are tuned into the increasing pressures upon people with low, or fixed incomes, or whose fixed outgoings and bills can no longer be covered due to inflation overtaking income, our thanks remain. It has been, and is, truly wonderful.

But - with much gratitude for the generosity of our community, it has been decided regretfully that after many years the collection bin in our porch has served its purpose and will be discontinued after Christmas.

Please continue to remember to look out for the collection points in Church Stretton, the need is not going to go away any time soon, and you can also donate online via the Parish website; it is a secure site with that trusty little padlock icon for reassurance. That money is used for shopping trips to Aldi or Lidl by volunteers at the foodbank, where the very much lower prices are so useful, or to pay for meat vouchers. If you go to 'Stretton Foodbank' the details are all there, and you can donate by cheque too.







Dear friends,

In the introduction to the Church of England's short reflection booklet for Christmas this year, the Archbishop of York writes that 'the invitation to all of us this Christmas is to be re-directed towards the light that is Christ, and to allow ourselves to be surprised and delighted by where it leads us.'

I love the phrase 'surprised and delighted.' Quite often we get so drawn into the build up to Christmas, with all the planning, travelling, and pressure involved, that the surprising nature of what we are celebrating gets crowded out.

It is surprising because it is so incredibly counter-cultural. It subverts many of the assumptions central to both ancient and present-day society. Here we celebrate God-made-human; the Christ. Born not in a royal palace surrounded by courtiers and officials. But born in a stable surrounded by animals and the sounds of the night. God's light coming into the world, but coming into the darkest and messiest of situations. A country under foreign occupation. A people longing for freedom. A family taking the dangerous road with only a donkey to share the load. A town that could not even offer a place to stay.

And here, in the middle of it all, God's light comes. A light shining so brightly, that the world would never be the same again. A light shining so brightly, that not even death would be able to defeat it. A light shining so brightly, that it continues to live on in the hearts of the faithful to this very day.

This Christmas, let us remember how this light came. Let us remember how this light taught us, healed us, died for us, and transformed us. Let us remember how this light lives in our hearts to-day.

And let us remember our primary calling.

To let this light shine.

LETTER FROM HEREFORD FOR DECEMBER

Most years when I was a parish priest in Sussex a group of us used to go Carol singing. We'd visit homes and the local pubs. Rather than asking for money for a charity or Church funds we would finish by giving out mince pies. This always threw people. They wanted to pay for them. They couldn't believe there wasn't some sort of catch. I'm sure it would be even worse were I to do it today. We've got so wary of scam calls, texts and emails, we are immediately suspicious of anything that seems too good to be true.

We often refer to Christ's coming at Christmas in terms of gifts. The word became flesh and dwelt among us. Unbidden and unsought, Christ comes to earth to reveal what God is like in a way that eludes human reason. The Christian story is something no one could have made up as a recipe for a restored relationship with God. But gift and the allied term grace are what it is all about.

This Christmas we are acutely aware of life's intractable problems. How on earth are we to solve the climate crisis, the economic crisis, the international relations crisis brought on by the war in Ukraine? All these problems seem unsolvable given normal patterns of human behaviour. How can a baby born in the backwater of an ancient empire 2000 years ago have anything to say about any of them? But the gift of Jesus is simple without being simplistic. The heart of most problems is the problem of the human heart. Jesus offers us the gift that meets the needs we seek to fill with rapacious consumption. He offers the security that frees us to love. He offers us the peace that in trust releases generosity. He offers the forgiveness that releases us from defensiveness and self-justification. The Gospel is good news because it meets the deepest needs of the human heart. This is where the real transformation of individuals and society is to be found.



Andrea's Mince Pies

(Recipe at the request of some members of the Apedale Amblers)

225g Plain Flour 150g butter (cut into small pieces)

15g caster sugar 15g ground almonds 15—30ml cold water 350g Mincemeat

I usually fill with Home-made Mincemeat made to Delia Smith's recipe.

I do not usually use the mixed peel suggested but replace it with either dried or fresh cranberries, glace-cherries or whatever I might have in my larder.

- Sift the flour into a bowl with the butter. Rub in until contents 1. resemble breadcrumbs. (If I am baking in bulk I cheat and use the food processor.)
- 2. Stir in the sugar and ground almonds.
- Add water as necessary and mix to a smooth dough.
 Turn onto a floury surface and knead lightly. Wrap and rest in the fridge for 30 minutes.
- Roll out thinly and cut out 12 large circles (7.5cm cutter) and 12 small circles (6.5cm cutter). A WARNING. THIS PASTRY IS 5. VERY SHORT AND REQUIRES GENTLE HANDLING.
- Line, fill with mincemeat and top your patty tins. Seal well.



At this point I usually open freeze them, turning out when frozen into a large freezer bag to store. I then remove and bake as required. (Or bake at this point if you prefer.)

Return the frozen mince pies to the tin. Brush with milk or beaten egg and bake at 200C, 400F or gas mark 6 for 15-20 minutes until golden brown.

A message for the Apedale Amblers:-This year's mincepies are made and frozen. However circumstances beyond my control this year mean that I cannot commit to being available on the Tuesday before Christmas (December 20th) until closer to the time.. Hope to be able to see you then but will let you know......



Read the book to find out and enjoy a good laugh out loud.



An Important Parish Council Update..... SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL COMMUNITY GOVERNANCE REVIEW

Shropshire Council are currently undertaking a Community Governance Review of parish councils and have invited proposals for changes to boundaries including the merger of parish councils. The parish councils of Eaton under Heywood and Hope Bowdler (EHBPC) and Rushbury (RPC) have considered the advantages of a merger of these two councils. The conclusions are:

- a merged council would be more effective in representing those communities
- the communities represented by the two councils are geographically and socially very similar
- a merged council should be more cost effective in delivery of responsibilities
- merger is no threat to local representation
- therefore both councils request Shropshire Council to facilitate a merger.

Both councils agreed to forward the proposal to Shropshire Council at their meetings on 17th October. If Shropshire Council decide to go ahead when it is considered later in 2023 they will undertake formal consultation and will arrange for the consequential changes to be put in place at the election in 2025. The full text of the proposal is available on our websites and there will be opportunity for discussion at our next parish meetings in 2023.

From Rushbury Parish Council Old Chest...

The power to elect parish councils was given to parish meetings by the Local Government Act 1894 and most larger civil parishes have elected a parish council since that time. The councils, and in their absence, the meetings took over the civil functions of the vestry committees representing a separation of church and state at least at local government level. Rushbury Parish Council has a collection of miscellaneous documents some of which date to these early times. They provide an interesting insight into fragments of local history.

1901 Insanitary Drains at Wall

The Sanitary Inspector, Mr William Edwards, reported to Church Stretton Rural District Council that he had received complaints from villagers and strangers passing through concerning the drains at Wall which at present empty on to the roads from 14 houses occupied by 49 inhabitants. Dr M Gepp, Medical Officer of Health, viewed them and declared that it was the dirtiest village he had seen. Mr Salt of Church Stretton prepared a scheme and estimate to lay a drain from near to the Plough corner down the back road, down Eaton Lane, across a field owned by Mr Richard Cleeton into a field the property of Mrs Wright and occupied by Mr Alfred Adams. A drain also to be connected from Mr Adams' fold yard and house. The drain was to consist of 6ins socket pipes and each owner would have to connect their drainage to this sewer. Mr Salt's estimate for doing the work was £49. Mr Cleeton, Mr Adam Marsh, Mr Alfred Adams, Mr Beamond, Mrs Edwards and all seem to be in favour of its cost being placed upon a rate.

Rev Robert Fletcher, Chairman of Rushbury Parish Council, was informed of the proposed scheme and asked for the views of the Parish Council. It was also noted that it was within the power of the Parish Council to deal with it themselves but if the work were undertaken by the District Council it would be charged to the Parish as special expenses. We do not have a reply but a further letter from the Clerk to the District Council seems to indicate that the Parish Council did not wish to undertake the work and perhaps questioned the scheme. It also noted that owners could not be required to contribute to the costs but if the drainage scheme were carried out the District Council could insist that all drains within a certain distance should be connected. Rev Fletcher wrote to parishioners requesting contributions with some limited success because in 1902 the Clerk to the District Council acknowledged a cheque for £8 being a contribution to the scheme.

It seems that Wall got some proper drainage and became a little more pleasant.
