On the Friday over 250 people attended a photo presentation of historical Farnsfield hosted by the local history society in the village centre. St Micheals beamed the live thanksgiving service from St Pauls and we also had our scarecrow day, with over 35scarecrows around the village. On Saturday the Royal British Legion hosted a street party on New Hill. Over 700 people came along to join in the celebrations, with Live Music, Children's entertainers, Street Magicians, Disco and fabulous food from our local businesses. There was also meant to be a Party in the Park on the Sunday but this was postponed due to the inclement weather conditions


The refurbishment of the Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) on Wisons Field has also been completed along with new and improved 5 Aside pitch, goals and nets.

Additions to ESP

Story Glade Quiet Space. We are pleased to be able to announce the opening of the Story Glade in the copse across from the playground on Hadleigh Park.. Within the glade we have positioned two log benches which are sheltered by the copse and ideal for children to sit and recharge after enjoying the park.

stories which we have placed on the council website. All users have to do is point their camera at the QR code and select the link to go to the website. Once the page loads a story can be chosen and played through the smart phone's loudspeaker. The space also provides an ideal outside space for organised toddler groups to sit and listen to woodland stories

Orlenteering / Nature trail: A number of councillors have been working over the summer with colleagues from a local orienteering club who have established orienteering courses at Sherwood Pines, Sherwood Forest and other local sites. Our aim is to establish an orienteering course which will run across Hadleigh Park, Reynolds Field, The Acres and the Millenium Woods. We are looking forward to the point at which we can launch this exciting new facility in the village.

Boules: It is important that facilities within the village cater for all age groups and with that in mind the council have agreed a proposal to site two boules throws on Reynolds Field. These will be available for casual use but to enable people to secure a throw in advance of travelling to the

facility we are working to build a self-administering booking system to allow residents to book either throw. If they prove popular further developments could involve associated picnic tables to give groups and families a great opportunity to participate in active socialising within the village boundaries.

Farnsfield Methodist Church

We continue to be a busy church serving the community, with the church being used by various groups most days/evenings during the week. We particularly look forward to supporting St Michaels church in their outreach to young families by offering our building for their new venture.

Our "Coffee and Chat" mornings on the last Saturday of the month continue to be well attended, and in recent months we have been able to donate proceeds of the morning to Farnsfield Defibrillator fund, Farnsfield Community Spaces and the local Foodbank. Saturday September 24th will be a Macmillan Coffee Morning run jointly with our friends at St Michaels church so please come along and support that if you can. Posters publicising the event will be around the village from the beginning of September.

Our new outreach activity started in May and again has been well supported. This is "Tea at 2", held every other Monday 2 – 4 pm (the next is September 5th) which provides a welcoming place to meet friends and chat over a cuppa and cake. Table games are available, and the atmosphere is very informal, so, again, do come along if you think this is something for you. There is a voluntary charge of £1 and through these donations we have been able to support the mental health charity MIND, Alzheimers UK, British Red Cross for Ukranian refugees and Grace, a local Scout. For anyone who is at a loose end on Boxing Day, as it is a Monday there will be a Tea at 2 with carols to sing along with or listen to. You don't need to be alone if you don't want to be. We will be organising the usual collection of Christmas items for Mansfield Salvation Army Centre during November and hope that we will be supported by the village and the school as in previous years.


