Grants will be considered for amounts up to and including £500.00. Each application will be considered against the criteria outlined within the policy. It goes without saying that funding for the Grant Award is limited so early applications are suggested!!

HIGHWAY TO HELL NOT FOR MUCH LONGER!

Collapsing verges, racking road surfaces, "apparently temporary" road narrowing measures and the odd traffic accident let alone the unsightly view of what is one of our main routes to and from the village. Eastbridge Road has been the battle ground for many a debate over the years with Residents, Parish Councils past and present and County Councillors trying to convince Kent County Highways that enough is enough. Finally, and with a huge part of this due to Councillor County Martin Whybrow persistence behalf Dymchurch on of residents, the Highways department agreed to make permanent repairs to Eastbridge Road. Work has already started.

The scheme, which is estimated to cost in excess of £300,000, is hoped to be completed by May this year and involves inserting piles to support the road surface from future collapse into the adjacent dykes.Not quite the M25 but an important communications link between the Parish and surrounding areas made fit again for future generations

Parish Council Freezes Precept For Another Year

The Parish Council has set its precept for 2021/22 at £83,000, this will be the third year the precept has remained the same and despite freezing the amount raised from local residents the Parish Council are budgeting to improve some public areas of the village and will be continuing to support the Friends of Dymchurch Recreation Ground in their plans for the Pavilion and community use of the recreation ground.

- Grass cutting and maintenance around the village
- CCTV monitoring and the popular seawall beach cam
- Parking enforcement of the Village Hall Parish Car Park
- Promoting Dymchurch as a visitor attraction by supporting local events and publications Paying for local elections

This Year The Council Have:

- Resurfaced the Village Hall car park with support from F&HDC High St Fund
- Updated our festive light displays with Solar Christmas trees
- Opened the Seawall Kiosk during the Summer holidays

Continued to work securing the long future of the recreation ground

THE DYMCHURCH GUIDE TO REPORTING STUFF!

Stuff happens, we can all agree on that, broken road signs, defective street lights, fly tipping, scams suspicious events and neighbour disputes and antisocial behaviour. Sometimes it is good to let others know what is happening perhaps on face book or other social media, but why stop there. Face Book will not send some one out to mend the street lights– Do your bit to keep our village looking good and keeping safe by reporting what you see and experience to the appropriate authorities– Below is a summary of some common issues, who to report it to and how to contact them. The list is not exhaustive and while the authority may not appear to take immediate action all contacts are recorded and often start to build a picture of issues in an area which will support the need for resources.
