It's getting increasingly difficult to know how to start these articles! I never thought I would find myself thinking that the initial lock-down was easy but over the last few days I've begun to think that it was. Yes, it was really hard seeing our reality change from being free to go wherever we want, see whoever we want, do whatever we want to staying home apart from essential trips and that one trip outside for physical exercise. I know this has been a time of immense stress for some people, whether it's been on the 'being inside' side of the fence or the 'key worker having to carry on going to work' side of the fence but at least we knew.

I took my daughter back to her flat in London last week and the shops and streets in Clapham looked almost normal. The bars and pubs were serving take-aways, so the pavements were filled with people having a drink. All the shops were open, there didn't seem to be many people queueing and the traffic was certainly back to normal! But we know it isn't. A quick trip to Petersfield today showed me plenty of queues – at Waitrose, M & S, the banks, Poundland; some of the cafes were open but only for take-aways; some of the shops are limiting the numbers going in, some are still closed, worryingly some have already closed down.

Church isn't normal either. We have been told we can now open for private prayer but because of building size and situation all four of our churches are dealing with this in slightly different ways. We have been told we can now have funeral services in church but we still have to restrict numbers, observe the correct distances and we can't sing. We don't yet know when we'll be able to have regular services but what we do know is that those same restrictions will apply. We don't know for how long. At the beginning of all this, as we celebrated Easter Day via a service on zoom, I scoffed at the suggestion that we might be celebrating Christmas in the same way. It seemed unthinkable but I have a feeling that Christmas will not look the same.

It would be easy to get a bit lost in the feelings of confusion and frustration; I have to curb the pining voice in my head that says, 'I just want it all to go back to normal' before it drowns out everything else because, without resorting to too many clichés or Monty Python quotes (always look on the bright side of life etc), there is generally a brighter side!

I was listening to something on the radio today and they were talking about the baking craze that seemed to hit the nation when lock-down started – baking followed by bread making. It didn't reach The Vicarage sadly. The packet of sourdough mix is still sitting in the cupboard primarily because I can't be bothered with the faff of making the 'starter' to get it all going. Maybe I should, because I think it would show me something important about this time we're living through. That starter – or 'pre-ferment' does what it says on the tin – starts the whole thing off. The leaven is then added followed by a time of proving which results in a richer, more flavoursome bread.

Maybe this strange time can be a 'starter' for us; a period of proving and preparation which have stretched us and challenged us. The good thing about that starter is that once you've made it, you keep it, using it to start the next batch of bread. Maybe we need to let this time encourage us to bring all that we value, all that is important into the future with us, enriching who we are and what we do.

God of change and transformation, bless and cherish what we now are and strengthen and challenge what we will become, Amen.



The West Meon Shop Committee

Greetings from Kilmarnock!

Probably not the typical beginning of a wee article in your parish magazine. If everything had gone to plan Michael, my husband, our two Jack Russells and myself would have moved into the vicarage at the top of Doctor's Lane in West Meon in May, but, as they say, we live in challenging times. So here I sit in my study in the parsonage of the Scottish Episcopal Church of the Holy Trinity, in the Diocese of Glasgow and Galloway, where I have served as Rector for several years.

If you were to look at my bookcases at the moment you would think, what an odd woman, all those book cases and not a book in sight. The absence of books is only because we had started to pack for the move south to Hampshire in January. I would say that there have been a few tense moments in the parsonage, as I have been caught surreptitiously opening a few boxes in search of a particular book, only out of necessity I would add.

One thing I have enjoyed during the lock down is peering at the bookcases of the rich, famous and those who think they are in power, when they are doing television broadcasts. At times it must be said that their bookcases are more interesting then what they are actually saying. I think it is somewhat comforting to note that Prince Charles has a Dick Francis on view and Nicola Sturgeon, Scotland's First Minister, seems to have a good array of crime fiction. I was, however, quite disturbed to see a bookcase that was arranged like a rainbow... it just makes you wonder.

So what would you find on our book shelves: an eclectic mix. I suppose you wouldn't be surprised to know that there are a few, well more than a few, prayer books and the like. Well I am a vicar! The rest of the books, however, are a very eclectic mix: the books saying something of who we are, the places where we have lived and the things we like to do. There are a lot, and I do mean a lot, of travel books; not only guides but stories of other's travels. Mike and I are travellers. We met in Labrador where I was teaching and he was serving with the Royal Airforce. Amongst those books are many OS maps and walk books. The year before last we managed to complete the West Highland Way. Living in many places, of course, we have gotten a liking for all sorts of different cuisines which we have never shied away from trying and so there is a fair smattering of cook books, including 'The Northern Cookbook', a volume produced by the Canadian Government which includes a recipe for jellied moose nose... I wouldn't recommend it.

Before ordination I did a number of jobs, including working as a cutter and tailor in the theatre in Canada. I have always liked making things, so on the shelves there are all sorts of books on textiles of various sorts and also art books. I grew up in an inner city on the East Coast of Canada, where my dad was a doctor. Across the street from our house was the Greek Orthodox Church of St Nicholas. As a little girl I loved to creep up the steps and peer into the dark space where there would be glimpses of gold covered icons. And so another passion. Over the last 10 years I have been privileged to spend time learning to paint or, as they say , write icons at Turvey Abbey.

As for Mike, he is an engineer by trade, and so there is a fair smattering of DIY and classic car books... We come south with a Triumph Stag and a VW Camper Van. We have two sons, one who serves in the army and the other is a violin maker, and even though they have left home many of their books, not only from when they were little but from stints at home, find places on our shelves. I still love kids books, after all who can beat Six Dinner Sid, Old Bear,

or the Wind in the Willows...Oh and then there is Anne of Green Gables! (How many adult friendships have started when someone has said to me...you're Canadian, have you been to Prince Edward Island and do you love the Anne books?)

A good part of my adult life was spent teaching. I graduated from university at a time when teaching opened doors to travel and, in my case, adventure. In those days there was an expectation that with a bit of prep you could turn your hand to anything and teach any subject, hence my expedition to Labrador. Over the years I taught both in secondary and primary schools. Latterly, prior to ordination, I worked for Cambridge County Council where as a peripatetic specialist I focused on kids with challenging behaviours, supporting not only schools but their families.

If you had looked at me in the late 70's you would never have thought that I would end up wearing a dog collar, well I sure wouldn't have thought it. However here I am. I bring to the church a lot of experience, I hope, a sense of joy, and a real desire to come alongside people. Mike and I are very much look forward to coming Hampshire, to meeting you, to becoming part of your community and of course to have a few more adventures... Oh and it must be said that there we will be closer to our 15 month old grandson. Scotland, it must be said, seems very far away!

So what am I reading at the moment....Val McDermid's Out of Bounds... you can't beat a bit of crime fiction!

Looking forward to meeting you when Scotland's First Minister sets us free!

Echo Funds



Rainfall Records for May/June 2020



During May we had 5.2mms (0.2") and up to the middle of June we have had 13mms (0.5"). It has been a really dry time. The total for the year up to the end of May is 435.6mms (17.1"). To the same date last year it was even drier with just 272.8mms (10.7").

We only had 3 days in May 1st, 3rd 23rd when we recorded any rain.

In June to the 15th we have had rain on 7 days with a maximum of 6.1mms on the 12th.

Hortus Poeticus

In early March, Hortus Poeticus opened its doors as a flower studio and local grower and supplier of wonderful English seasonal and scented flowers, all grown without chemical fertilisers, pesticides or air miles selling to all who love beautiful flowers be they individuals or florists, directly from Lippen Wood Farm, West Meon. We also were proud to be supplying our flowers to Long Barn, Alresford and Catkin and Pussywillow, Winchester.



Two weeks later Covid - 19 struck, Long Barn closed and like everyone else we had to turn on a sixpence and rejig our business to one that was contactless delivery only. All this moments before 4,500 of special tulips and 2,000 heritage and scented narcissi were just coming into bloom! Pleasantly, if extremely challengingly, we found ourselves exceptionally busy delivering spring flowers to Catkin and also our own posies and bouquets to those who needed cheering up, farewell flowers for special people which became even more important with the restrictions on funerals and cremations, weekly bunches and arrangements and what quickly became our speciality - flower arrangers buckets or FABs. With these we aim to put the very best of an extensive, seasonal English cutting garden at your disposal and we delivered our FABs throughout Hampshire including to Basingstoke, Southampton, Portsmouth, the New Forest as well as more locally and only reluctantly turned down London, Bath and Perthshire! All this for a business that swore it would not do deliveries!

So what is so different about these flowers? It is astonishing that we spend £2.2 billion, yes billion, per year on flowers in the UK, almost all of which are imported and many of which (with some highly honourable and trail blazing exceptions) have fairly shocking ethical and environmental footprints. As well as air miles and prolonged refrigeration from hot countries or large quantities of heat and light to grow unseasonal flowers in Europe, many flowers are grown with a cocktail of pesticides and then treated with toxic chemicals to preserve their shelf life - none of which is made known to us the unsuspecting buyer. We all regularly support this not knowing - why should we - the dark underbelly of highly industrialised flower growing and having little alternative choice.

By contrast flowers that have had a natural life in the field add positively to the environment before they enhance ours; they bring this life into the vase with them. They have a different look and feel and character to those industrially grown as a monoculture. Ours are almost wholly field grown and are home to birds and insects, especially vitally our bees who much enjoy them, before being picked for your life.

Our wish is to contribute to the renaissance of UK grown flowers and join the increasing band of flower growers and flower farmers to make locally sustainably grown seasonal flowers available for all of us to enjoy. These are 'slow flowers'.

We look forward to being able to host visits, including for schools and local groups, and to holding flower club workshops once restrictions lift. In the meantime if the idea of 'slow flowers' or sustainable flowers grown right here in Hampshire interests or intrigues you, or if your group would like a talk on it (with real flowers as props!) once we are allowed to do so, do please get in touch.

West Meon CE Primary School

As these strange times continue, we have now welcomed back to school some of the children from Year R, 1 and 6. We have started off slowly and are building up more time with them



in school and the Aspire staff continue to support afternoons.

Most children are still at home and staff continue to support parents by providing planning, zoom meetings and email support, as well as the occasional phone call.

We now have three groups or 'bubbles' blue, red and green and this includes some keyworker children as well.

Staff and children have to stay within their own bubble and if anyone within that group tests positive for Covid 19, then that group closes down and isolates for 14 days. Strange times indeed!

We are practicing social distancing and as you can see from the photos, no group goes above 9, so they fit into the classroom while keeping separate.

They are wearing their own clothes, so they can go into the wash straight away and trainers are disinfected every evening.

As headteacher, I do not burst any bubbles, but I welcome the children in and see them out at the end of the day and check their temperatures at lunch time with a forehead thermometer.

Staff, governors and parents have been great and very adaptable, as we adjust to the 'new normal'.

What is so amazing, is that the





children have been so adaptable and completely unfazed about the situation, running back into school just as enthusiastic and happy to sit at individual desks, even though most of them are only 4 or 5 years old!

Our numbers are the highest they have been for years, so welcoming back all the children in September will be

interesting. The church council have already offered their support if we need to use the church room, which we are very grateful for.

We are still considering how we will say goodbye to our Y6 children. The Fairthorne Manor

residential was cancelled and not all of Y6 are back in school. However, we will do something to celebrate their time with us and we are working closely with The Petersfield School to ensure a smooth transition.

As lockdown starts to lift, everyone is cautiously re engaging, but we are all in this for the long haul and community is everything.

We welcomed back to school some of our YR, 1 and 6 children and it was great to see them. This has been under strict health and safety rules, in three separate groups, and we will keep the arrangements under constant review.

means that we will be ensuring that any gaps in learning, which may have occurred because of lockdown, will be covered before we move onto new learning in the autumn term. Our teachers are experts in assessing where children are and moving them on and each child will be at a different stage.

The current home learning is designed to consolidate important skills in Maths and English and to give the children opportunities to continue to enjoy the other subjects. As always, please don't feel under pressure to follow any particular timetable; every family situation is different and the important thing is your health and mental wellbeing.

Please do not worry. This is our job and your child will be fine.

Teachers will continue to touch base with you through work set, gmail and Zoom as well as supporting those who are coming into school.

Hedges - A reminder that keeping hedges in control, especially along roads and pavements, is the responsibility of the property owner or hedge owner. Coronavirus Information

Concessionary Travel - Hampshire County Council has confirmed that concessionary travel times for older people to travel free on Hampshire's buses will revert to the normal 9:30am start on Monday 15th June. As capacity on public transport is limited, this change is to help manage demand with social distancing in place as more people return to work and may need to use public transport. Restrictions on times older people could use their bus passes were first lifted on 20th March to enable travel to supermarkets earlier in the day and access dedicated shopping hours while national travel restrictions on all but essential travel were in place.

Play Equipment – just a reminder that the play equipment at the Recreation ground is NOT to be used until further notice.

Self-Isolation helps stop coronavirus spreading - Do not leave your home if you have symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) or live with someone who does. This is called self-isolation.
