
- 1. All Vaccinations will be administered at the Vaccine Centre, which is located adjacent to Wickes Building Supplies" and "Curry's Electrical Store"

The minutes of the meeting of Acol Parish Council held in the Village Hall, Acol, on Monday 26th September 2022 at 11.00am.

Present: Councillors Miss Bransfield (Chairman), Hayfield, Inchley, Mrs. Osborne and Mrs. Winpenny.

Also present: Cllr. Crow-Brown (KCC), Roy Wade (Clerk) and 3 residents.

30 MINUTES

RESOLVED: That the minutes of the Meeting held on 25th July 2022 be approved subject to an addition to minute 25, Highways Improvement Programme, " to include an item on every agenda under the heading "Highways".

31 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies were received from Cllr Linda Wright.

32 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

No declarations of interest were made

33 REPORT OF THE CHAIRMAN

The Chairman reported upon:

- (i) Legislations on Travellers and the powers to deal with illegal encampments.
- (ii) PCSO details were awaited on the person appointed to this position.
- (iii) Manston Airport a second Judicial Review is proposed to be sent to the Secretary of State and further information is awaited.
- (iv) The Chairman paid tribute to the many volunteers in the village who undertake various works not conducted by any Council authorities.

34 AUDIT OF ACCOUNTS 2021/22

The Clerk reported that the audit had now been completed and that he was awaiting the formal report which would be reported to Council.

35 AUTO SPEEDWATCH FOR ACOL

Council considered the report of Richard Steel on measures to instal solar powered devices to record speeding vehicles, etc. Richard advised that the effectiveness of the scheme would primarily depend on the recruitment of residents to monitor the scheme. The cost of an Auto Speedwatch was £620.45, which included the first year's data charge. Members were mindful of going ahead with the scheme but were of the view that several units would be required throughout the Village. Cllr Crow-Brown advised that he and Cllr. Linda Wright may be prepared to make a grant from their KCC Members grant scheme towards the cost of the scheme. The Clerk advised that no provision had been made in the current budget for these costs.

Members noted that the proposed weight restriction orders for Acol were scheduled for approval in November 2022.

RESOLVED: That:

(A) the scheme to provide Auto Speedwatches within the Village be approved in principle, subject to provision being made in the 2023/24 budget.

(B) application be made to Cllrs. Crow-Brown and Linda Wright (KCC) for grant assistance in respect of purchasing the units.
