Draft Parish Notes - July 2022

Meeting of the Parish Council held at the Pavilion on Monday 18th July 2022 at 7.30pm. The meeting was attended by Cllrs S Harrod (Chair) W Fox (Vice-Chair), P Allen, G Bennet, C Deacon and M Horsley. Apologies were received in advance from Cllr D Harms, Cllr Caroline Newton (SODC) and Cllr Freddie Van Mierlo (OCC). Tim Darch (Clerk) was in attendance, along with Chris Ashworth (prospective Clerk) and 4 members of the public. No declarations of interest were received in matters on the agenda.

The County Councillor's monthly report was received and reviewed, and is available on the Parish Council website along with the District Councillor's delayed June report.

No correspondence was received in matters not otherwise covered on the agenda. No correspondence has been received regarding matters not otherwise covered on the agenda. It was reported by two attendees that excess speeds are still a problem on London Road in Milton Common despite the electronic signage and other measures installed recently. With the scope for further mitigation likely to be limited, it was agreed to communicate the issue to the Community Policing team with a view to an increased presence of the camera van.

Planning applications

The following planning applications received from SODC were considered:

P22/S2220/FUL Underground cable route to connect Dodwells solar farm to Cowley substation. Cllr Allen reviewed this application. The cable route follows roads through Great Milton: significant traffic disruption could be expected during the estimated 48 weeks of construction. Roads affected include the A329, Church Road and The Forties. To avoid this, Cllr Allen felt that the cable should be laid across farmland wherever possible, which would also shorten the route taken. Cllr Horsley expressed the view that one-off disruption to potentially enable a solar farm may be tolerable, while a member of the public observed that the two other proposed solar farm applications nearby at the Harlesford and Cornwell sites are proposed to connect to the network via pylons without the need for a significant distance of underground cabling. Additionally, no justification had been provided for a solar farm so far from the connection point. After discussion, it was agreed unanimously to OBJECT to the proposal on the grounds of the chosen route and the distance between the site and the connection point.

P21/S3915/FUL (Dodwells Solar Farm, Land north of the A40 near Milton Common). Installation and operation of a Solar Farm together with all associated works, equipment and necessary infrastructure (as amended & amplified by information

received 8 July 2022).

This application was reviewed by Cllr Allen. In Cllr Allen's opinion the additional documents merely provide further background information and do not change the details of the solar farm. Cllr Allen also observed that some local residents are supportive of the application: however, it was reported by members of the public in attendance that local interests may have been behind this support. A further member of the public observed that the visual impact of the application and all visual receptors had not been properly assessed, and that any proposed screening could take up to ten years to be fully effective. After brief discussion and in light of the parish council's original objection to the original application, in line with Cllr Allen's recommendation councillors agreed unanimously to OBJECT to the proposed development.

P22/S1316/HH (Swarebrook Lower End Great Milton). Construction of new blockwork garden wall faced in natural stone on one side and lime render on the other side (As amended by plans received 12 May 2022 and plan received 29 June 2022).

This application was reviewed by Cllr Horsley, who reported that the amendment effectively accommodated the parish council's suggestion of a reduction in the height of the wall from 3 metres to 2 metres in certain locations to minimise the visual impact of the wall. After brief discussion it was unanimously agreed to SUPPORT the proposed development.

Le Manoir planning application update

SODC's Planning Committee voted five to four in favour of granting permission for the planned redevelopment of land associated with and surrounding Le Manoir at its meeting on Wednesday 29th June. It is understood that the application will now be referred to the Secretary of State for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities given its scale and Green Belt location: however, at the time of writing formal notification of the outcome of the Planning Committee's decision had not been received.

The following planning decisions received and outstanding planning matters were considered:

P22/S1395/HH (1 Colletts Cottages Thame Road Great Milton). Demolition of detached garage and part previous rear extension to facilitate erection of two storey extension to cottage (amended site plan received on 27/05/22 to remove additional vehicular access). Permission GRANTED.

P22/S1895/FUL (The Bull The Green Great Milton OX44 7NS). Erection of a wooden serving bar in the garden of the public house. Permission GRANTED.

The minutes of the June meeting of the Parish Council, held on Monday 18th June 2022, were received, reviewed, agreed and signed as a true and accurate record of proceedings.

The monthly bank reconciliation, accounts and bank statement were received, reviewed and approved. The reconciled bank balance as at 7th July was £42,504.44.

Employment policies

After brief discussion it was agreed to adopt the suggested HR-related policies, with minor amendments as recommended by Cllr Horsley and with an annual review at a time to be decided, potentially the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council.

Parish clerk and councillors' update of matters in hand

A new dog waste bin has been installed at the Thame Road entrance to Old Field and has been included in the dog waste contractor's weekly collection.

COVID-19: update on village response/impacts

There are no significant issues to report other than those which are receiving national coverage.

Security in the village

Rod Snowdon, Neighbourhood Watch representative stated that in light of the recent incidents of theft of personal property, intimidation, criminal damage and anti-social behaviour in the village, one of the key outcomes of the Thames Valley Police engagement event on Saturday 16th July was to advise residents to report any incident that they witness or experience to the police via the 101 telephone service or online via the police.co.uk website. Many of the recent events (particularly the keying of cars and graffiti in the playground) were apparently not reported: doing so will create an awareness that there are issues requiring police attention in the village, and may improve the chances of resolution. TVP is also planning further community engagement events, and is planning to schedule patrols in the village where practical.

Vacancy for Clerk/RFO

Chris Ashworth, a resident of Cuddesdon, has been appointed as the new Clerk/RFO for Great Milton Parish Council, subject to contract. It is likely that Chris will formally take over the role during the summer 'recess': however, e-mail communications

via the Clerk's e-mail address will reach whoever is in post. Contact details in the Bulletin and on the village website will be updated at a suitable moment. The meeting closed at 8.20pm. The next meeting of Great Milton Parish Council will be held on Monday 19th September 2022 at 7.30pm at the Pavilion. There is no meeting currently scheduled in August, but the Clerk remains contactable in the event of any issues or queries.

Recent Criminal Activity in Great Milton

There have been a series of unpleasant events in the village over recent weeks. These include vandalism on cars, graffiti in the Recreation Ground play area, excessive antisocial behaviour in relation to loud music and the assault of two children in the Rec (in one of these events personal items were also stolen). In an urban setting we would almost certainly refer to it as a "mugging". It is critical that people report such incidents to the police via 101 or the police website (www.police.uk). So far only the assaults have been reported, and the police have been told that the assailants are unknown, so cannot investigate the individuals who may have committed these crimes.

Thames Valley Police are drastically under-resourced. They deploy officers where the crimes are. So far Great Milton is a low crime area, particularly as the car vandalism and graffiti were not reported. Even if you are not going to claim on insurance to keep your various discounts it is still important to report the incidents. We will get more police visits if they believe we have a problem. If you are the victim or witness of a crime, it is essential that you report it! Our local policing team are aware of the issues in the village and will aim to patrol more often, but without incident reports it is difficult for them to investigate, even if the perpetrators may be known to the police.

Remember: if you witness a crime or are the victim of a crime, you should report it by dialling 101 or via www.police.uk. If it is an emergency please dial 999.

The Rector's Pint

We have the good fortune to be able to take off every few weeks for a night or two to the house in Gloucestershire, in a village on the western banks of the River Severn, which we have owned now for two years. I have written about this before. The house is on a lane which ends on a bank overlooking the river. It is a beautiful and wild spot;

It has become a 'thin place' for me, a place where I purposefully seek the presence of God. It is a place where I can pray.

A short walk away, on a high bluff overlooking the river is the Parish church, which has a spectacular view of the Severn and the Cotswolds beyond. The curate, who has recently moved on to a parish of his own, was very creative, and has put poems around the churchyard. Some of them are by Malcolm Guite, who I have used both in these 'Pints' and in some of our services. The poem I particularly love, however, is by the American, Wendell Berry, who is described as a novelist, poet, essayist, environmental activist, and farmer! It is placed on the railings overlooking the steep drop to the river. It is not a 'Christian' poem and doesn't in fact mention God at all, but I think it is deeply spiritual and it speaks to me. Some of you will know it. It is called 'The Peace of Wild Things'.

When despair for the world grows in me and I wake in the night at the least sound in fear of what my life and my children's lives may be, I go and lie down where the wood drake rests in his beauty on the water, and the great heron feeds. I come into the peace of wild things who do not tax their lives with forethought of grief. I come into the presence of still water. And I feel above me the day-blind stars waiting with their light. For a time I rest in the grace of the world, and am free.

I readily admit that nature is one of my pathways to God. The ever-changing wildness of the Severn at Newham, where more than once I have seen 'the great Heron feed', opens me up to the Spirit of God. It is the Spirit of peace, but it is not a tamed peace. Another place, closer to home, is the Haseley windmill, with its expansive views and chorus of skylarks. I always pause there on my morning dog walks, and again, it is a place where I can, and do, pray, for local people, and for the parishes. I can see all three from there! We all know that we face big issues, but I believe that we need to find moments (and for some these might be associated with places) where we can stop, listen, and re-charge, and if it is our inclination, pray. For me, at a time of turmoil, listening to the peace of the 'wild things' of God has become such an important and necessary thing to do.

Small but Significant!

It's that time of year when many of us will be heading off for a summer holiday. What do you like when you go on holiday? Beaches or mountains? Something exotic or the comfortingly familiar? Full-on activity or simply quiet relaxation? Our family likes to get outside into the natural world and enjoy some dramatic scenery. So this year we went to Pembrokeshire, not far from St Davids – somewhere that was new to us.

While we were there we got to explore some of the beautiful Pembrokeshire coastline. We walked parts of the coastal path and took a boat ride to see the coast from a different point of view. There is nothing quite like rugged cliffs, open sea and a wide expanse of sky to make you feel small. Not just small, but also, paradoxically, deeply connected.

We also had the opportunity to visit St Davids Cathedral – a beautiful church in a spectacular setting. As well as enjoying the cathedral itself there was the added bonus of a display of art work. Towards the rear of the cathedral was a display of almost thirty oil paintings by the Welsh artist Jeremy Thomas (www.jeremythomasart.co.uk). Each painting depicts a scene from the life of Jesus, from the nativity through to the ascension. They are all part of a four year project to tell the story of Jesus Christ. A project the artist has called 'The Human One'.

What struck me most about the paintings was how Jesus was often a very small figure placed in a large dramatic landscape. As a Christian it can be very easy to forget the essential smallness of Jesus' life. He lived such a long time ago amidst the drama of the Roman Empire. His life was short and lived out in a small, troublesome corner of the world. In a teaching ministry that lasted only three years he profoundly touched many lives and caused such a stir that the religious authorities conspired with the empire to have him killed. Within just a few decades those who knew him had spread

the Good News of Jesus into Africa and Asia as well as Europe.

Whether or not you get to travel this summer, I hope you have the opportunity to get a break from the usual routines of life, experience your life in a different way for at least a few days and perhaps get in touch afresh with your own humanness. Holidays can not only refresh us but give us a fresh perspective on ourselves and our own lives. They can leave us feeling more deeply connected to creation or to culture, to friends and family. They can help to ground us again in the important thing of life.

Good holidays are holy days, like Jesus they can bring us closer to the things of ultimate significance that too often get lost in the noise of everyday life.

View from Views

As for the weather, it seems to continue to be dry with occasional showers; during June we actually had about average rainfall for the month. I think that this has helped all the struggling crops that were suffering through lack of water, especially as for at least 24 hours after rain it remained calm and not too hot.



The spring planted crops that were suffering have improved no end since the end of June, although they will never become record breakers by a long shot. We have just completed our Barley harvest 1 day for just about 100 acres, with the combine driver only having arrived back in the country from Holiday in the morning. I have seen better samples – we will have to wait until the buyers have analysed it – and the yield was not spectacular at 3 tonnes per acre. Now as I write we await the effect of unprecedented heat that is forecast. Already the wheat is dying off meaning it will only produce shrivelled grains, not a good prospect to feed the starving world.

Of these crops the Lupins begin to look more promising. Not being totally converse with flowering plants, (Lupins fall into this category). I assumed they would flower the length of the plant, I now discover that they put out side shoots that also flower, so it is difficult to estimate how they will yield. It seems that they produce a small cluster of flowers which quickly turn into pods, followed by a side shoot that does the same thing, I am sure the gardeners reading his will be saying, idiot – doesn't he know that. Anyway what I am trying to say is, after being disappointed that the flowers died off so quickly, I now find fresh growth and more pod, which is what we want.

On the wildflower front this year has proved that many wildflowers react to seasonal trends and some flourish when others don't. This year for instance has been good for Scabious, Ladies Bedstraw, and the usual Vetch, Knapweed, and Wild carrot but not for Campion or Oxeye Daisy, just to mention the obvious ones. To return to my comments of no mow May and Ragwort, I am currently in the process of pulling Ragwort as there were none showing in May, so a waste of time to mow then for it's control; I notice an abundance in the Manoir field. As a matter of interest, last year we stopped mowing an area of lawn in May. This was only an area that had been barren for years, and we only just scratched in some grass seed in 2009 to make us a bit of green. Now as I write there is Ladies Bedstraw, Scabious, Knapweed, Wild Carrot, Black Medic, and Vetch to name but a few, also as with all our wildflower margins alive with insects. The photo here illustrates this point.

The confusion over carbon capture and sequestration continues to be a mystery. Even the chair of the "Environmental Agency" has criticized the practice of planting

trees to offset carbon as only "Greenwashing" and that thousands of acres of land are being sold at inflated prices for this purpose, competing with farmers, when it is actually the farmers who are doing a lot more to sequester than any other sector. A correspondent in the farming press recently stated that there is no set formula to measure this sequestration and



that, in fact, cattle that are supposed to be so bad actually convert carbon to methane which biodegrades and their emissions are only the result of recycling the carbon that is in the plants they eat. He says that there are so many inconsistencies that one cannot really tell what is best. In other words, it often really depends on which side of the fence you are. All we can do is consider what we are doing by being careful and think before we leap. Of course no one ever makes the point that development has far more effect than the poor old cow or the farmer who is all the time trying to do what is right within the limits of his capabilities.

We live in most volatile times with one crisis following another, never knowing what disaster is likely to befall us round the next corner. Well at least as I write one thing is certain; we are about to have a new Prime Minister shortly for good or bad. Not for me to comment but a bit of stability will not go amiss. This situation makes me think about the PM's flat. It seems that a fortune was spent on altering the Downing Street flat occupied by the PM, in Boris' case for only 2 years, although we are led to believe it was not at the publics expense. None the less it is presumably owned by the public so it does not seem right that a tenant can just alter his/her landlords property or spend so much money without some check or balance. If I had any say in the matter, I would suggest that each new incumbent should be allowed £X to spend on decorations/alterations, end of!

We had a wonderful weekend of celebrations of our dear Queen's Jubilee. Now it has been suggested that we recognise this great achievement by having an extra Bank Holiday each year. Not that I am against an extra holiday, but would make the plea that these Bank Holidays should be evenly spread throughout the summer/year. It is barmy that we have 3 within a month or six weeks.
