



Community First Aid Courses by St John Ambulance

The St John Ambulance provides an 'Essential First Aid' course which thanks to local funding can be offered free of charge. The training can be held in the Village Hall – minimum eight, max 14 people, and is available to everyone aged 16 and over.

This course deals with serious conditions and incidents. It is ideal for providing the knowledge and confidence to respond quickly and safely when faced with an emergency involving a casualty of any age.

- Treatment of chest pains
- Treatment of choking for infant, child and adult
- Communication and casualty care
- Primary survey
- Treatment of an unresponsive casualty – for infant, child and adult
- Resuscitation for infant, child and adult
- Treatment of severe bleeding
- AED demonstration for infant, child and adult.

Courses can be held weekdays, evenings (usually 6-9.30pm) and Saturday mornings. Dates are likely to be available from September onwards (though for Saturday mornings it may be longer). 19/01994/FUL (Validated 25th July) Nunnery House, Tunworth Road, Mapledurwell RG25 2LU. Erection of a domestic garage with ancillary office/store above associated with Nunnery House, following demolition of the existing domestic garage. Partial change of use of existing access and adjacent land to residential land.

<u>19/01230/HSE</u> (Validated 3rd July) Elmwood Heather Lane Up Nately. Erection of first floor extension over existing ground floor.

<u>19/01711/FUL</u> (Validated 2nd July) Blaegrove Barn, Blaegrove House, Blaegrove Lane, Up Nately. Conversion of barn to dwelling and erection of cycle and bin store.

<u>19/01693/FUL</u> (Validated 27th June) Lyde Boarding Kennels, London Road, Old Basing. Erection of a three-storey building consisting of 20 x flats with associated parking following demolition of dwellinghouse and associated kennels.

Definitive [present] Alignment Mapledurwell and Up Nately Bridleway No13 commences east of Hungry Lodge, SU 6928 5080, proceeding south-eastward, then south-westward to a junction with Mapledurwell and Up Nately BOAT 22 [Down Lane], SU 6930 5072. Approximately 106 metres in length.

<u>Proposed Alignment</u> A six-metre wide grass path, commencing at a junction east of Hungry Lodge SU 6928 5080, proceeding south-eastward then south-westward to a junction with Mapledurwell and Up Nately BOAT 22 [Down Lane], SU 6934 5066. Approximately 177 metres in length.

Parish Council 'thank you'

The Parish Council would like to thank the long serving Parish Councillors who have stepped down this year: Alan Hutton, David Ellison and Lorna Cuthill. Alan had been a Parish Councillor for 20 years, Lorna for 12 and David for six, so a big total of commitment and time generously given. The Parish Council benefited from Alan's extensive local knowledge and concern for maintaining local highways and byways. Lorna was involved with the Victoria County History Project for Mapledurwell and Up Nately published in 2011, committed herself to protecting the rural environment of the Conservation Areas, organised the maintenance and use of the tennis courts, plus chairing meetings for six years. David Ellison devoted much time and effort to the sports pavilion, recreation ground and playground, and took the lead Parish Council role for the bonfire and fireworks. After the summer, the Parish Council will reconvene with a majority of new Parish Councillors. This is before the four-yearly local elections due in May next year!

POLICE UPDATE

Dear Residents

There is a few items that I seek assistance with this month.

Overnight of July 8th and 9th a gate

chain and padlock was stolen from a field at Frog Lane Mapledurwell, whilst between 1 pm and 8.30 pm on July 11th car batteries were stolen from a field in Blackstocks Lane Nately Scures.

At 1.30 am on July 18th a garage was broken into at Tylney Lane Newnham, the thieves entered the rear garden via a field. Thankfully the garage alarm was activated and the thieves made off empty handed. A good example of where a shed alarm has saved the owners property. This coincided with a similar crime in nearby Pot Lane Old Basing just prior to this time on same night when again a shed alarm saved the owners property from theft.

If anyone can assist with any information concerning these crimes or saw anything unusual between these times, please give me a call direct. All calls treated in strictest confidence.

Road works / water mains in Newnham

This summer and autumn, South East Water are replacing their water mains through much of Newnham, including Newnham Road and parts of Crown Lane, Ridge Lane and Newnham Lane. The first stage of the works will close Newnham Road (other than for access) from 29th July for an estimated three months. The Old House at Home will be open as usual throughout, please find your best route. (Note the official road diversion is via Rotherwick, as Crown Lane is deemed unsuitable [unsafe] for a diversion route.)

THE BASINGSTOKE AND DEANE BOROUGH COUNCIL (TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE) (NEWNHAM ROAD, HOOK) ORDER 2019

Effect of Order: All traffic will be prohibited from travelling along Newnham Road, Hook, from junction with Crown Lane to outside St Johns Cottages, as directed by traffic signs. The closure is to replace the existing road ducting.

Duration of Order: The order will come into effect on 29 July 2019 for 6 months. (Notwithstanding the above it is expected that the closure will be 3 months).

Alternative Route: London Road, B3349 Hook Road, The Street, Post Horn Lane, Ridge Lane.

Kidzone

Summer is well and truly upon us – what is your favourite summer pastime? Camping out? Barbeques? Water fights? Something to do when the sun has gone in ever so slightly is make giant bubbles. I'm not joking – cloudy weather is best!! I wonder what is the biggest bubble you've ever made? Does it come close to the world record – 3 cubic metres (or large enough to fit 14,000 tennis balls!!?) Or have you ever tried to fit something inside a bubble? At Chessington World of Adventures in 2006, 19 children stood inside a bubble – it was a record!

Well you might not manage the next world record, but just for fun, try this...

Ingredients:

6 cups water

1/2 cup washing up liquid

1/2 cup corn flour

1 tbsp baking powder (not baking soda)

1 tbsp Glycerine

Method:

- Dissolve cornflour in the water, stirring really well.
- Stir in the rest of the ingredients, being very careful not to create a lot of froth.
- Allow your bubble mixture to sit for at least an hour, stirring occasionally when you see the cornflour settling to the bottom.
- Use two drinking straws, and a length of wool that is 6 to 8 times longer than the length of one straw to make your wand. Thread the wool through the straws, tie a knot, and you're good to go!



When you make your bubbles, take a moment to watch them carefully. They come in all different shapes and sizes (hopefully yours are nice and big!) and anyone who can dip and wave can make one. But all bubbles have this one thing in common: they inevitably pop. Whether you try to hold a bubble, or just let it fly free - sooner or later (usually sooner!) it will burst. Life's a bit like that! We can dream of a life full of fun, money, good friends, happiness... for a while this picture can seem real and perfect. But, sooner or later, just when you think everything is going your way, something goes wrong... we fall out with our friends or family, a test doesn't go as well as we'd hoped, someone gets sick... our bubble bursts and it pops all over us.



But do you know what? The Bible says that, although these things, things of the world, don't last, there's one thing that always will – **God!** Instead of reaching out for what the world think's is important, let's reach out for what God thinks is important. These things last for ever.



Letter from Reverend Linda Scard

St Peter's Tide, or Petertide, is the Sunday nearest to St Peter's Day on 29 June and to the period around that day, and is the major of two traditional periods for the ordinations of new priests, the other being Michaelmas, around 29 September. The service in Winchester Cathedral on 29 June just past, St Peter's Day itself, was as wonderful as I remembered it from my own ordination to the priesthood. When you're in the thick of it things tend to pass in something of a blur, but as my hands were anointed by Bishop Tim I do remember feeling a great sense of "I'm home". This time I was there to support Helen O'Sullivan and Chris Dudgeon from our network of churches as they were ordained to the priesthood, and I was able to enjoy every minute of this beautiful service to the full. It was a joy to place hands on them as Bishop Tim called each of them to him to pronounce over them, "Send down the Holy Spirit upon your servant Helen – Chris – for the office and work of a priest in your Church." Later on I also had the joy of untying Helen's stole, tied as a deacon, and putting it back on Helen in full priestly fashion.

The Bishop's charge to those being ordained priest also includes these words: "Priests are called to be servants and shepherds among the people to whom they are sent. With their Bishop and fellow ministers, they are to proclaim the word of the Lord and to watch for the signs of God's new creation. They are to be messengers, watchmen and stewards of the Lord; they are to teach and to admonish, to feed and provide for his family, to search for his children in the wilderness of this world's temptations, and to guide them through its confusions, that they may be saved through Christ for ever. Formed by the word, they are to call their hearers to repentance and to declare in Christ's name the absolution and forgiveness of their sins."

This is a hugely demanding charge and I'll be the first to say that I can only begin to fulfil this priestly calling with the prayerful support of the people I'm called to serve. Please join me in praying for Helen and Chris at this very particular and special moment in their lives.

Something else which may not yet be "home" but is maybe "on its way home" is Fifa's Women's World Cup. Many of you know that I follow football (long story) and as I write England's Lionesses are preparing for their semi-final match against the current World Cup holders, USA. We'll hear lots of singing from the fans, "it's coming home, it's coming home!", which embodies a deep (and long held) desire and is a rallying cry that unifies and draws young and old, men and women together. Indeed I've been delighted to know just how many men have (grudgingly in some cases) admitted that many of the matches have been entertaining to watch, not least those played by the England team. By the time you read this, we'll know if they "brought it home".

The phrase "it's coming home" grabbed my attention because in my mind's eye I can see God shouting to us: "Joshua's coming home", "Suzanne's coming home", "David's coming home" - you get the idea. Jesus tells the story of a Lost Son (Luke 15), the son who rejected his father, left home taking his share of his inheritance with him, blew it all and eventually came home and was welcomed with open arms by his father who had hoped and waited all the time he was away. Jesus tells this story to illustrate the love God the Father has for each of us. When we're like the lost son and have wandered far from home, God longs for each of us to return home to him and to know his love and care for us in our lives. Each of us is precious to God, a trophy of great worth.

If you would like to find out more about this idea of returning home to God, then I encourage you to come and try the Alpha course this autumn. Alpha's a series of interactive sessions which freely explore the basics of the Christian faith. Each session begins with a meal, and is followed by a talk which considers a different question around faith and is designed to encourage conversation. There's plenty of opportunity to discuss, ask questions and share points of view in a small group. Alpha's open to everyone - whether you're new to the Christian faith, or have been attending church a long time, or are just exploring and questioning. Look out for the dates in your next Parish Magazine or ask a member of the clergy team.

Could the trophy possibly come home? Can't wait to find out!
