PAINTING IN DIFFERENT MEDIUMS

As you go around this year's Exhibition you will see paintings in many different painting mediums. Each medium has its own qualities that will render the same subject differently to that of another.

This is what the SEAG artists say about their favourite painting mediums.

OILS

Although I paint in a variety of mediums I regularly revert back to painting in oil. Most of my paintings in this year's Exhibition are in oils. It was with oils that I first learned to paint.

Painting with Oils is somewhat messy, each layer needs to dry before you can move on to the next, so it is very time consuming. However, I love the buttery consistency of oils and the different feelings that you get when the brush or palette knife loaded with paint, slides across the canvas. That can be in heavy impasto or as delicate as a butterfly's wing. It's a joy to be able to blend the tones, create the soft lost and found lines, that enables me to create form within the painting whatever the subject.

Acrylics

Acrylics are a clean and convenient way to paint. They are mixed with water so any splashes can be wiped or washed off.

The paint flows easily and encourages bold and creative art work. The colours are vibrant, too, and it is easy to go over any areas that need improving!

Gels and palette knives can be used to give texture. The paintings dry quickly and once varnished can last for years.

At our August meeting we usually hold a walk rather than a hall based meeting and this year we had the chance to tour redundant farm buildings owned by Severn Trent at Bulcote, it was built by Nottingham Corporation to dispose of sewage from the City of Nottingham in around 1901 as there was a massive cholera outbreak and the farm was built to dispose of all the sewage. It was a model farm and certainly no expense was spared when looking at the structure.

It has now ceased being a commercial farm at that site and will be developed for housing.

At the September meeting titled The Flying Housewife we were entertained by Paula Cornwall who became The Honourable Mrs Victor Bruce for the evening. She came dressed in clothing befitting the period and then proceeded to regale us with her tales of flying around the world in a small blue plane called Bluebird in the 1930s.

Such a fascinating talk and a truly daring lady who also held land speed records, well worth a Google to read more about her life.

The next meeting will be on 5th October with a talk from a local Blood Bike volunteer. We start at 7:30 and meet in the Minkley room at the village hall.




