Thank you to everyone in the community who responded to the Local Plan Review.

There was a positive attendance at the LPR drop-in session that the Parish Council hosted in December so that residents who did not have access to the internet could respond to these site proposals for up to 338 homes in Rodington.

The initial consultation ended on 31st January and Telford & Wrekin Council will now review the responses and prepare a "Publication Version" of their review, at this stage we will see if they have listened to our community and we will respond accordingly, ensuring we keep residents updated.

We wish to congratulate Connor Furnival, our Parish Council clerk, on being appointed to a larger council, but also express our regret that he is leaving us after more than 5 years of outstanding service.

With his growing commitments, including the birth of his 3rd child in August 2023, his commitments have meant that he feels it is time to leave this Council.

During his tenure, he has been an essential part of the award-winning team that is Rodington Parish Council, winning the Jan Snell Award in 2019 for the re-vamp project of Rodington Cemetery which Connor managed and this award was won again in 2024 for the project which has overseen the community orchard and in 2023 we were recognised by a national body as one of only two Local Councils in Telford & Wrekin to hold an accreditation as part of the Local Council Awards Scheme for good governance, service improvement and community engagement. We are also a Bronze Award recognised organisation as part of the Armed Forces Covenant due to our commitment to supporting those who serve and have served in the forces and Connor led the project to achieve this recognition.

With his energy and commitment, he has been a guiding light on the various initiatives we have undertaken which include improvements to the cemetery, the road safety program and installation of Speed Indicator Devices, the installation of defibrillators and new gateway signs into the Parish. He has been a font of knowledge when Councillors have needed advice and a thoroughly efficient manager of council business. Furthermore, you may well have seen him as a volunteer with Councillors planting daffodils, picking litter or delivering The Village Voice. He has made frequent trips to sort out issues arising and has put in many unpaid hours in his commitment to our community. I hope he will not object to my revealing that ours was his favourite Parish and it is only through increased demands from family and work that he has now decided to leave. He remains locum to Rodington Parish Council until we have appointed his replacement. We all wish him and his family every success and happiness for the future.

a 10 year

The Rodington Parish Plan was produced in 2020 and adopted as a 10 year plan, setting out the Parish Councils ambitions to support our community.

The plan was formalised using responses received through a whole-parish survey conducted in 2019/20. Every household received a survey form and we received a 28% return, this is higher than the Borough average of survey responses which is around 21%.

Following the responses received from the community, we set about setting a list of actions around a variety of issues where we feel we can help our community with the resources we have.

Nearly 4 years on from the adoption of this plan we have reviewed where we are and this report is to provide you with some updates of what we found;

What you asked for;	What we did; 🗸
Improved noticeboards	New and improved noticeboards have been installed in Longdon on Tern and Rodington and some existing boards will be identified for replacement.
Improve gateway signage for whole of Parish	Brand new gateways were installed in 2021/22
Improve fencing, cremated remains area and water tank area within Rodington Cemetery	All improvement targets have been achieved. The focus is on maintenance; this is done firstly via a contractor working on behalf of RPC, and a dedicated Cemetery Warden (volunteer) who oversees, and raises issues before they become problems.
Introduce a speed indication device scheme around the Parish, to include temporary SID's in hotspots	Adopted road safety as a top priority for the parish; this includes measures to reduce the speed of traffic, especially as it approaches speed regulated areas. In Longdon on Tern SIDs were installed and evidence suggests that most drivers observe the speed limits, where a minority haven't. SIDs are planned for Rodington, and a comprehensive traffic management plan is to be established within the Parish.
Actively promote rights of ways in the Parish and promote ways of getting involved with the work of the Pathways Group	Rodington Parish Pathways Partnership is a partnership supported by the Parish Council and Telford & Wrekin Council. All rights of way have been mapped and recorded on the 'Definitive Map' held by Telford & Wrekin Council. Improvements to access have been made, including kissing gates, stiles and footbridges installed and signposts. Some diversion and modification orders have been made amending rights of way.

Rodington Parish Climate & Nature Group review of the year...

Having spent some time working with Rodington Parish Council to decide on next steps after their 2021 declaration of a climate and nature emergency, it has now been just over a year since the Climate & Nature Group has been working more formally to put the parish council's ambitions into practice. With such a busy first year, we thought we would let the community know some of what we have been up to.

A large part of our work has been taken up with planning and delivering improvements to the Rodington Community Orchard. Located in the north-west corner of Rodington playing field, this small area was planted with a variety of fruit trees in the early 2000s. Thanks to a generous grant obtained through the previous ward Councillor Jacqui Seymour, we have been able to deliver a variety of work to benefit wildlife including planting a wildflower meadow, installing a bog garden for wetland plants and building a bug hotel. We have also installed a new bench to allow our community to have somewhere to enjoy a moment's peace looking over to the magnificent Wrekin. We try to post onto the various Facebook groups in the parish when we are doing work in the orchard as everyone is welcome. Why not come and join us next time (and make sure you come and sample the fruit next summer and autumn)?

Everything the group is delivering was generated by ideas from our community, and one of the things people wanted to see more of was help to reduce the amount of 'stuff' we buy through support to reuse and recycle where possible. We therefore set up the **Rodington & Longdon Upon Tern: Borrow, Swap and Give** Facebook group. Everyone in Rodington parish is free to join this group, and once on there can ask to borrow things they need as one-offs (such as tools), can swap items (such as excess vegetable plants) or can give things away that they no longer need. There is even a list on there of items that members have made available to be borrowed by others in the group. The group currently has 65 members and is doing some great work to reduce all our environmental footprints – **why not come and join?!**

With the terrible state of Britain's rivers constantly in the headlines, it's not a surprise that one of the ideas that came forward in the 2022 community survey was to see what we could do to help the condition of the 2 rivers that flow through the parish; the Roden and the Tern. The group therefore contacted the rivers team at Shropshire Wildlife Trust to ask what support might be available and, following a few conversations with their wonderful Head of Land & Water, Pete Lambert, the **Rodington Parish River Monitoring Project** was born. A small group of local residents have now been kitted out and trained to undertake monthly monitoring of the 2 rivers, and we hope that we will therefore be able to track whether things are improving or deteriorating. We will also be able to quickly flag any issues to the Environment Agency. **Keep an eye out in future Village Voice editions for an update on what the monitoring group has found.**

We are already looking forward to the next year of working to lower the parish's environmental and ecological footprint. By the time you are reading this article, **a new hedge will have been planted** along the southern boundary of Rodington playing field and we hope to have started **a new series of environmental talks** at the two village halls.

We will also be celebrating the last year with **our first annual event, taking place on 11th March at Rodington Village Hall.** There will be an opportunity to add your own ideas to what we do next, and we are really delighted to have well-known local gardening and wildlife expert John Hughes coming to talk to us. **Please see below for more details.**

Parish Council Budget 24/25

Under the Local Government Act 2000, every year Parish Councils have to set its budget and precept.

During November/December 2023, Rodington Parish Council published an article in the previous edition of village voice to ask for residents views on the budget setting process. Many thanks to everyone who spoke to their local Councillors and the Clerk with their thoughts. Lots of importance was placed on the environment and activities which help bring people together.

For the 2024/25 financial year the Parish Council set a **precept of £24,609.50**. Together with grants, VAT relief and reserves funding the Parish Councils budget is broken down as follows;



£13,265 for administrative, legal, service management support, including staffing and the Parish magazine costs.

£300 for staff and Councillor training, keeping us all up to date with the latest laws, practices and finding new skills to support out communities.





£4,350 for maintenance of Rodington cemetery, community defibrillators and the Ball Court.

£5,500 for community events, including the annual Christmas Event and funding for grants to community groups including village halls.





£5,000 to support the funding already secured for a Parish wide Road Safety Scheme

£3,000 for environmental projects, the climate and nature working group and supporting the improvements to rights of ways.
