

All other street light issues must be reported to KCC's Highways Department via the 24hr Contact Centre on 03000 41 81 81.

PLEASE NOTE that whenever you report a lighting fault you will be asked for the **column number** (which is on the street light) and the location. Please ensure that you have these details to enable a prompt response.

Northern Sevenoaks Masterplan

At the time of going to press, Sevenoaks Town Council's draft consultation on its 'Northern Sevenoaks Masterplan' is causing a great deal of angst in Dunton Green and a number of other neighbouring parishes as well. Dunton Green residents have expressed concerns about the apparent inclusion in this plan of land in Dunton Green for a suggested residential development of 850 houses to help support / justify their ambitious 15-20 year redevelopment plans.



The Community Safety Unit (CSU) consists of Sevenoaks District Council Staff, Police, Community Wardens, Housing Associations and other partner agencies.

Partners meet on a daily basis to discuss Community Safety Concerns, local crimes and Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) calls that have come in directly from residents or via agencies including the Police, to help keep the District a safe and fun place to live, work and visit.

The CSU is a great way for partners to address current concerns and have a speedy and effective response to residents of which all are updated. It has great initiatives for residents in rural and urban areas to keep them safe and their belongings safe.

"Let's Talk Rubbish!

Or. more specifically. litter.



No one likes to see our streets, paths and playgrounds scattered with dropped crisp packets, fast food wrappers, broken glass,

drink cans and all that other rubbish people leave behind. The Parish Council pays to have the litter collected up from our public spaces, and Sevenoaks District Council does their bit too. We also organise community litter picks to spruce up the village, but clearly this isn't enough. Recently, reports have been received of instances of large amounts of litter, twoisely been bettles.

typically beer bottles, McDonalds wrappers and drinks cans, usually in the Recreation Ground and Longford Meadow areas.

It's easy to shrug our shoulders and blame 'teenagers', or 'kids', or 'other people' and arrange an additional collection to clear up the mess. But let's look at this from another angle. Everyone who drops litter is somebody's child, or somebody's friend, parent, relative, whatever.

Can we do more to educate each other about ruining our environment?

If there's no bin immediately next to you when you've finished your food, put the wrapper in your pocket until you pass one - we've got lots!

- If your car has a load of empty packets and wrappers in it, bag them up and put them in the bin at home;

- Get involved with the community litter picks events!

- If you're a parent, make sure your kids know to put their rubbish in the bin, and lead by example;

-Kids: put your rubbish in the bin;

- If you're a teenager, make sure you and your friends put your rubbish in the bin...

You can see where we're going with this I hope! Not too complicated, is it?

Now, to add some perspective: An extra litter pick costs us (and therefore you) over £100 every time. And that's on top of what we've already paid for bins, and the usual emptying and litter picking services. That's money we can't spend on something more fun or productive.

On the Spring Bank Holiday weekend the village children couldn't play in the rec due the huge amount of broken glass left in the courts from the night before.

And remember, dropped food encourages vermin - I saw a rat just this lunchtime...

So, rather than keep throwing this money away, can we just look at ourselves and make sure we're doing all we can to stop spoiling our village with our rubbish?

Neighbourhood disputes are a sad fact of life. Noise or a minor property problem can quickly snowball in harassment, anti-social and even abusive behaviour. For those involved, a neighbourhood dispute can take over their lives. It can lead to depression, anxiety and a complete loss to know what to do next.


Problems are made worse as communication between people breaks down, escalating bad feelings and creating even greater problems. People who find themselves in such conflicts often spend time and money seeking legal advice and going through the court system. But mediation is a more effective approach.

The good news is help is at hand in the form of West Kent Mediation. Their trained volunteers can bridge the gap between warring neighbours, starting a conversation and building trust. In most cases, given time, this leads lead to an agreement that benefits everyone.
