

Up Hatherley Parish Council: Minutes of a Parish Council Meeting, held at the Village Hall, Cold Pool Lane, Up Hatherley, on Tuesday 7th January 2020, at 7.30 pm.

1094 Members Present

1095 Welcome

The Chair welcomed all present and informed members that prior to the meeting there was an opportunity for members of the parish to raise any issues of concern. At this point the Chair took questions from those present.

1098 Declaration of Members' Interests

None.

1099 Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 5th November 2019

All were in agreement and the Chair signed the minutes and initialled the pages. Matters arising are either on the agenda or will be discussed under the Action Tracker.

1100 Climate Change and Sustainability

- Tree Planting:

An email has been circulated regarding tree planting and discussion took place around this. The Chair informed the meeting that she had attended a meeting of town and parish councils in Stroud and carbon emission reduction commitments were high on the agenda with a number making resolutions for action. Suggestions included planting of wildflowers and trees along highways and liaison with landowners to encourage planting. At this point the meeting was opened to parishioners to join the discussion and offer ideas.

Ideas included liaising with Ubico re the grass cutting contract to change the frequency of cuts, additional trees on our greens, however need to ensure that there is a regime of watering and tree guards to protect saplings.

Cllr Houlton suggested that the Woodland Trust would provide trees for free. He asked whether additional trees could be planted behind Morrisons. This is borough council land, however they may be open to options. It was also suggested we liaise with Badgeworth and Shurdington parish councils. A working group was suggested to take this item further, and the following

volunteered to join the Chair; Cllrs Houlton, Young, A. Bamford, D. Willcox, B. Wilcox, and Ponting.

Concern was expressed about replacing hedgerows for trees, and a parishioner requested that hedgerows be protected, although some could do with brambles being removed. Also, it would be good to plant some Oak trees, as many were cut down even though they had TPO's on them when Manor Park was built.

The Chair thanked everyone for comments and the working group will bring back a proposal at a later date.

- Local electricity bill motion

The motion and associated background had been circulated. In summary this is about getting a Bill passed to support individuals selling back to the grid. All were in agreement and the motion was passed. The motion is shown as Appendix D.

1101 Proposed Community Grant Scheme

A proposal has been circulated. This is a new idea to formalise the request for funds from local groups. There was some discussion around the wording where grants are awarded to schemes outside the parish, and it was suggested this be amended to, " a significant number" to reflect that schemes on the parish boundary could still be eligible as they would benefit parishioners.

A few questions were raised that will need to be resolved including:

- What is the limit that can be bid for
- Who makes the decision – suggested schemes would need full parish council support to be accepted
- How do we categorise what is a small scheme

1102 Peoples History Project

The Chair reported that we have joined up with the Peoples History Project being led by the Church. A bid is being put into the Heritage lottery fund for a support worker to train people on how to obtain / interview the residents of the parish to collect their stories and experiences of living or working in the parish. Gloucestershire Archives have pledged £500 to the bid, and it would look better for the bid if we could also match this. All were in agreement with a £500 match fund.

Working Group Reports

1103 Policy and Resources

The Planning tracker is shown below, and a number of applications were discussed as follows:

- Kingscote Road East – this was revised so is now approved
- Manor Park – this is too large so was refused. An appeal has been lodged.
- Keswick Road – this has been withdrawn. It is of concern as there is a vulnerable resident living in the house and the garden has been purchased.
- West Lodge – This is very concerning, and discussions are ongoing with Cheltenham Borough Council about their decision to permit. A meeting is arranged for next week with the Head of Planning and Cllrs Bamford and Whyborn are attending. The application goes against the local plan and JCS, and the reasons for approving need to be understood to ensure that proper process was followed by planning officers.

- **Precept Recommendation**

The Finance Group has met, and the suggestions for next year's precept has been circulated. Two options are proposed, one a standstill budget that results in an overspend, or an uplift of 2%. The Chair ran through each heading and also highlighted the reserves position to members. Members were reminded that they had previously committed to assist with the youth event planned for the summer to help target the antisocial behaviour around the Windermere Road area, which could be up to £5,000 (although likely to be shared with neighbouring parish). It is therefore sensible to budget for these additional items. In addition, the Community grant scheme results in additional budget. Cllr Whyborn informed members that the additional fixed VAS agreed would cost up to £7,000 and it was agreed that there was plenty in general reserves to cover this. A vote was taken on whether members wanted a 2% increase in the precept, and all were in agreement. The detailed papers are shown in Appendix C.

1104 Police and Community Safety Update

Cllr Young reported that he has a meeting in February with Crime Prevention officers and it is expected that a further event will be organised in the hall covering for example covering cyber safety. An article went into the Record with the latest details, including 13 new neighbourhood watch groups being set up over the past 18 months. Cllr Young reminded all that the next bike marking event is scheduled in the hall for the 25th from 9.30am.

Regarding the crime statistics the December position is not yet known. However, antisocial behaviour remains the largest area of crime. The worst area is around Windermere Road. There have also been 2 possession of weapons during October, which is the first in the area since 2017. Further analysis of figures will be carried out over the next month, in particular to try and understand the impact that the new area of the parish has had on figures. There is also some concern that the police do not recognise the new areas as part of Up Hatherley, so this needs to be resolved. Finally, Cllr Young informed members that we now only have 1 PCSO covering the area.

1105 Village Hall

Cllr Johnes was not present however he has circulated some information on the website for consideration. The Clerk informed members that 3 sheds had been removed and Mrs Reay would vacate her store room by the end of the month.

1106 Communications

The Parish Record delivery didn't go as planned, however steps will be taken next year to be more specific about requirements, and also some will be brought back in house for delivery by those members who are happy to do so.

1107 Footpaths and Open Spaces

Gym Equipment:

Cllr D. Willcox has had a site meeting and locations have been agreed. Installation will include a rubber surface and the order has been placed. It was agreed that we buy the annual maintenance plan which is £395 plus vat. Installation will be February / March time. Putting up disclaimer notices was discussed, and it was suggested this be put on the noticeboard in the park.

Cllr Houlton asked if anything could be done to improve the running track as it becomes very slippery when wet due to the material they are using to do repairs to it. It is possible that this is due for replacement as the borough council do intend to do some works at the park next year.

Cllr Ponting asked who was responsible for cutting hedges along footpaths as several in the parish are overgrown. This is either landowner responsibility or Highways. The Chair pointed out that some parishes had taskforces who tackled hedges to keep footpaths open. The Health walks do a bit, however The Highways group will discuss this further.

Bin Notices:

These have been delivered however we need to know what is happening with the bins before they can be installed. Unfortunately, Karen Watson has not been responding to emails, it was suggested we lodge a complaint, so the Chair will draft a letter.

1108 Highways and Transportation

Cllr Whyborn noted the earlier discussion on purchase of the VAS for Hatherley Road, and all confirmed agreement that this be funded from general reserves.

Cllr Whyborn went through his report from the working group meeting held in December:

- GCC are currently recruiting a new local Highway Manager for our area.
- Signage at Cold Pool/Sunnyfield Lane Roundabout, Chris Riley felt there was latitude to put 30 mph sign on both sides of the road. The final 40 mph repeater sign will be removed if it is considered safe and legal to do so.
- Speeding hotspots starting to be identified, namely Alma Road (between Windermere/Langdale), and Hatherley Road (between Heron Close/Dean Close School).
- Carriageway and Footway Priorities:
 - Items on GCC lists:
 - Large puddle spanning new cycleway from Chargrove Lane towards Sunnyfield, drainage issues at Caernarvon Court
 - Patching Broad Oak Way carriageway, worst areas
 - Redefine lane marking (i.e. 2 lanes) on the approach to CPL/Sunnyfield roundabout from Hatherley Road direction, from 2018/19 – Scheme/arrows Pending
 - Patching Long Mynd Avenue carriageway, low number end, delete, no funds 2019/20.
 - Cycleway: UHPC requesting better lane markings on i.e. on the lane itself, and a greatly reduced number of bicycle markings on the carriageway. deleted till resurfacing due.
 - Re-instate lane markings (no arrows) – Caernarvon Rd approach to Morrisons roundabout. These markings were removed by GCC, as the lanes are not wide enough. No further action
 - Footways – minor works priorities:
 - Footpath Long Mynd Avenue – Pembroke Road – Caernarvon road
 - Above resurfacing was agreed by RV subject to estimates
 - Broad Oak Way back roads
 - Carmarthen Road agreed that it needs resurfacing on the even no. side.
 - Carriageways – minor works:
 - Hatherley Road, slip Road by Coney Gree, this has slipped off the priority list, but SW was thought to have some HWL money available.

- Caernarvon Road north of Hulbert Crescent surface breaking up
- Carriageways – major works:
 - Re-surface Caernarvon Road, at the same time resurface footways, remove humps, and replace with other suitable traffic calming such as long platform alongside Caernarvon Park, preferred scheme is “platform” all along the park area, ideally in conjunction with any 20 mph scheme. This item should be left on agenda, but “parked”, pending funding.

General consensus was that the pinch points in Caernarvon Road were working well, albeit the widths have relaxed a bit. Some consideration of ANPR replacement was discussed – which would potentially allow a bus route, but not much appetite for change.

- 20 mph schemes:
 - Extent of 20 mph is limited not only by cash, but continued Police stance that 20 mph limits should only be proposed where the mean speed is close to 24 mph.
 - GCC to conduct ‘tube’ speed surveys in a small range of through roads below, but cost up first and consult us, as it has to come out of the £62K Asda money. Action C Riley
 - Depending on outcome of the surveys, these roads and side roads off could become basis of a 20 mph scheme.
 - Will look at other ‘soft’ measures such as Gateways and improving Ped crossing at Asda.

1109 Community Engagement

CLlr Holden noted that there was nothing further to report at this stage.

Up Hatherley Parish Council

(i) acknowledges the efforts that this council has made to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and promote renewable energy;

(ii) recognises that councils can play a central role in creating sustainable communities, particularly through the provision of locally generated renewable electricity;

(iii) further recognises:

- that very large financial setup and running costs involved in selling locally generated renewable electricity to local customers result in it being impossible for local renewable electricity generators to do so,
- that making these financial costs proportionate to the scale of a renewable electricity supplier's operation would create significant opportunities for councils to be providers of locally generated renewable electricity directly to local people, businesses and organisations, and
- that revenues received by councils that became local renewable electricity providers could be used to help fund local greenhouse gas emissions reduction measures and to help improve local services and facilities;

(iv) accordingly resolves to support the Local Electricity Bill, currently supported by a cross-party group of 115 MPs, and which, if made law, would make the setup and running costs of selling renewable electricity to local customers proportionate by establishing a Right to Local Supply; and

(v) further resolves to

- inform the local media of this decision,
- write to local MPs, asking them to support the Bill, and
- write to the organisers of the campaign for the Bill, Power for People, (at 8 Delancey Passage, Camden, London NW1 7NN or info@powerforpeople.org.uk) expressing its support.
