BSJ Community Speedwatch Update - Sep 2023 (Marie Perry)

Speed Indicator Device (SID) data Jan 23 - Aug 23

➤ Incoming: 76,270 vehicles of which 27% are doing >30mph as they enter the village

➤ Outgoing: 71,917 vehicles of which 47% are doing >30mph as they leave the village

Highest recorded speed leaving the village: 87mph (Weds 1st March 11.50am)

> Highest recorded speed coming into the village: 74mph (Sat 29th April 18.55pm)

CSW Sessions:

➤ 37 watches so far this year, 3.8% of vehicles speeding

➤ 5 Excessive speeders (>45mph) sent on Speed Awareness Courses

➤ Due to the high number of incidents on A303 and A36 we now have our own speed device so we can carry out sessions when the village is being used as a diversion route. We are also receiving increased support from Wiltshire Police sending out their Community Speed Enforcement Officers

Fencing of footpath WSTO10/BSJA8

You may well have seen the work carried out fencing the footpath across the water meadow to Winterbourne Stoke from Berwick St James.

This has been reluctantly erected following reports to the Health and Safety Executive of cattle bothering footpath users.

Following these reports our only option to keep the public safe on this section of footpath is to keep the animals separate from the people.

We hope that going forward we will be able to have sensible dialog if any issues arise and that this does not set a precedent for other rights of way within the estate.

We ask that everyone continues to keep to the rights of way and follows the country code, so that everyone can enjoy the countryside around us.

Thank you for the email. As the note from Mike said the Estate were reluctant to fence the footpath but following Andy's involving the HSE we had no choice. In practice female dairy animals are quiet and as long as people continue to act responsibly the Estate has no plans for similar fences. The Estate welcomes walkers sticking to the footpaths and following the Countryside code. The Estate will continue to monitor and if we are of the opinion we need to fence a footpath we reserve the right so to do.
