The Parish Council held its Annual Parish Council meeting on 4<sup>th</sup> May 2021 where Christine Saint was re-elected as Chairman and Ann Gihon as Vice Chairman. We also co-opted on a new councillor and we warmly welcome Bernard Bevan-Davies onto the council.

### Chair's Report

*'I think that I must start this report by saying that this has been the most challenging year for everyone due to the COVID Pandemic but hopefully due to the population gradually receiving their vaccinations we are gradually returning to some form of normality. The Parish Council has met over the last year via Zoom which has not always been easy due to poor connections at times, but we have managed to carry on. The Council has achieved quite a lot in the past year:*

- 1. Three new pieces of play equipment were installed on the recreation ground which was made possible with the help of funding received from SSDC.*
- 2. There has been a lot of work carried out on the allotments due mainly to the commitment of Councillor Gihon and a team of willing helpers. Due to all the allotments being taken this means that any expenses on the allotments are now covered by the rents paid.*
- 3. After much work and discussion, we have now submitted a planning application to SSDC for a new building on the recreation ground which will include a small kitchen and toilets all being accessible to the disabled.*
- 4. The speed of traffic in the village has always been a concern and now that we have achieved a 20-mph speed limit through most of the village we must continue with this and lobby to get it continued along St Michaels View. We have a speed indicator device on order and hope shortly to get a Speedwatch team running again.*
- 5. The magazine committee kindly donated money for planters for the allotments and for either end of the village. The planters were made by Councillor Littlefield and help to enhance the look of the village.*

*We continue to have our lengthsman Darren who comes to the village every fortnight and he always carries out his usual duties of clearing drains etc and any additional task asked of him. I would like to record the councils thanks to Becky Maddison who does a weekly check on the defibrillator. Finally thank you to Sarah Moore our Clerk for her work, to Ann Gihon my Vice Chair for her support, and to all other members of the PC.*

### **Covid-19 Guidelines Update**

From 17 May we can:

- **Indoors** - meet in pubs and restaurants in groups of 6; meet in house or garden (two households or 6 people); stay overnight in each other's houses; cinemas, theatres and community venues fully open for all activities; indoor sport allowed; professional performances allowed subject to 50% capacity; church services can take place (rule of 6 in seating).  
No communal singing allowed yet. Having a window open indoors when you are meeting others is strongly advised.
- **Outdoors** - up to 30 can meet in a group and; entertainment allowed.
- **Events** - weddings and wakes - up to 30; funerals, no limit.

Getting around:

- **Travel** – we can travel to any part of England (group of 6 rule)
- **UK holidays** – unlimited and now allowed in any type of accommodation.
- **International travel** – a limited amount allowed for those countries on the “green list” provided they are accepting UK tourists. Testing is required with evidence of vaccination for many countries – all this will add a substantial cost to your holiday. Amber and red countries **NOT** recommended by scientists or government and will always involve quarantine and greater risk.

- **Masks** – still required in all shops, public places and on transport. The Government is urging us all to take things slowly and responsibly.

#### Step 4:

#### Free COVID-19 test packs available for all

The UK's successful vaccination programme together with the lockdown and social distancing measures are beginning to show real results. As of 19<sup>th</sup> April, over £36m vaccinations had been given giving a good level of protection. Deaths and infection rates are substantially on a downward trend and providing we all continue to be sensible and follow guidance, it is hoped this trend will continue.

The Government is encouraging all of us to pick up two free lateral flow test packs each week even if we don't have symptoms. Testing on a regular basis (which we can do at home and which gives us the result there and then) will help to identify people who are carrying the virus without symptoms (this can be 1 in 3 of us). By self-isolating if positive, we will help to reduce the spread even more, speeding up the return to normal life. You can pick up the tests for free from local pharmacies.

#### Business grants available

New Government grants are available for non-essential retail and the hospitality, leisure and personal care sector to help businesses whilst they move back to normal working. #### Recycle More

'Recycle More' from Somerset Waste Partnership is coming to South Somerset at the end of June 2021. Look out for your 'Get ready for Recycle More' leaflet coming through your door which will include a 'what goes where?' guide to recycling with the new service and an individual collection day calendar for recycling and rubbish collections for the coming year.

#### What is changing?

The key changes are:

- More materials will be collected weekly from the kerbside in addition to the current recyclable items:
  - plastic pots, tubs and trays
  - food and drink cartons (Tetra Pak etc)
  - small electrical items such as kettles or toasters
  - small household batteries
- Non-recyclable waste will be collected every three weeks instead of two.
- Collection days will change for roughly a third of households.
- A new recycling container – a Bright Blue Bag will be delivered to all homes.

#### When will things change?

These changes will be introduced across South Somerset over the course of around two weeks (depending on where you live) starting on Monday, 28th June. Stickers will also be stuck on boxes to show what items need to go where.

### **What won't change?**

- Garden wastes and clinical waste collections and their collection days will stay the same.
- Assisted collections (when crews help people with their recycling and rubbish) will continue on the new collection days.

Recycle More will work best if everyone makes full use of their weekly recycling collections. Please ensure you have all the containers you need. Everyone can have green and black recycling boxes and food waste bins. You can order new or replacement boxes or bins **FREE** using the My Waste Services menu at [www.somersetwaste.gov.uk](http://www.somersetwaste.gov.uk).

**Remember: nothing changes until you get your Bright Blue Bag**
