If you wish to help, you may like to know that Quex Park Farm Shop is acting as a collection point for donations, both monetary and material, for the displaced people of the Ukraine.

Covid-19 VACCINATION PROGRAMME - UPDATE:

The Vaccine Centre can now be found adjacent to "Wickes Building Supplies" and "Curry's Electrical Store" and has been called "Thanet (Broadstairs) Vaccination Service (LVS)

The new centre will be open every Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday from 8am to 5pm

- Booster Jabs are now available for everyone over 18 but please remember there must be 12 weeks since your second Vaccination.
- Older teens aged 16-17 are now eligible for a second dose but must be at least 12 weeks after their first
- Those aged 12-15 are now also eligible for a second does after 12 weeks.
- Those aged 5-11 where they or a family member are clinically vulnerable are also eligible

Not had yours yet? There are still many eligible patients who are unvaccinated and many others who have not yet had two vaccines or even their Booster, so don't wait until it's too late! You can still get seriously ill with Covid or worse - infect others!

PLEASE NOTE it will still be mandatory to wear Face Masks in all NHS Settings.

Repeat prescriptions

During your consultation it may be possible to consider issuing 3 monthly prescriptions for certain patients, so please ask your Healthcare Professional to discuss this with you.

"FACE-TO-FACE" appointments

Patients will continue to receive a telephone consultation from a doctor before being offered an appointment with the relevant healthcare professional. Currently **81%** of patients are receiving a Face-to-Face appointment where necessary.
