Both former Councillors were honoured in this way following their retirement, in consideration of their long service to the Council and outstanding contribution to the wellbeing of the people of Test Valley.

For Mid-Test, Tony's contribution has been recognised as uniquely valuable. As well as acknowledging his 16 years service at the heart of the community, King's Somborne and the whole Borough have profited from his skill and energy in his roles on the Council's Overview and Scrutiny Committee and as Cabinet Portfolio Holder for Leisure services. His King's Somborne community in particular has been well served by his role in advancing major projects such as the village pre-school and the Somborne Café.

TVAPTC/ TVBC Conference

The Annual Test Valley Association of Parish and Town Councils and Test Valley



Borough Council annual conference took place in September. The event was a great success with representatives from parish and town councils across the borough attending to share knowledge and ideas on a range of subjects including the Local Plan, community planning, environmental services and community engagement.

The next meeting of the Association will be on

Thursday 23 November and will include a presentation by Hampshire Fire and Rescue on Fire Safety and a session by TVBC Neighbourhood Planning Officer to discuss the refresh of the TVBC Community Planning Toolkit.

External Audit

The Council's external auditors, Ernst & Young, attended the recent Audit Committee meeting in September. Part of their presentation was to update the Committee on the audit of the Council's 2022/23 Statement of Accounts.

At a national level, there is a significant backlog of local authority audits. This is not the case in Test Valley, where all accounts up to 2021/22 have been completed and approved.

Ernst & Young have not yet undertaken any planning of the 2022/23 audit and are not anticipating doing so in the immediate future. Their focus is on trying to clear as much of the backlog as possible. EY are waiting for guidance from central government on deadlines for approvals for accounts for both 2022/23 and 2023/24.

They were keen to point out to the Audit Committee that TVBC is considered a lowrisk audit and that the lack of completion of their audit work is not indicative of any failing at the Council.

Test Valley Resilience Forum - Saturday 28th October 2023

Over the last 10 years it has inspired many communities in Test Valley to become more resilient through peer support and learning.

The October session was a chance to help bodies such as Hampshire County Council, Test Valley Borough Council and other organisations, from the Hampshire and IoW LRF, understand what more they can do to encourage community resilience.

Case studies based on Mottisfont, Romsey and King's Somborne were looked at to consider how different size communities could develop their own resilience capacity.



Polling District and Polling Place Review

Test Valley Borough Council is undertaking a review of Polling Districts and Polling Places. The review will consider the suitability of existing polling stations and possible alternative options. As part of the review, the Council is consulting residents, elected councillors, political parties, parish councils, groups representing disabled people and other interested groups to seek their views.

Anyone making comments on the suitability of existing or proposed polling stations is asked to suggest alternative stations, where possible. They are also asked to provide their reasons, to help with the review.

The consultation period for the review formally commences on 13 October 2023 and concludes on 24 November 2023.

The council would welcome any person or organisation with expertise in access for persons with any type of disability to make a representation or comment on the proposals.

Stockbridge Parish Council News

There is still a vacancy for one Councillor at Stockbridge PC and the Clerk would like to hear from anyone interested in becoming a Councillor and contributing in this way to their local community.

At the September meeting, residents from Old London Road discussed HCC's proposal for changing the layout of the road. What is being proposed at this stage is not a one-way street. This proposal had been seen as the solution for solving the traffic safety problems outside the school at the start and end of the school day. However, HCC has said that it would not want to instal a one-way street without a cycle lane that allows cyclists to travel safely both ways down the road. The cost of providing a cycle lane would be expensive.

The Parish Council has now acquired the site of the old Victorian Workhouse, Lancaster House. The council is keen to ensure that the site becomes an asset for the community. If there are any preferences as to what it could be used for e.g. a wild camping site, a nature trail or a tiny forest, please let the Clerk know.

Romsey shop awarded Business Incentive Grant



A new shop - Fig and Fox - on The Hundred in Romsey has been awarded a Business Incentive Grant.

Fig and Fox opened in October 2022, selling independently crafted and ethically sourced household goods, houseplants, gifts, local food and drink, along with baked goods and speciality coffee. The Greening Campaign is a scheme through which communities can consider how to tackle climate change, including measures to reduce energy use, health impacts



related to climate change, waste prevention, promoting biodiversity and growing your own food. Over the last 15 years they have worked with over 200 communities. They are currently working with the Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust, and the sustainable gardening charity, Garden Organic.

National Lottery funding has been awarded to help 20 communities in Hampshire support their journey in relation to climate change through this scheme. Eight are already signed up across the county, so there is funding available for a further twelve communities. A small number of information evenings are being organised across the county in case anyone wants to find out more, alternatively you can get in touch with the Greening Campaign using the details on the attached poster.
