Council Joins No Mow May to support pollinators



Test Valley Borough Council is inviting residents to help create a pollinatorfriendly borough for the month of May and beyond, as part of No Mow May. This national campaign

supports pollinators by leaving stretches of land to grow wild.

As part of our commitment to create a sustainable, environmentally-friendly borough, we have mapped out a number of green spaces and banks of urban meadows that will be allowed to grow wild as 'pollinator rest stops' throughout May and beyond.

Signs will be popping up across the borough to show where these green spaces are located. Key areas for residents to look out for are roundabouts, parks and nature reserves.

No Mow May is a simple but effective way to help pollinators thrive. By allowing wildflowers and other native plants to grow, we can create essential habitats for bees, butterflies, and other pollinators, which are vital to our ecosystem. In addition to supporting pollinators, No Mow May also helps to reduce carbon emissions, save water, and create beautiful, natural landscapes.

Charlotte Rimmer, countryside officer for Test Valley Borough Council, said: "No Mow May is a great way to support pollinators and make a positive impact on the environment. We would love residents to join us in this campaign and help us create pollinator-friendly habitats in their gardens and green spaces."

Failing to assist with fly-tipping investigation leads to man being ordered to pay nearly £2,000

A man has been ordered to pay nearly £2,000 after failing to help with an investigation into a large fly-tip found in woodlands known as Lords Wood.

In June 2022, Test Valley Borough Council received multiple reports of a large flytip, which included a number of plastic bags containing household waste, a mattress, plastic garden plant pots, household furniture, wood, carpet, and other household items.

Contents inside the waste led officers to Mark Dane, of Haweswater Close, Maybush, Southampton.

Dane was invited to attend an interview under caution on 23 September 2022, but he failed to attend. He was later served with a notice requiring assistance with the investigation, but there was also no response.

Mr Dane was sentenced with failing to assist with the fly-tipping investigation. At Southampton Magistrates Court on 31 March 2023, Dane was ordered to pay a fine of £1,100, a victim surcharge of £440 and costs of £451.

Paul Wykes, Head of Environmental Services at Test Valley Borough Council, said:

"This is a brilliant result and one that people should take notice of. Failing to help us when investigating these matters will lead to a harsh sentence and one that is so easily avoidable. There is no excuse for this and we will do all we can to ensure people face the consequences."

This programme is being delivered in partnership with Community Energy South and Dragonfly Power during 2023/24 and 2024/25, funded through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund. It will provide the Council with tangible deliverables to meet the Climate Emergency Action Plan which includes a commitment to work with our communities and partners to identify opportunities for making the Borough carbon neutral.

The launch event is planned at 6pm on Tuesday 13 June at Stockbridge Town Hall inviting residents, parish & town councils and community groups to find out more, and how they can get involved.

Initially, Alison will lead Broughton, Houghton, Lockerley and Mottisfont/Dunbridge. Ian will lead in King's Somborne, Stockbridge, Longstock and East Dean. Stewart will lead in the Tytherleys and the Wallops. This division of responsibility will be under regular review.
