	The footpath behind the village hall was being used as a shortcut for young off-road bikers. Mr Solley was amenable to having a gate installed but all work was on hold during the lockdown.		
Discussion	The nuisance motorbikes were a county wide problem. It was discussed that CCTV might be a possible way to catch the riders. Mr. Plumptre has given permission to site CCTV on his land. There was a piece in the Community magazine from the PCSO regarding the current situation with riders. Two had been issued with Section 59 orders which means that if they are caught again their motorbikes would be seized. Another case was coming to court soon. Video from a resident enabled the PCSO to identify this rider. The Speedwatch team would shortly be re-starting. Volunteers required, please.
