- The Hampshire Inventory of Ancient Woodland is a provisional inventory that was published in 1995 by Hampshire County Council on behalf of English Nature (as Natural England were previously known). Sites that appear on the Inventory are over 2 hectares and include ancient semi-natural woodland and ancient replanted woodland.
