### West Meon Church Fete

It also coincides with the long weekend of our Queen's Jubilee celebrations, so lots of opportunities to come together as a village and have a good time in the midst of these uncertain times.

A recent newspaper article (Guardian 2nd April) suggested that a sense of community cohesion is important to our well-being and survival. Rituals such as the religious practices of sitting and standing (hopefully in unison!), singing and praying trigger our brain's endorphin systems underpinning the bonding of friendships and building of trust. 

## Parishioners' support for those fleeing Ukraine



At a meeting on Thursday 7th April a group of parishioners from West Meon and Warnford discussed how both communities might provide help and support for Ukrainians who flee the war in their country and come to live with us here. There is already a very active Facebook Group called Meon Valley for Ukraine and parishioners are already involved with this wider group. At some stage in the next few weeks we may find Ukrainians living here with us as guests. We need to think now about how we can support them. What is possible and would be really useful to prepare for? These below are what we have agreed to date:

- The church wardens and PCC have agreed that the side chapel in West Meon Church could be used as a place of worship for Ukrainian Orthodox Christians so that they could hold services at agreed times. Such worshippers from across the Meon valley could also attend.
- The West Meon School governors have already discussed providing places for refugee children.
- Henry Clay has approached the West Meon surgery to enquire as to how best the surgery can meet the healthcare needs of any refugees who come to our parishes.
- Buffy Morris is co-ordinating the drafting of an online Welcome Pack about our communities with JB Garway Templeman and Jane Waller.
- Angie Trenchard, Chair of WMPC, agreed to co-ordinate a community meal for refugees, when appropriate.
- Leonore Moritz has agreed to hold a meeting with those interested in being hosts for refugees, to share the experience of visa applications, working with local councils, DBS checks etc.
- The West Meon Community Shop will try to stock foods and ingredients that Ukrainians may be more familiar with, like buckwheat for example.
- The Sports Club will consider what games and activities they may be able to organise. These are a great start to the planning but we need more. Please let me know if you can help with any of the list below:
  - Are there volunteers who could drive a minibus or car to help?
  - Might the Allotment Society provide an allotment space if required?
  - Do you have an old phone or laptop/tablet that is not needed any more?
- Can you start to put aside good and clean children's and adults' clothes, toys and the like so that we can hold a Chattels and Clothes Sharing Café at an appropriate time?
  - Do you speak Russian or Ukrainian or Polish?
  - Could you provide employment or training?

#### Other Shop News

Mother's Day gifts and flowers were a massive hit this year in the shop with plenty of choice, attractive price points and lots of variety. It was lovely to see so many new faces coming to look at our welcoming displays in the shop. Easter goods also sold very well, with our usual range of slightly different alternatives and not just eggs.

The earrings that Mandie has been making to raise funds for the Ukraine, where 100% of sales income are given to the charity, have sold extremely well. What an amazing thing to do Mandie, so we thank you on behalf of the village for raising such a lot of money, which is still being collected and counted. Moreover, the earrings are so pretty and it's nice to see so many of our customers wearing them around the village.

Although Jacqui Kingham has retired and we are no longer able to purchase our bird food from her anymore, have no fear as we have found another supplier and are bagging up the bird foods ourselves. These can be found in the usual place under the table but this time in brown bags!

We have tried to cut as many costs as we can so far this year, but with rising living costs, minimum wage, electricity, and general maintenance charges rising, it is becoming ever more challenging. That said, we can adapt and overcome and are finding new ways to save on general costs, one of which is the reduction in the size of our Biffa Bins (now half the size) so please do not feel that you can empty the contents of your bins in the shop's bins any longer as we need every little speck of space in the bins now.

Cook Meals have become incredibly popular here at the shop, what a fantastic addition to our ever-increasing range of products. The philosophy underpinning Cook is worth highlighting, namely 'We believe a good meal should be cooked not processed, from great ingredients sourced sustainably, so it's delicious and nutritious and helps nourish our communities'. Libby's sourdough is also such a welcome sight (and aroma) on Tuesdays and Saturdays. We have customers come far and wide for this sourdough so make sure you get up early to secure your loaf. Also please take time to look around the shop while you're here and not just run out of the shop with your bread, as there of lots of tasty additions that would complement the sourdough, such as the Chalkstream Trout pate or even some of our local cheese from The Cheese Stall in Winchester. So please keep on shopping local, support the small businesses in our supply chain, and stay safe.





## **Getting Wild About Gardens**

The buzz of a bee... the sweet scent of honeysuckle... the splash of a frog hopping into a pond... chattering birds in a hedge. These precious moments are not only delightful to experience in our gardens, they're vital if we're going to protect, restore and reconnect UK wildlife.

Since 2013, The Wildlife Trusts have partnered with the Royal Horticultural Society on our Wild About Gardens initiative – encouraging everyone with a garden to provide food and shelter for wildlife. In fact, you don't even need a garden to get involved: window-boxes, a bee brick in your wall, or flower-rich balconies can all make a difference.

Wild About Gardens follows a different theme each year, inspiring gardeners to help a different species. For example, in previous years we've separately championed hedgehogs, bats and butterflies.

So, why is it so important for us to dedicate our own patch to wildlife? Well, almost 90% of UK households have a garden. This equates to over 20 million gardens, which, incredibly, covers a larger area than all 2,300 Wildlife Trust nature reserves combined. With many UK species in decline, using these spaces means we can collectively make a huge difference to our struggling wildlife.

It doesn't even have to involve lots of time and money because letting nature take its own course can often be the best way. Try leaving a patch of grass to grow wild and you'll soon have lots of new visitors, plus it can work wonders for our own wellbeing.

We're dedicating this year's Wild About Gardens to our high-flying summer visitors – swifts, swallows, and house martins. While these amazing migrant birds rarely touch the ground and

only remain in the UK for a few months a year, there are still ways we can help them.

Swifts and house martins were recently added to the UK's Red List for birds, meaning they're seriously threatened, have suffered severe declines, and require urgent action. The simplest thing you can do is let a patch of grass grow long – this will encourage insects in your garden and provide food for birds. You can have a similar effect by planting a colourful, insect-friendly wildflower border. Creating a boggy garden patch will provide mud that swallows and house martins use to build their nests. And to provide a home for a swift, consider installing a swift box or brick.

### West Meon Attacked

Sir, - I read with interest in "Down Memory Lane" (27th January 1982) a letter from Mr. Blunt which mentioned the time when the German Air Force was attacking railway installations.

I well remember when a lone bomber attacked the railway tunnel at West Meon, on the Meon Valley line, at about 4:45pm one day in the early 1940s.

I was living at West Meon and working for my father's coal business. My late brother Peter and I were unloading coal from a wagon at West Meon station when a German bomber appeared out of low cloud south of the station.

We could see the black crosses as it passed low overhead, following the track to the north. It then turned back and dropped a bomb, hitting the road bridge and exploding just short of the tunnel and hurling sections of the steel rail 50 feet up into the cutting and on to the field alongside.

Luckily the explosion cut the telephone wires causing bells to ring continuously at both Privett and West Meon signal boxes, thus holding up the train at Privett Station. This was, indeed a miracle as the train was full that day, mostly with schoolchildren.

Also the goods sidings at West Meon station were full of ammunition trucks ready to be taken away by the army to dumps hidden in the woods nearby.

I expect many of our readers from the West Meon area will remember this incident.
