

Parish Council Meeting: 14 June 2007

<u>Present</u>: S. Bust; A. Fraser; D. Herbert; G. Herbert; A. Paris; D. Parrish; M. Thompson.

<u>Village Hall:</u> The planning application has been passed by District Council. AF to gather required information for grant applications.; AF to contact WREN; MT to start initial work on village fund raising ideas.

Parish Plan: ARP circulated a draft version which was generally approved with some amendments. The budget for this leaflet is approx. £160 – there will be sponsorship opportunities (either corporate or individual). Anyone interested in sponsoring this leaflet should contact the Parish Council.

<u>Design Statement</u>: Draft letter and questionnaire circulated and generally approved. It will be circulated with the next Halam News and then collected by PWG and Parish Council representatives. The PWG was thanked for their input and work so far.

Speed Watch: It was agreed to write to County Council to request that the 30mph limit be extended towards the Edingley end of the village. There have been administration delays with the speed watch scheme, including the assessment for the second location (near the ford), as Melissa Pickance is currently on maternity leave. Our Beat Officer is currently being trained to use a speed gun so that he can act as an official back up to the volunteer team. MT will bring the children's feedback from the school travel plan to the next meeting.

Gray Lane: Gray Lane is to be resurfaced in June. The slipped bank has been inspected and not deemed to be a problem for the bridge or the roadway.

<u>Hedges & Branches</u>: Could all residents please check that their hedges and trees are not obstructing pavements or public footpaths.

Fund Raising from Recycling: MT circulated information regarding recycling empty printer cartridges and old mobile phones, to raise money for the village; MT to research further as money raised could be put towards the village hall extension/refurbishment. HALAM ORGAN FUND APPEAL LAUNCH

After 123 years it's time to play a different tune in St Michael's Church Halam! The P.C.C. and Halam Arts are launching, as a joint initiative, a major fund-raising programme of events in order to rebuild St Michael's Church organ. Why do we need this?

"The Bevington organ plays hymns (badly!) and a very limited amount of organ music written for one manual (keyboard). It is inadequate for playing wedding music or to accompany a choir. The manual is shorter than normal by 7 notes; the pedals have only 24 notes (there should be 32!) and are not independent of the manual, as. The pedals are much closer together than a standard pedal board making playing difficult and rendering them utterly useless for playing most organ music. The vast majority of organ music should be played on two separate manuals with each pedal having a distinct sound so that different parts of the music stand out. This is just not possible on the current instrument!" – Alec Wells.

The present organ, a very basic 'Chancel Model C', built by Bevington of London, was probably installed during major restoration work in 1884 by the architect Ewan Christian who was at the time working on Southwell Minster. It was cleaned and worn parts were replaced in 1981. It now desperately needs completely renewing. Weddings and baptisms are popular events in our lovely Grade 1 listed Norman Church. We have a thriving small choir and a loyal congregation. In addition the church is used for services by Halam C of E Primary School. The Church is often used as a venue for concerts and a rebuilt organ will enhance this – music is, surely, as important as the building!

We hope to gain the support of all sections of the community and businesses in this initiative, as well as those who may not live here but have lasting associations with the village. Please buy tickets for our launch appeal – it promises to be a lovely evening in beautiful grounds!

Bramley, Halam Hill – Demolition of existing bungalow and erection of new dwelling with double garage: rejected unanimously – application has not addressed problems of previous proposal: height & scale too great, creating negative impact on neighbouring property. Proposed house now closer to adjoining property; loss of privacy and amenity; a lower property (dormer type) - more acceptable.

amenity; a lower property (dormer type) - more acceptable. Flooding: The recent problems of flooding following the exceptionally heavy rain were in detail. Action points:-

1. Flooding and Flood Risk Assessment will be on the next agenda for further discussion at the next meeting. 2. Clerk will write to Internal Drainage Board, C.C. and D.C. for their help during flooding and request advice and recommendations to prevent further problems. They will be invited to attend a P.C. meeting. 3. The P.C. will monitor Beck maintenance to ensure it flows freely. 4. Faster & more effective road closure will be considered. 5. Does a Flood Officer need to be appointed? 6. Advice to home owners — in case of problems the D.C. emergency flood team are available via main switchboard number (650000). Bag of garden peat/bark chippings can act as sandbags. 7. Parish footpaths will be checked for flood damage.

Finance: Agreed to pay; Parish Path Partnership bill (Council funded) and Parish Council election costs (to the District Council)

IN MEMORY: DR CHARLES WALKER



Many people in the village will be sad to learn of the death of Dr Charles Allen Walker. He and his wife lived in Halam for some 30 years at "Norwood Hill" at the top of Halam Hill, having moved here from Zambia. He was a lecturer at Brackenhurst and he was an expert in daffodils and narcissi. He and his wife were strong supporters of the Church in Halam. The garden that they kept was renowned as one to visit in the spring and they opened their garden for a great many years in February, March and April.

He would have been an excellent candidate for the well-known Radio show "Just a Minute" as he could talk for a very great length of time about spring bulbs without any fear of repetition! Another feature of his garden in Halam was the 'Yew Church', a wonderful piece of topiary measuring 40 feet in length, with a nave and chancel and a tower! Sadly though, this gradually became overgrown as Dr Walker could no longer keep the 'church' in good order through regular pruning.

Dr and Mrs Walker retired to the Cotswolds and lived near Broadway where they became staunch supporters of the Longborough Opera house.

Dr Walker died aged 92 on 12 July 2007.

Matters Arising: 1) Fingerpost at crossroads – County Council have been asked to repair. 2) Travel Plan – Notts. County Council are looking at stopping free travel to school for under 16s. A consultation document has been circulated – pupils have been given a copy for parents. This is an important document and you are urged to read it and complete it for return.

<u>Village Hall</u>: The application form completed so far was reviewed and discussed and further points for action noted. The form should be submitted before the deadline.

Future fund raising activities were discussed; it was agreed that it was important there should be communication and co-ordination between the Parish Council raising money for the village hall and the organ restoration fund raisers.

The possibility of a hog roast and barn dance and/or village bonfire night was discussed.

<u>Parish Plan</u>: Sponsors for the Village Contacts leaflet have now been obtained and final proofing is underway. The leaflet should be circulated in the coming month.

<u>Design Statement</u>: A PWG meeting has been held to discuss the results of the village-wide survey. A report is awaited from Nevil Croston.

<u>Speed Watch</u>: County Council have stated that a review of all village speed limits will be completed by 2010; our request to extend the 30mph limit at the Edingley end of the village has been noted. County Cllr Stewart will ensure that Highways are fully aware of the number of accidents that have occurred coming into the village from Edingley.

Flooding: County Council and the Internal Drainage Board and undertaking work to reduce the risks of further flooding A meeting is being held at Kelham Hall on 4th October to discuss further the problems of the summer flooding – Simon Bust and Andrew Paris to attend.

Footpaths: Please report any footpath problems to the Clerk or Marina Thompson. The Parish Paths Partnership scheme is now in its third year. A decision has to be made whether to extend its duration – this will depend upon finding a suitable co-ordinator in the village as Elaine Gathercole is unable to continue in this role.

Road "Dressing": The Parish Council expressed its dissatisfaction with the recent road dressing in the village. Cllr Andy Stewart was told about the poor co-ordination of the project in terms of communication of the timescale and vehicle removal, and the poor quality of the finished job.

Street Lights: It has been noted that there are street lights in the village that are not working. Please report any defective lights to County Council on 0845 330 4256.

<u>Planning</u>: Ashleigh, Radley Road – 2 storey side and single storey rear extension: passed unanimously, but with the request that no additional windows should be allowed in the elevation overlooking the neighbouring property without a further full planning application.

<u>Planning Decisions</u>: <u>Machins Farm, Radley Road – Erection of 2 storey side extension and ancillary buildings to rear of farmhouse: planning granted by District Council</u>

<u>Finance</u>: Parish Paths Partnership – 2 invoices approved for payment.



Present: S. Bust; A. Fraser; D. Herbert; G. Herbert; A. Paris; M. Thompson. Apologies: D. Parrish

Matters Arising: 1. Flood Meeting – Simon Bust reported on the meeting at Kelham Hall; The District Council will help Parish Councils to have more local contingencies, e.g. a local store of sandbags, checking on dykes, and willl be organising a survey of all dykes and ditches where there was flooding. 2. Parish Working Group – Nevil Croston reviewed a report from the PWG re the recent village questionnaire. The P.C. thanked Nevil Croston and other members of the PWG for all their work and valuable input. The issue of a Village Design Statement will be put on the next Parish Council agenda. 3. Harvest Supper – the church are now not in a position to organise this. The P.C. will organise an event in November - a community event rather than a fund raiser, but any profit will be split 50/50 between the P.C. and Church organ fund.

Village Hall: Having reviewed projected costings from John Thornewill, it was agreed that the P.C. was not in the position to apply for WREN funding in time for the deadline. Various possible options regarding a community meeting place/village hall were discussed at length. It was agreed that, at the very minimum, basic maintenance and redecoration should be carried out to the village hall, but if full funding could be obtained, then the proposed extension and re-modelling should be done. Andrew Fraser is to look at the possibility of getting a larger lottery grant.

<u>Highways</u>: Gray Lane – a meeting will be held with County Council on 17th October. Problems with the recently dressed road surface will also be discussed at this meeting <u>Flooding</u>: A map of all manholes and gullies in the village is to be drawn up. This can then be marked up and sent to the District Council showing areas that need attention.

Footpaths: It was reported that some of the footpath bridges have been underrmined by the recent storms. These will be checked. Please report any footpath problems to the Parish Council.

Open Meeting: A question was asked about the precept charged by the Parish Council on the Community Charge for Halam. The point was made that the village hall mortgage costs about 50p per week per household.

<u>Planning</u>: It was reported that the D.C. are to have further discussions with the owners of Bramley, Halam Hill, regarding the proposed new dwelling for the site.

<u>Correspondence</u>: 1. A letter was read out from Mrs G. Starkey re parking problems at the Turnpike/Radley Road junction. Please note: it is illegal for vehicles to park opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of road junctions. The clerk will write to the local Beat Officer about these problems and future persistent offenders will be reported.

2. Annual Parish Council Conference at Kelham Hall will now be 12th November at 6.30pm.

3. A request has been received from the Church organ fund raisers asking if the P.C. would like to sponsor a new organ pipe. It was agreed that while it was felt than the PC should not take up this offer, the PC was prepared to help by donating part of the profits raised from some future events.

IN MEMORY OF DENNIS FOX (1926–2007)

Many in the village were saddened by the death of Dennis who died on 15 November 2007 aged 81. He had lived in the village since 1951. He was born in Newark and worked at first with Ransome and Marle the engineering company before moving to Partners the printers in Newark. It was whilst he was at Ransomes that he met Kath Bass and he married her in January 1951. It was natural that they came to live in Halam - Kath's brother Bill lived here with his wife and children - their youngest child was Linda. Denis and Kath forged very close ties with Bill and his family and were next door neighbours - separated only by Gray Lane.

Dennis retired from work with the Printers in the late 1970's and thereafter would often be seen helping with farm work or in neighbour's gardens. His life entered a very quiet phase after Kath's death and he became notable for his constant presence and smile in the local village shop. .No matter when one went into the shop Denis was always theresmiling and quietly listening; - he seemed part of the shop furnishing- no matter who owned it.

Always quietly unassuming he nevertheless contributed greatly to village life - polishing the church brass and copper, sometimes undertaking duties on the church cleaning rota and supporting those less fortunate than he in the village. Of particular note was the love, care and support he gave his niece Linda in her last illness.

He had a great love of life and was transformed when talking of his life in the Services He was a great supporter of the library van and always borrowed several books when they paid a fortnightly visit to Halam. The librarians would trawl through their stocks to look out a supply of Westerns especially for him. In summary Denis had a quiet dignity which affected all who met him. As John Betjeman wrote:

<u>Matters Arising</u>: 1. Flooding – Mr Edwin Kite from Edingley wishes to contact Halam Parish Council to discuss sewage problems in the two villages – contact details to be passed on to Simon Bust. 2. <u>Village Hall:</u> Refurbishment – project discussions ongoing – held over for next meeting. There are no plans to close the hall – the Parish Council is committed to keeping this Parish facility open. Funding – Marina Thompson will fill in WREN application form. Andrew Paris reported conversations with Kneesall Parish Council. They had raised grants to create a Parish Space within the church, but lottery funding available was much larger 2-3 years ago

<u>Design Statement</u>: Examples of other design statements had been circulated. The Wymeswold example was agreed to be very good; discuss further at the next meeting.

PC email address: It was agreed that the P.C. should set up its own email address on a six month's trial basis so that parishioners can contact it via email if required.

Open Meeting: Matters discussed:- 1. Christmas tree – to be put up at the start of December. 2. Estimated costs of the village hall refurbishment. 3. Parking close to, or opposite road junctions on Radley Road. The local police are now monitoring the situation and will take action if required. 4. Speed of traffic through the village.

<u>Correspondence</u>: Pathfinder Consultation and Free School Transport – due to the large response to this, the County Council have decided not to charge for school transport. Many thanks to Councillors Andy Stewart and Bruce Laughton for their assistance with this.

<u>Planning Decision</u>: <u>Bramley, Halam Hill: demolition and erection of new dwelling</u> – refused by District Council (policies H13 & H21) due to impact on neighbours because of the proposed dwellings height and position.

Planning: Halam House Farm, Radley Road: demolition of existing building and build 3 new dwellings & associated garages/access roads – rejected unanimously. Reasons: 1. new proposal does not have a mix of houses the previous one had, and does away with the agreed semi-detached, smaller properties; 2. Proposed new houses - too large and too tall; 3. Loss of the existing old wall; 4. Blue tiled roofs out of keeping with the rest of the village; 5. possible creation of drainage/flooding problems; 6. archaeological investigation of site required; 7. Protection from further development of the land further up the hill required.
