AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

1 — Character & Identity Maintaining and enhancing the rural character of Nether Wallop, Jack's Bush and the wider parish area.	5 — Environmental Protection Protecting and enhancing the natural and historic environment, the quality and character of the built environment and the wider countryside.
2 — Local Prioritisation Coordinating all new development so that it prioritises the creation of safe, sustainable, and mixed communities with good access to jobs and essential services for everybody who lives and works in the parish.	6 — Design Quality Ensuring the quality of new development through the appropriate use of materials, details and inclusive design that responds to the Nether Wallop context.
3 — Choice of Movement Maintaining a robust network of paths, streets, and roads appropriate for all modes of travel to support the needs of current and future residents, businesses, and visitors.	7 — Managing Change Ensuring that any land put forward for development will be developed in such a way as to improve people's quality of life, for both existing and future residents.
4 — Resource Efficiency Using land and resources efficiently so that existing and new developments have a reduced demand for energy.	8 — Future Infrastructure Delivering the community infrastructure necessary to support an evolving village in the 21st Century.

There is only one set of objectives, those that appear on Poster No. 10, (above) as follows:

- 1 — Character & Identity
- 2 — Local Prioritisation
- 3 — Choice of Movement
- 4 — Resource Efficiency
- 5 — Environmental Protection
- 6 — Design Quality
- 7 — Managing Change
- 8 — Future Infrastructure

These 8 are the set to work with. In our recent checklist we suggest that we compile a table that matches policies against objectives (*page 2 – RE to create a table that matches the polices against the objectives to ensure this is covered off in the way TVBC expect it to be*) but we only intend to do this “at the last minute” as it were before the Reg. 14 is ready to be published. This is because until the objectives and policies settle down and become established, this could be abortive work.
