All residents are warmly invited to this Parish Council's fourth and final Assembly before May local elections



We continue to look for ideas to help us all get more from our Community and Neighbourhood with thanks to all who have organised and contributed to Church/Community events. The Old House at Home is registered as an 'Asset of Community Value' and we await new owners Red Oak Taverns' decision as to whether they will refurbish and reopen. Twelve months on from the 'Save our Local Bobby' campaign, PC Reid can update us on local policing. Now the Black Dam roundabout has reopened we can reassess the present traffic situation and there will be a 2016/17 scheme to improve the A30/Baredown junction. The Parish ditching project will continue with considerable work done so far at the Barracks and some progress at Water End. The Parish Lengthsman scheme will finally be going ahead with a group of other Parishes which will mean some Highways funding for road-and footpath-related village maintenance. The Planning Inspector is due to submit his final report on Basingstoke & Deane's draft Local Plan to 2029 in which most of the Loddon Valley remains green for the time being. And last but certainly not least Hart has shortlisted the 'Local Gap' fields between Hook and Newnham for housing. The outcome of the recent Consultation is due to be published in May and the Parish Council will be preparing its response to the summer Local Plan Consultation which is the next stage in a process with potentially major implications for Newnham. This year the Quiz will have a royal theme in honour of the Queen's 90th birthday

POLICE UPDATE

Dear Residents

We are experiencing a increase in non dwelling burglaries across our area from Winchester area through to Aldershot area. In the area of this magazine we had a garage broken into at Tunworth Road, Mapledurwell and a shed at Water End Park, both on the same night of March 2nd and 3rd. Between March 12th and 14th 2016 we had a similar burglary in Blackstocks Lane, Up Nately where a quantity of tools etc was stolen. I am appealing for any information concerning any of these crimes and ask if you can help please give me a call direct ~ all calls treated in strictest confidence.

Slightly out of my area but not to far, the Police at Hook have had eight non dwelling burglaries to outbuildings in Rotherwick and two in Hook town and three in Odiham plus a house broken into, within a four week period.

I ask all residents to please be aware of this current increase in reported crime within our area and ask that all outbuildings be kept secure, garages not left open when no one is in or working within them. Please record serial numbers and for expensive machinery please photograph it for your records ~ just in case and photograph expensive property and garden equipment. Please consider shed alarms which are not too expensive and good locks but on good solid doors. Please try to mark your property by scratching in a post code or U/V markers. If you need security advice please give me a call and I will endeavour to assist you.

And finally a plea from local shepherds and farmers asking for ALL dog owners to please keep their dogs on leads and away from fields where sheep are. If you are out walking in our area please do keep your dog on a lead and under strict control, you may have seen the sad event in West Sussex where over 100 sheep, many pregnant ewes died as a result of dogs involved in a sheep worrying incident.






