# **PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE**

The Parish Council held an additional meeting on the 25<sup>th</sup> July to co-opt someone to fill a councillor vacancy which has been open since May. I am pleased to announce Katy Morris has been co-opted to the Parish Council with immediate effect.

The recent village hall open day was well attended and the Parish Council extended their thanks to Amanda and Andrea for hosting the event, allowing villagers to view historical documents before they are deposited with the Berkshire Records Office. In due course some of the documents, photos and maps will be made available on the West Ilsley website.

The willow tree has now been removed from the pond and thanks must also be extended to Peter Carlisle for helping move the tree so it could be logged.

Whilst the meeting was arranged primarily to fill the vacancy other topics were discussed which will be communicated via the WIN in due course.

That said, I will mention one of the topics in this update.

The Parish Council regularly receives feedback from villagers about potholes, public rights of way being overgrown, the over-grown verges along Bury Lane and more. The mechanism the Parish Council has to report issues to West Berkshire Council is via the report a problem link at the bottom of each WIN. Based on recent experience I would encourage people to use the link to report problems as one report from the Parish Council (which we are happy to do) will likely gain more importance if multiple residents report the same problem.

# **UPDATE FROM CLLR CAROLYNE CULVER**

In the autumn Thames Water will be attending a meeting of the Scrutiny Commission that I chair to answer questions about sewage and infrastructure investment. I will ensure that the public's concerns are put to them. The Commission will also be setting up a sub-group to look at lessons learned from how the council responded to the covid pandemic, and will be investigating why children entitled to free school meals perform less well at school compared with all children. WBC's performance is particularly poor in this respect.

I continue to get lots of complaints about speeding. Compton and East Ilsley are following in the footsteps of West Ilsley by buying a speed indicator device to measure the speed of vehicles. The council's bin contractors have been spotted sitting in their vans and not emptying the bins properly. Officers have told me that the terms of the new contract mean that WBC can

withhold payments if the company doesn't empty the bins properly, which was not the case with the old contract, so that's some consolation.
