- All copies ever issued are archived at Hampshire Record Office in Winchester.
- On a monthly basis **1,240** magazines are published ten times a year. St Mary Bourne gets 715, 335 go to Longparish and 190 are for Hurstbourne Priors.
- You can buy additional copies in the Village Shop for 50p.
- People who leave the village can join a postal subscription service to receive the magazine. H&V can also be viewed on line.

Anyone can submit a contribution on a monthly basis as long as it is in the **communities' interest**.

Contributions need to be sent to the relevant village editor by the copy deadline (usually the 3rd Wednesday of each month).

The team then compiles and proofs front page, vicar's page, services page, diary dates page and their community pages. Each evening the following Sunday the final version is sent off to the printers.

By the following Friday one of our volunteers will collect all magazines for distribution and a small armada of volunteers will then deliver the magazine free to each household in the three parishes.
