BLACKTHORN WITH SLOES

GUELDER ROSE

The leaves of trees and shrubs are changing colour to their autumnal hues in November. The leaves of Guelder Rose gradually turn red, matching the berries, while the foliage of Field Maple and Silver Birch transform to a beautiful gold colour. Dogwood is a big problem in the Quarry because it forms dense areas of scrub that shade out wildflowers. However, it does provide additional leaf colour at this time of year. Blackthorn bushes now have their purple fruits, called sloes, and some of their branches have yellow and white lichens growing on them. In a few places you may see the colourful pink and orange fruits of the Spindle bush. Small birds become easier to spot as the leaves fall off the trees and shrubs – look out for flocks of Blue, Great and Long-tailed Tits as they search for food to build up their reserves before winter.

Monthly information and pictures about the changes in the Quarry can be found on our notice board up at the Quarry entrance. So when you are walking in the Quarry, take a look and see if you can spot these beautiful changes.

Parish Council Update from the Chairman

Council Vacancies

Whilst the council has grown throughout the year, we currently have two vacancies. Serving on a Parish Council allows you to contribute to your local community for the benefit of all. We are a collective mixture of ages and expertise and we would welcome anyone that would wish to contribute. Council meetings are open to all to attend, so if you wished to find out how the council operates, please come and visit one of our meetings.

What does the Parish Council do?

The Council meet on the first Monday of each month for the Full Parish Council meeting. This would be the meeting that would cover finance, reports for the community police, County and Borough Councillors, correspondence from partner authorities and residents and planning matters.

All Council Members also meet again mid-month for the Planning, Highways and Transportation Committee. Primarily his will be for comments linked to planning applications made to Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council - the principal planning authority.

The Council is responsible for the running of the Community Centre. The Community Centre Committee meet monthly to discuss the hiring of the centre, the maintenance and running of the centre, our Kilnbarn bar and the events that go on each month.

The Council is also responsible for the open spaces such as the New Road recreation ground, the Kilnbarn recreation ground and the Quarry Local Nature Reserve. It also assists on matters such as the Public Right of Way footpaths and the Stream. This committee also meets monthly.

We also have a Finance and Administration Committee and a Personnel Committee that meet quarterly or when required.

Community Centre Committee

The Committee has over the past 12 months continued the maintenance of the Kilnbarn Bar. Regular users will have noticed the new carpets and chairs. The Council also made decisions about pricing including switching suppliers to reduce the potential price hikes that we were facing throughout 2023.

The Community Centre has also seen developments including replacement of the front stage curtains and window curtains in the Oaken Hall. The sound system will be upgraded shortly. The Council has also agreed to upgrade the toilets for the Oaken Hall and Acorn Room. These works will take place during 2024.

The Council is continuing a programme of replacing old light fittings with LED which are far more energy efficient. So far the exterior lights on the building, the Oaken Hall and corridors and some of the office have been replaced. We are soon to have vital works undertaken to line the exterior drains. The drains are old and frequently get blocked so a specialist company has been engaged for the work.

Planning Committee

Whilst fairly quiet this year, all planning applications that are made in Ditton, whether for tree removal or cut backs, garage conversions to large scale construction of new houses are considered by the council.

Comments made by the public are considered and the Parish Council will report to Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council it's opinions linked to any developments. Plans will be considered either by Planning Officers for Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council or actually by the local Area 3 Committee made up of TMBC members for the local area only.

Open Spaces Committee

The Committee monitor all the Open Spaces and in relation to the upkeep of the green areas around the village. The The council has worked hard to monitor the trees of the village and you would have seen cut backs of trees throughout the year to make sure neighbouring properties are not effected by the trees growth of the past decade. The Council Open Spaces Staff also carry out maintenance for both the Infant and Junior Schools and in the churchyard.

The Committee also manage our popular allotments which on the whole are very well tended and we continue to have a long waiting list. The Committee also implemented the replacement of the floodlights at our multi use courts and upgraded the lighting to LED which will see a saving in electricity costs.

We have been successful in an application for some funding from the Planning Obligations Scheme which means in 2024 we will see the Multi Use Games Area surface be replaced with a new porous asphalt playing surface and the replacement of the wooden play trail at the top of the Kilnbarn recreation ground.

The replacement to the MUGA surface is scheduled to commence on 15th January 2024 and this means the facility will be closed for up to 3 weeks. All current users will be contacted and we apologise for any inconvenience during this time.

This year St Peter's Church once again took part in a shoebox appeal for Link to Hope, a small Christian charity which offers help to people of all backgrounds regardless of race, colour or creed with no qualifying criteria other than that they are poor and marginalised. Boxes are sent to either a whole family or an elderly person living in extreme poverty in Eastern Europe.

The Junior school held a non-uniform day in October to raise money to help with the appeal and Ditton Church Pre-School donated some wonderful items to go in the boxes. We shopped for and packed 23 boxes with donations from the schools and the community. Other people chose to pack a whole box themselves and thanks to your generosity we were able to send a total of 50 boxes this year, together with some beautiful knitted items from Crafty Coffee.

When the shoeboxes are delivered, the charity's project leaders are able to identify emergencies such as Maria, aged 74, found sleeping on a freezing cold and dirty floor.
