For those I haven't spoken to yet, I've taken on the Route Manager role for the A30/A35 DBFO in Devon from Ben Hampson. Ben's retained the section running through Dorset.</p> <p>As you'll be aware National Highways have 2 safety studies in progress running from Honiton to Charmouth and then Charmouth to Yellowham. At a meeting in October with Ben, it was discussed that we would like to come down in 2023 to engage with the communities and carry out 'village walk throughs'. Ben & I would like to carry these out on 12, 13, 14 June with approximately one day for Devon and two for Dorset.</p> <p>Could you please let me know whether you / a representative from your parish council would be in a position to attend during any of the below slots. 3B	24/04/23	Air Quality Data on the Dorset Council website	Response	Out	Dorset Council	<p>"Thank you for replying but what you have told me is what I have been told for the last 2 years or so!</p> <p>In fact, things have changed for the worse in that time – at one point data after 2019 was available albeit in a non-user friendly way. Now even that has disappeared.</p> <p>Yes, data from before the council mergers is available. But it is now at least 4 years out of date. What is required is data from April 2019 onwards. Without that how can anyone outside of your team know if the situation is the same, better, or worse.</p> <p>Data in the ASRs is always at least 2 years out of date."</p>	Sent to all
3C	24/04/23	Air Quality Data on the Dorset Council website	Response	In	Dorset Council	<p>Thank you for your email. Data from 2019 onwards is included in the ASRs from 2020 and 2021. This is published in the ASR as that data is correctly bias adjusted, annualised and distance corrected. It is also ratified by DEFRA providing an additional safeguard for accuracy and relevance. The ASR for the previous calendar year is published following review by DEFRA, for which the deadline is June. This delay is to ensure that bias adjustment data and annualization data is accurate.</p> <p>Whilst I appreciate your concern rests with ensuring the public have up-to-date information about air quality, this is the most contemporaneous data we can offer with the tools that Dorset Council employ. A single datapoint for a diffusion tube is not relevant or useful information outside of its use within annual mean data processed as above. This year's diffusion tube bias adjustment factor was 0.8 – meaning the raw data read 20% above its true value. At the meeting last week I shared with the action group the preliminary data assessment for 2022, however I could not provide that in a formal capacity as the second round of bias adjustment factors is yet to be published, and the report yet to be ratified by DEFRA.</p> <p>Should anyone wish to access the most up-to-date data, they are able to do so by contacting our business support team to obtain the most recent ASR. The question has been asked as to why this is not available as a link and should it be a possibility it will be done. Likewise with the Chideock AQMA page I have submitted the request for a change to the text and AQAP linked on the page.</p>	Sent to all
