### Senior Citizens Christmas Party

I am pleased to be able to say that the Christmas Party will be going ahead as planned this year, with plenty of people signed up for an evening of food and frivolity. However, in light of the current situation – infections rising, new Omicron variant with accompanying uncertainty as to its virulence and susceptibility to the vaccines, we are proposing a number of precautions to protect all involved:

- 1. We would ask that you undertake a Lateral Flow Test\* on the day of the party, and not attend if this is positive for Covid
- 2. We will rearrange seating, so that instead of the usual 2 x long table setup, there will be 6 tables of six, spaced as far apart as possible. Your food will be brought to you at the table and the people doing the waiting will be wearing facemasks
- 3. We will minimise as far as possible the need for close interactions at each table, so no crackers or nibbles I'm afraid!
- 4. In line with current common practise there will be no communal singing from the attendees while the Greyhound Buskers Ukulele Band provides the entertainment.
- 5. Following Government advice, we will be opening as many doors and windows as possible for short periods throughout the evening to disperse any build up of Virus but hoping to avoid anyone finding this too cold or uncomfortable.

By these means we hope to ensure that people have as good a time as possible without jeopardising their health in the run-up to Christmas. We also hope these measures will go some way to reassure those wondering whether it will be safe to attend. If you are unable to attend for any reason, please let me know as far in advance as possible, on 847705.

## MINSTER SURGERY

### Covid-19 VACCINATION PROGRAMME - UPDATE:

Booster Jabs are now available for the over 40's but please remember there must be 3 months since your second Vaccination.

Older teens aged 16-17 are now eligible for a second dose but must be at least 12 weeks after their first

Those aged 12-15 are still only eligible for a single dose.

The Covid-19 Vaccination programme will continue to be rolled out

at the Vaccination Centre in Westwood throughout December,, every Tuesday ,Thursday and Saturday with Drop-Ins available any time.

Not had yours yet? There are still many patients who are unvaccinated and many others who have not yet had two vaccines or even their Booster, So Please Book Now or just turn up at any DROP-IN CLINIC.

<u>WINTER FLU vaccine</u> All patients over 50 and those considered to be vulnerable and at risk will have already received an invitation from the surgery to receive the Vaccination. So if you have not received your invitation please contact the surgery as soon as possible.

Covid-19 cases are still quite high throughout Thanet with coughs and colds quite prevalent in many local schools so PLEASE use common sense where necessary and follow the guidelines:

#### Wash Hands" "Cover Face" "Make space" "Let Fresh Air In"

New Persistent cough? Loss Taste/Smell? High Temperature? Book a Test - Call 119 PLEASE NOTE it will still be mandatory to wear Face Masks when attending the Surgery.

#### "FACE TO FACE" appointments

Patients will continue to receive a telephone consultation from a Doctor before being offered an appointment with the relevant healthcare professional. Currently **62%** of patients are receiving a Face to Face appointment where necessary.
