## NOTES FROM SEPTEMBER'S PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

The meeting was attended by four Parish Councillors, the Clerk and four members of the Public.

The Public Session considered...

Special Measures – Government's option to assume a Local Planning Authority's decision-making powers for major developments (at least 10 dwellings) should the LPA refuse too many applications subsequently allowed by Inspector at Appeal. The threat of Special Measures is to elicit compliance. Few councils have been placed in 'Special Measures'.

Footway at Hooper's Mead almost impassable at one point because of undergrowth; this matter referred to the Housing Association.

**Police** PCSO Andy Jones attended with colleague. Currently engaged in joint operation – in relation to recent large jewellery thefts from Whitchurch and Oakley – also looking for 4x4 trespass / criminal damage related crime.

Parish Council requested speed enforcement on Farleigh Road. Response that Police Constable and all team trained in use of hand held speed detection devices. Andy will feed back Parish Council's request.

MOTO application for MSA M3 J6 Further consultation, further response from Parish Council that Cliddesden and all local parish councils are united in opposing this proposal. Particularly citing issues relating to the BDBC Ecological and Climate emergencies

**Local Plan Update** Council leader, and Planning portfolio holder seeking to visit all Parish Councils.

**Neighbourhood Plan** Draft document approaching Reg 16 Consultation conducted by BDBC.

Kingsmore Copse festival licensing application – the event rescheduled for September 2024. Parish Council will maintain links with the Cosmic Roots organisers, and monitor all proposals which must be in accordance with legal requirements of the licence as granted for up to 5K people. An important issue for

Cliddesden is the access which has been redirected via Garlic Lane.

**Pond floating islands** installed on 16<sup>th</sup> August, thanks to Alison Mosson for designing the project and overseeing installation.

**Pond pathway** in need of replacing with a hoggin (scalpings) path.

**Station Road verges** To be cut and grass collected, end Sept onwards and additional plugs planted.

**30mph and 'school' signs** obscured by vegetation in vicinity of Otters Nursery. Logged on HCC website. Thanks to Dave Rudge for cutting back some of the foliage.

**External audit** complete, awaiting certification, to be posted on the Parish Council website

**Newsletter** Appreciation expressed to Dave Brown as editor; also the Parish Council's thanks to Christine Stanbury for previously stepping up to fill the role.

**SID** Thanks to Dave Rudge for managing SIDs and data collection.

# Surgery Update From CGHB Future of Operose in NHS England

Many of you will have seen the recent Basingstoke Gazette article regarding the sale by Centene (an American New York listed public company) of Operose, its UK Healthcare operation.

To gain some clarity as to what this change of ownership means for CGHB patients, the PPG met with two representatives from the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Integrated Care Board (ICB) and has been reassured that the potential sale of Operose will not put patient care at risk. The responsibility for the provision of clinical services at Camrose, Gillies, Hackwood and Beggarwood (CGHB) remains with the partners of CGHB and this will not change.

This proposed change of ownership of Operose is by no means imminent, indeed it could well be some months or even years before this sale is finalised. However, the situation for the healthcare of CGHB patients will not change. The Integrated Care Board, which is a statutory NHS organisation responsible for developing a plan

for meeting the health needs of the population, managing the NHS budget and arranging for the provision of health services in a geographical area, does not hold a contract with Operose Health. The ICB's contract is with CGHB to provide primary care to the 50,000+ patients on its books.

It is the CGHB partnership of GPs which has taken out a contract with Operose Health to provide central support services to aid their deliverance of primary care for their patients. This can include IT support, finance, analytics and insight, HR and recruitment, tech and digital including Dr iQ, training and additional clinical and admin support.

Therefore, to summarise, the change of ownership of Operose Health by Centene does not mean that CGHB patients' healthcare is for sale. It could mean that the support services provided to the practice could change once a new owner for Operose is found, but this remains to be seen. However, the PPG has been assured that responsibility for our healthcare lies with the GP partners of CGHB and that this will not change.

This is a message from Dr Anna Reed (one of the partners of CGHB) to all patients of CGHB:

#### "Dear patient

You may be are aware there has been some speculation about the future ownership of Operose Health. I would like to reassure all our patients that we will continue to provide patient care and services as usual at our four CGHB sites. At the same time, Operose Health continues to invest in more staff and new technology to get you seen as quickly as possible. There are no plans for this to change in the future.

The PPG will update you from time to time when we know more about the sale situation but in the meantime, we hope this information goes some way to reassure you that things will not change with regard to the day-to-day operation of our practice.

#### **Covid and Flu Vaccinations**

The roll out of this dual program has probably already started by the time you read this Newsletter as the program is due to start w/c 11th September. Patients will be

contacted by text, phone or letter inviting them to clinics to receive both vaccinations. Those who cannot attend the clinics will be contacted and a home visit will be arranged along with visits to Care Homes etc. Please be patient and wait for the contact as it will not be possible just to phone the surgery and ask for the vaccinations.

# World Sight Day 2023

# 43 million people in the world are blind 1.2 billion need glasses to see better

World Sight Day, now in its 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive year, comes once again to a stand in Central Square, Basingstoke – between Primark and Costa - on Thursday, 12th October between 9am – 3pm, courtesy of The Basingstoke Lions Club and offering a display featuring information regarding sight loss and small items of equipment to help the visually impaired with some of the practical aspects of daily living.

As with each year, people are invited to take along their redundant spectacles – prescription, non-prescription and sunglasses – for forwarding to the Lions Club of Chichester who will sort and distribute, e.g. gold rims are sent for melting down for the gold and

vintage/designer pairs are sold on Ebay. The remainder are then sent to Medico France in Le Havre who have the necessary equipment to clean and grade the spectacles, ready for use in eye camps in Africa, India and Eastern Europe.

Around 1/1.30pm the Club's very own "Lennie the Basingstoke Lion" may be spotted 'on the prowl', when he drops in on Leightons, Vision Express and Prime Opticians in the Town Centre to collect the haul of spectacles already donated by their own customers.

In addition, the Lions will mount a spectacle collection point in Morrisons Supermarket from Monday 9th - Sunday 15th October, thus providing an alternative option

for those who might find that preferable.

On a global scale, the aim of this day, on which Lions Clubs around the world conduct various sight-related projects, is to focus attention on the universal issue of avoidable blindness and visual impairment and thus raise awareness about the importance of eye health and the need for quality eye care services for all.

A pair of spectacles can make the difference between supporting a family or starving; if of no use to you, please bring them to us – thank you.
