#### Welcome to our Parish

#### Ensure you can have your say – empowering young voices

Working with data from the youth needs assessment, WODC is looking to create a dedicated youth specialist role to make sure that young voices are represented in future Council plans.

The introduction of the new youth specialist role will improve communication between the Council and its young residents, prioritising their needs in discussions around major Council strategies, including the Local Plan, climate strategies and the Council plan. Supported by research indicating the strong desire for young people to contribute their ideas and be heard, this initiative aims to ensure young people are actively involved and represented in decisions shaping the development of their communities.

#### Don't lose your vote

With District Council, Parish Council and Police and Crime Commissioner elections coming up next year, check now to make sure that you are registered to vote.

Letters have started to make their way to your door for you to check your details, but if you want to check or even update your records ahead of the letters, you can do so at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote

Recent home movers in particular are urged to check their details. Electoral Commission research has found that recent home movers are less likely to be registered than those who have lived at the same address for a long time. Also, this time, ID will be required for you to be able to vote when you get to the polling stations. This can be any Government issued photo ID, even ID that has expired. Alternatively, if you do not have any, there is a scheme in place that allows you to apply for a voter authority certificate through www.gov.uk/apply-for-photoid-voter-authority-certificate

#### We have a current vacancy

The Parish Council is made up of a group of volunteers that work for you, to improve our parish. Being a Parish Councillor gives you an opportunity to get more involved, play a part in making decisions and to get to know more people. The Parish Council meets once a month as well as working with the district and county councils. If you think you have skills and the time to join or want any more details, please contact the Parish Council. There will also be a full election in May.

#### House checks with the cold weather coming

Now that the colder weather is starting to come in, now is the time to check that your heating supplies are working well. It is advised that boilers are serviced annually. Make sure that your boiler engineer is registered with OFTEC or Gas Safe before they start work. It is also advised to bleed radiators before using them for the first time to make sure there is no air in them so they can work efficiently. Venting, or bleeding, is best carried out when the system is cold and off. Details on how to bleed your system can be found online.

Chimneys also require some maintenance. It is advisable to get your chimneys swept annually if you have a working fireplace or a log burning stove. Sweeping not only improves the efficiency of your chimney, but also reduces the risk of chimney fires. It is best to get a professional in to do this job and often takes less than an hour. Also take the time to check that your carbon monoxide and smoke alarms are all in working order.
