

Sign up for garden waste collections by 3 March

From April, West Oxfordshire District Council will be charging £30 per bin, per year, for its fortnightly garden waste collections.

You need to sign up to receive this service and the Council are writing to all households in early February with more details. To take advantage of the maximum number of collections for the year, starting from April 2017, please register before 3 March.

If you do not wish to pay the £30 charge, simply do nothing and your garden waste collections will cease at the end of March 2017.

Show me the money.....and what to do with it!

The Parish Council are looking for suggestions to apply for s106 and CIL funds.

What is s106 and CIL?

s106 (section 106) of the planning regulations adds requirements or costs to the landowner (at the time of commencement), s106 now sits alongside CIL (Community Infrastructure Levy), the tests are roughly issues:

- Necessary to make the development acceptable in planning
- Directly related to the development, and;
- Fairly and reasonably related in scale and kind to the development.

What is infrastructure?

this is roughly put - the inbetween bits of a place...

- -- Physical infrastructure: e.g. highways, transport links, cycleways, energy supply, water, flood alleviation, waste management
- Social infrastructure: e.g. education, health, social care, emergency services, art and culture, sports halls, community halls, faith, crematoria
- Green infrastructure. e.g. parks, woodlands, play areas, public open space

It should be noted that there is a separate section (s278) that should take account of roads (although i haven't seen any new roads lately!)

Suggestions

If you have suggestions let the Parish Clerk know, these could be anything (the editor wants cycle paths and to extend the cemetery but dealing with the landfill smell or village hall car park could be other suggestions)

Road Closure

There is an application to close the stretch of A415 road between standlake and newbridge from 13th of February for 7

The road is being closed for 'Essential Duct Repairs'? Objections have been made to closing the entire road but it is likely to go ahead.

The official diversion is via Oxford which is a little excessive, of course you can cross the ISIS at the toll bridge, and it is hoped that newbridge will be

accessible via Northmoor and Moreton Lane although this passage requires caution as it is a narrow lane.

Beware of Phishing Emails

Folks have been recieving 'phishing' emails from BT, the inland revenue and all sorts of places.

A phishing email is sent by nefarious gangsters (the bad kind of hackers) and made to look like it is official so that you login and give them your password, some scams only need you to click on the link to catch a virus or turn your computer into a 'Bot' to send more

nefarious emails.

If you get an email that looks suspicious, delete it! If you think it may be real always contact the company via the number on the bill and never click on links in emails if unsure.

ONE new council for the whole of Oxfordshire? Have your say.

Oxfordshire county council wants to know what you think about its draft proposal to abolish all six councils in Oxfordshire and replace them with a one new council for the whole county, called a 'unitary' council.

Why change?

Central government is changing the way councils are funded, and councils will soon have to pay for services mainly from council tax and business rates. Unless local government is reorganised. Oxfordshire councils will not be able to pay for vital public services for local communities and vulnerable people as the population increases and gets

The proposal

Oxfordshire currently has a two-tier local government - a county council plus five district and city councils. Oxfordshire County Council thinks that all of Oxfordshire's six councils should be abolished and replaced with one new unitary council which would save £20m each year - money that would pay for better services and keep council tax low. That money would be enough to fill over 300,000 potholes or provide 1 million hours of home care.

The new council would be simpler for residents and business, with one website and one point of contact. One councillor would represent your community and be accountable for all services. As members of an 'area board' serving the existing district or city areas, each councillor would take decisions affecting their community and also the county as a whole.

Environmental services such as street cleaning, countryside services and grounds maintenance would be properly joined up and managed locally to respond to community needs. Bringing together social services, housing, leisure and welfare benefits would mean joined up support for people who need extra help, improving health and wellbeing. And joining up planning, housing, jobs and transport would mean Oxfordshire's housing shortage can be addressed, along with investment in vital infrastructure such as roads. Without changing local government in Oxfordshire, further service cuts may be needed. The government is reducing funding and a unitary council is more financially sustainable in the long term.

Oxfordshire County Council believes a new council for the whole county makes most sense. Simpler. Better services. More local, Lower cost, That's what 'One Oxfordshire' means.

Join the debate

This is a draft proposal and Oxfordshire County Council wants to hear from residents, before finalising the proposal and sending it to the government for a decision.
