The subject: "Freeing the incarcerated from prisons of their own making" chosen by our Lecturer Canon Alan Hodgetts OSB Obl.

Let us go, sit in our cell...

...and our cell will teach us everything

These words of Abba Moses chime with the experience of this great man:

The cell is an ideal place to know yourself. People tend to measure themselves by external accomplishments, but jail allows a person to focus on internal ones, such as honesty, sincerity, simplicity, humility, generosity and an absence of variety. You learn to look into vourself. Mandela (who spent 27 years in prison)



Alan will help us explore why we do what we do and how the Enneagram can inspire transformation through Self Awareness, Self-Regulation and Self Compassion for all of us on both sides of the bars. The Enneagram comes into its own when the Pain of Change becomes less than the Pain of Remaining the Same.

"Once we recognise the prisons we make for ourselves - then not only will the Lord come to us as He promised (Mt. 25.37) - but we discover the Truth that can set us free (Jn. 8.32)"

Canon Alan Hodgetts was ordained priest in 1983, serving 2 curacies in Birmingham and Hereford dioceses and 2 incumbencies in Guildford Diocese. He became a Prison Chaplain in 2006 and is currently the Managing Chaplain of HMP Woodhill. He became an Oblate of Alton Abbey during his Diaconal Year in 1982 and increasingly finds his spiritual life underpinned by the 3 Benedictine promises of Obedience, Stability and Conversion of Life. He is a trained Spiritual Director in the Ignatian Tradition and more recently a Certified Teacher of the Enneagram in the Narrative Tradition, in June he helped to guide the first Enneagram Prison Project in a UK prison.

The Lecture will be followed by supper with wine in the Abbey Refectory



Community First Aid Courses by St John Ambulance

The St John Ambulance provides an 'Essential First Aid' course which thanks to local funding can be offered free of charge. The training can be held in the Village Hall – minimum eight, max 14 people, and is available to everyone aged 16 and over.

Courses can be held weekdays, evenings (usually 6-9.30pm) and Saturday mornings. Dates are likely to be available from late September onwards (though for Saturday mornings it may be longer). Please take the time to attend a course.

- Treatment of an unresponsive casualty for infant, child and adult
- Resuscitation for infant, child and adult
- Treatment of severe bleeding

<u>T/00352/19/DDD</u> (15th August) Old Church Cottage, St Marys Church Road, Mapledurwell. Notice of exempt work to protected trees – fell one Willow for safety reasons. A replacement tree to be planted within 5m of the original tree and to be no less than 2m in height.

<u>T/00346/19/TCA</u> (Validated 13th Aug) Webbs Farmhouse, Tunworth Road, Mapledurwell. Willow – repollard to previous pollard points.

<u>T/00323/19/TCA</u> (Granted 23rd August) Blaegrove House, Blaegrove Lane, Up Nately. T1 Yew – crown lift to no more than 5m over highway – reduce laterals, garden side, by 2m to balance crown.

<u>19/01994/FUL</u> (Validated 25th July) Nunnery House, Tunworth Road, Mapledurwell. Letter from Simon Butler - Vicar & Rector of the Benefice

Amongst the many thousands of graduation ceremonies in the US this year, one stands out as a little different. High School student Jack Higgins is severely autistic and hyper-sensitive to noise. His graduation ceremony posed a huge challenge with hundreds of students cheering and clapping in overwhelming joy. As he walked up onto the stage to receive his certificate he had his fingers in his ears.

What Jack didn't know was that his parents had arranged for his fellow students to give him a silent standing ovation. As he took his certificate Jack was congratulated with the silence of compassion.

The writer and commentator Adrian Hilton (who blogs under the pseudonym Archbishop Cranmer) wrote; "we live in a world of noise, but the wind in the trees and the music of the Lark have been invade by buzzes, commotion and crashes, not to mention the incessant clanging of social media. They may be inaudible, but they squawk at the soul like the pricks of needles. Our whole culture has become a cacophony of distraction and detached hearing: we are overwhelmed with social drumming, political yelling and noise."

I agree. And I think we need more silence.

Silence is good. In fact silence is golden. Especially in the presence of God.

It may be uncomfortable, but silence tests our shame, gives us space for self reflection and challenges us to appraise the depth of our soul. The chief purpose of silence in the church is to enable us to hear the voice of God. The chief purpose of silence in the world is to meditate on the self. In both cases we realise that busyness and lots of words are not the only route to well-being. Sometimes saying nothing is by far the better choice.

In the words of the former Archbishop of Canterbury Michael Ramsey "To learn from silence we have to do silence, and when we do silence we might just hear something we've never heard before."
