## **Community Policing News**

I begin this month with an appeal for any information concerning an assault that took place in the woods at The Barracks, Newnham during the afternoon of Monday March 18th 2019. At this time a local female resident was taking her dog for a walk when she was struck by someone in the woods and who then verbally abused her. This is very unusual in our area and from the information that I have at this time I can reassure residents that there is no danger or threat to them in this area. I am aware that a lady with her dog was entering the woods as the young victim and her dog were leaving, I ask if that person could please give me a call direct. If anyone can assist with any information in relation to this incident I ask that you please give me a call direct. As always all calls treated in strictest confidence.

Also in Newnham overnight of March 8th and 9th a garage was broken into at a home in Newnham Road and two chainsaws were stolen. I ask if anyone saw anything suspicious to again give me a call direct. On the night of March 9th again in Newnham an electric gate to a house in Crown Lane was damaged, these two crimes may well be linked and it would suggest that someone untoward was in the village looking for outbuildings to break into and property to steal.

On a similar note on March 19th 2019 at 2.18am a number of men were seen walking on the road at Newnham Green towards the pub with torches whilst others were waiting at the crossroads behind the road closed signs at the end of Crown Lane. They all then disappeared quickly. Later at 3.29am, that morning two saloon cars were seen coming from Crown Lane going towards Old Basing. I ask if anyone has CCTV to just have a check and see if it has captured anything of a suspicious nature on the nights of March 8th / 9th and the 19th.

On a personal note may I thank all those who kindly have sent me congratulations regarding the award I received from the Hampshire High Sherriff after a nomination from the Candovers Parish Council. The award is gratefully appreciated, however, I believe that I have the best policing job in Hampshire and it is my local residents that continue to support me that allow me to provide as dedicated service as I can, equally we all pay our council tax and should have a decent policing service. Thank you for all your support and to my team of Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinators who do an excellent job, thank you also to those that attended the social gathering at the Candovers Club on Thursday the 21st, your attendance was gratefully appreciated.



## Kidzone



A traditional fruit cake covered in marzipan with 11 small marzipan balls on top. These balls represent Jesus' disciples. "Hang on," I hear you say, "Jesus had 12 disciples!" True, but traditionally we leave off the one which represents Judas Iscariot. Do you remember why?

- 5 The 5 Js: John, James, James son of Apheus, Judas, Judas Iscariot

- T for Thomas


## HOT CROSS BUN RECIPE using a bread machine – super easy!

- 450g strong plain flour
- 1.5 tsp fast action dried yeast
- 200ml milk
- ½ tsp salt
- 1 tsp mixed spice (level)
- 75g caster sugar
- 50g butter, melted
- 1 medium egg
- 30g currants (more or less to taste)
- 30g mixed peel (or extra dried fruit), chopped



## Method:

- Add the ingredients in the order according to your manual (either wet or dry ingredients first)
- > Use the dough setting and add the dried fruit at the raisin beep
- ➤ Divide the dough into 12 pieces and shape into buns
- > Set the buns well apart on the prepared trays
- > Leave them in a warm place until doubled in size
- ➤ Make two cuts on the top of each bun to form a cross
- ➤ Bake just above the centre of the oven (200 / Gas Mark 6) for 15-20 minutes
- ➤ Glaze with a mixture of water and icing sugar.

## Letter from Revd Simon Butler

In about 1630 Rembrandt painted a picture called The Entombment. It is a striking picture of the entombment of Jesus that captures the hopelessness, grief and desolation of what many thought would be the end of Jesus of Nazareth.

In the picture Rembrandt manages something extraordinary as he uses golden flashes to portray dazzling bursts of light emanating from Jesus body. The only light in the picture comes from Christ, Rembrandt shows no other source.

Looking at the picture the way in which the light appears draws our minds back to paintings of the nativity scene. As the infant Jesus shone in the crib, so here, the adult Jesus shines in the tomb.

The painting attempts to depict the scene on Easter Saturday and in it we see the darkness of Good Friday and the joy of Easter Day. Darkness and light. Despair and hope. Rembrandt seems to have captured perfectly the opening lines of John's Gospel "the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it".

But a painting, a little like the Gospels themselves, can only go so far. Nothing, no account or picture could ever capture the full magnitude of the events surrounding Easter. But nonetheless we're given a window through which to look and see that in Jesus, in the cold tomb, life overcame death, the darkness was chased away by the glorious light of God, and new life can be found.

The Easter story is in one sense really that simple. That having died for the Sin of the world, Christ is raised in Victory, conquering sin and death, and proclaiming the offer of forgiveness and new life to all who will trust in him.

The first Easter marked a new beginning for Jesus' early followers. In response to the bewildering events they found themselves looking back at events in the distant past with fresh eyes that now made sense of the present. They looked to the future too with a renewed sense of hope and faith.

I wonder if this Easter might be for us a similar sort of turning point? A time when we might see afresh or even for the first time, the wonder of Jesus resurrection and allow it to heal our past and transform our future.

Over the Easter weekend all of our Churches will be re-telling the Easter story. Inviting us once again, not just to look but to see the risen Christ. And then, having seen, we are invited to embrace the new life that Jesus offers and encounter the living Christ in the here and now.
