The Village Hall Committee - CAN YOU HELP?

In April each year there is a meeting in the Village Hall to elect a new committee to run the Hall, which is a charity funded entirely by donations. We run a lot of events in the village, which we hope many of you reading this enjoy.

We are currently looking for new members to join in April - last year we did not have our full complement of members and would like in any case to expand the number of people on the committee to spread the load a little. If you are interested in getting involved please come along to a meeting - the next one is on 9 February - and look out for the date of our AGM!

We are also looking for associate members who are willing to help out from time to time. We are particularly looking for people who are interested in local history and would be willing to help with several projects to record Carlton's history and make it available to everyone via the village archive and online. We have several ideas for bringing history alive in Carlton-on-Trent but we need extra, interested hands to make it happen.

We are always looking for people willing to bake for events Costs are reimbursed. And although we have a dedicated kitchen squad who help with food preparation before events, we can always do with more hands. If you're a keen cook, fancy waiting on tables, or are able simply to peel spuds, your help would be most appreciated.

CARLTON NO COLD CALLING ZONE

The Parish Council are trying to set up a 'NO COLD CALLING' zone in Carlton on Trent. I am co-ordinating the effort. If you are visited by door to door salesmen, friendly or otherwise, please let me know so I can log the incident for the council. If possible take down the company they represent, vehicle license plate numbers etc. In the meantime I will be talking to the Council about getting an official designation and having signs put up in the village.

MAKE A NOTE OF IT!

With most annoyances the powers that be only act if there is proof. So note the details like company names and number plates of speeding vehicle or heavy lorries, and if possible take photos - of lorries' logos, of people and their pooping pooches, of potholes, of overhanging trees. This makes it much more likely that the Council will act.

REPORTING NUISANCES

Members of the public can report nuisances; you do not need to report them to a Parish Councilor first. And such things are often resolved faster if you do report direct because the Parish Council has to wait up to 2 months for their next meeting in order to action your issue.

If you have spotted something you are in the best position to describe what the problem is and where it lies to the relevant authority, and they will pay just as much attention to you as they will to a member of the Parish Council.

If you report something to the PC, we have to go and check it out in order to report it, and the Clerk's time is involved - admin which is ultimately paid for in the form of the Parish Council Precept levied on all households in Carlton. If you can help us take care of the village, we can keep the Precept as low as possible.

We have been having sewage problems this winter. If you see or smell anything, please report it to **Severn Trent**, even if it's something minor. Unless they log a lot of complaints they won't do anything to upgrade the pumping station despite frequent call outs to overflows. We know the sewers have been bad for years, but they say they have not had many complaints, so please call in problems to **0843 479 6678**, 24/7, and also tell the Parish Council. If you have sewage coming into your home or garden call the **Environment Agency** on **0800 80 70 60** as well.
