Parish Council

The meeting on 9th July was attended by 7 Councillors, the Clerk, 5 parishioners and both District Councillors.

Planning applications by Mr.& Mrs. D. Stubbs, 1, Manor Farm Cottages, Radley Road; P.& C. Jones, 2, Manor Farm Cottages and Mr. C. Mercer, Springfield House, The Turnpike have all been approved by the District Council.

A letter was read out from Mr.& Mrs R. Bull, The Cottage, Gray Lane concerning a possible planning application for a single dwelling at the far end of the paddock adjoining their house. Another letter was read out from a resident of Gray Lane expressing concern over this matter. It was concluded that a majority of the Parish Council would support such an application subject to certain conditions being attached to any permission granted.

Following a complaint about a hedge overhanging the pavement outside Halam Lodge, The Turnpike, it was agreed that the Clerk will write to the owner asking for it to be cut.

It was agreed to request the erection of a "No Through Road" sign at the end of Gray Lane.

It was agreed to carry out repairs to the roof of the Village Hall at an estimated cost of £60 and also pointing of brickwork up to the sum of approximately £50.

The finances of the Village Hall were discussed and it was agreed to increase all hire charges by £1 per hour with effect from Sept.1st 1993.

It was agreed to ask Notts County Council to carry out grass cutting on public footpaths.

The Parish Council requested the cooperation of parishioners to stop parking cars at the Village Hall, other than by those using the Hall.

Local Government Restructuring was discussed and it was agreed that the Parish Council would write to the Local Government Commission supporting the case for the District Council to become the new unitary authority for this area.

The next meeting will be on 27th August at 7.30pm. in the Village Hall.

Parish Council

A meeting was held on the 30th July and was attended by 7 Councillors, the Clerk and 1 parishioner. Both District Councillors were present.

It was agreed to recommend approval of an outline planning application by Mr. and Mrs. R. M. Bull for a single dwelling at the far end of the paddock adjoining The Cottage, Gray Lane, on condition that a covenant or legal restriction can be put on the remainder of the applicant's property to prevent further development.

It was agreed to recommend approval of a planning application by the Governing Body of Halam School to erect a single storey library room at the school.

Newark and Sherwood District Council are to hold a "Question Time" meeting at 7.30pm. on Wednesday 22nd. September in Oxton Village Hall. Anyone wishing to attend will be very welcome.

A meeting was held on 27th August at 7.30pm. in the Village Hall.

A planning application for a loft conversion at Littledale was passed, as was one by Mr.& Mrs.T.Hallam for a Granny Annexe at Holly House.

The Village Hall has had some repairs, a minor upgrading of the kitchen to bring it into line with required regulations and a retouching of the paintwork. It was agreed to pay the bill of £450 for this work.

Parishioners' attention is drawn to the fact that it is an offence to park on footpaths.

The next meeting will be on Friday 24th September at 7.30pm.

New Funding Programme at Halam Parish Church

Due to the difficult economic times and increasing costs the P.C.C. of St. Michael's Church has decided to try to improve its financial position so that it can minister to the needs of the village. If action is not taken the Church will no longer be able to pay its way. A new Regular Giving Programme will be started in October. Those who already give will be asked to review their support and new people will be asked to join this Programme. Everyone in the village will be contacted. Whether you attend the Church every week, just at Christmas or Easter, or just for weddings, baptisms etc. it is precious to each one of us and a unique part of our village. To launch the Programme special Parish Tea and Suppers will be held on Wednesday 10th and Thursday 11th November in the Village Hall where you can get to know about the plans and needs of our Church. Invitations will go out in mid October.
