

Visit to CGJ Mathias and Son Nurseries

Around 15 of us met at the nursery at 6.30pm which is set in beautiful open countryside in Tilford near Farnham. We were welcomed by Mr Mathias's 2 sons who gave us an overview of how the nursery started out and their business. We were later joined by Mr Mathias senior who gave us more background detail followed by a tour of the very extensive nursery which grew many different varieties of hedging plants and shrubs. The nursery deals in very large numbers of hedging plant varieties which are bought from a dealer in Holland who knows the quality of plants they require. The small plants were planted out in the surrounding fields, and then bought into the greenhouses to be grown on to a required size for sale to mostly large projects. Very specialised machinery is used for planting out the thousands of small plants in the fields, to potting up for the greenhouse and packing ready for shipment. After our extensive and interesting tour we were treated to a cup of tea and cake in their garden overlooking the Black lake. A very enjoyable and interesting evening arranged by Seumas.

NOTES FROM JULY 2022 PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

Review of Parish Assembly This was a positive event, a lot of work had gone into preparing the various presentations. Attended by PCSO Andy Jones, newly elected Ward Cllr Kate Tuck, four Parish Councillors and Clerk, and seven members of the public. A larger attendance had been hoped for, but noting people generally attend assemblies when there is a perceived threat to the village.

The Newsletter Whether to resume hard copy delivery to all? A best way forward is still to be decided. Notices have been included in *Newsletter* requesting 1. new editors, and 2. feedback on whether a pdf or hard copy is prefered.

The Parish Council recorded its ongoing thanks to Hazel Metz for organising collection and delivery of printed copies, and to Rachel Beresford-Davies for her contribution as editor. Rachel now having moved away, thanks to Christine Stanbury for picking up editorship of, at the moment, the majority of issues.

Neighbourhood Plan The NP team is waiting on consultants Special Advisory Services (SAS), South Downs National Park, who are restructuring their business. It's not know if they will be in a position to continue with work preparing the final draft Reg 15 for the Neighbourhood Plan.

STaNHD Preparing to publish an update on the AONB proposal to take back to Parishes.

Pond silt trap clearing HCC local highways engineer has advised that the silt traps, gullies and catchpits around the pond are on a cleansing frequency of three times a year. Parish Council seeking means to achieve more frequent visits.

Public Rights of Way The Parish Council recorded its thanks to Mark and Mandy Gifford for clearing the section of FP 1 as it goes along by Hoopers Mead.

Parish Lengthsman Next visit due 10th August. To strim and tidy around the pond being mindful of wildlife.

Village gateway signs Installed with thanks to HCC and all involved, photo of new sign on Farleigh Road by Manor Farm in July *Newsletter*.

Road name signs Signways (BDBC's appointed contractor) is due on 4th Aug to install replacement 'street name plates' (SNPs) throughout the village.

SID data – The Parish Council recorded its thanks Andy Fewster, who has downloaded the latest block of data from the Speed Indicator Device data recorders. Data shows

- More than 1 in 3 vehicles speeding.
- For Farleigh Road (sites at Southlea & Otters) over 45% speeding.
- 28 vehicles tripped the Southlea SID in excess of 60mph and one managed to do the same on Station Road.

A new SID position is to be opposite Manor Farm pointing back into the village to hopefully slow traffic down leaving the village past Otters.

Next Parish Council meeting Tuesday 6th September. Everyone welcome.

The chairman has regretfully accepted the resignation of Hazel Metz as a Parish Councillor, due to family commitments. POLICE UPDATE

HOW TO REPORT...

SCAM TEXTS & MOBILE CALLS

It's never been more important to protect yourself from scam calls and texts. Criminals often impersonate legitimate organisations in an attempt to dupe their victims and leave them out of pocket. So it's important to be extra cautious if you receive a text message about a parcel you may be expecting, for example, or a call claiming to be from your bank.

Research found that eight out of 10 in people experienced some form of phone scam last summer but fewer than two in 10 get reported to relevant authorities.

INTERNET SCAMS AND PHISHING

Report misleading websites, emails, phone numbers, phone calls or text messages you think may be suspicious. Do not give out private information (such as bank details or passwords), reply to text messages, download attachments, or click on any links in

emails if you're not sure they're genuine.

SUSPICIOUS EMAILS

 Forward the email to report@phishing.gov.uk

The National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC) will investigate it.

TEXT MESSAGES

• Forward the text message to 7726 – it's free. This will report the message to your mobile phone provider.

ADVERTS

- Report scam or misleading adverts to the Advertising Standards
 Authority. You can report adverts found online, including in search engines, websites or on social media.
- You can also report scam or misleading adverts to Google if you found them in Google search results, or report to Bing if you found them in Bing search results.

Contact Action Fraud if you think you've lost money or been hacked because of an online scam or fraud and you're in England or Wales.

LOCAL PLAN UPDATE

Water Cycle Study and Transport Impacts Review

Presentations on the Water Cycle Study and an preliminary Transport Impacts Review, from consultants AECOM and Jacobs respectively, were heard by Economic Planning Housing Committee (EPH) on Monday 18th July. The meeting and presentations are available to listen to online on the BDBC YouTube channel. There was insufficient time to cover all issues and discuss in detail so further meetings will be held the first week in September – to discuss these documents and the Reg 18 LPU Spatial Strategy document. This prior to the Cabinet meeting scheduled for 6th September. (EPH is prevented by constitution from meeting during August.)



TREES IN THE GARDEN OF THE JOLLY FARMER

Punch Taverns have withdrawn their application to Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council to fell two Sycamores and the 17 fruit trees in the Jolly Farmer pub garden. It is hoped that Punch will consult with local residents and their pub community over any future plans they have for the pub garden. To extend thanks to the BDBC tree officer for his consideration and proactive approach to this application.



Have your say on 20mph County Council speed limits across Hampshire

Councillor Edward Heron, Hampshire County Council's Executive Lead Member for Transport and Environment Strategy, says that:

'We are keen to hear from as many residents, businesses and other stakeholders as possible, to find out their views on the implementation of 20mph limits

...in the context of other highways priorities and the County Council's statutory duties to maintain the highway in a safe condition within a limited budget."

The findings from the survey, together with data about use of the highway, speed enforcement, road safety and environmental impacts, will be important in helping to shape future policy relating to 20mph speed limits in Hampshire and, in turn, future decision-making around 20mph speed limits.

MAYOR'S CHARITY APPEAL SKYDIVE

Mayor, Cllr Paul Miller, will make his first jump from a plane on Saturday 10 September for his chosen charities Tough Enough To Care and The Pink Place incorporating the Blue Space.

Cllr Miller will take the leap along with representatives from his charities and will free-fall from 15,000 feet before parachuting to the ground at Old Sarum airfield.

As a veteran of the Royal Air Force, Cllr Miller has amassed some 400 hours of flying time. He says: 'As an ex-RAF pilot I am well-used to flying and have had the opportunity to take the controls of a range of aircraft but I have never actually jumped from a plane...

'Although the thought of the skydive is daunting, I really want to overcome that apprehension... any sponsorship, no matter how big or small, would mean the world to me and make a real difference to my charities.'

SURGERY UPDATE - June 2022

BBC Panorama - Undercover: Britain's Largest GP practice

At our June meeting we did, of course, discuss the recent Panorama programme about Operose. The question was asked as to whether CGH use Physician Associates (PA) in their surgeries in Basingstoke. There is one PA, who sits in Gillies Health Centre. We were assured that qualified doctors monitor the PA and that time is built into the daily schedules for this to happen.

We also addressed the issue of updating of patients' records with letters from hospitals, consultants etc. Operose confirmed that all such communications are posted to patients' records within 24 hours of receipt, but that these very often take a long time to be received from the hospitals. There is currently no backlog at CGH.

We have been informed that the BMA will be investigating Operose as a result of the programme and we will update you once their findings are reported.

The Operose Model

Operose gave a short presentation to us on the benefits for Beggarwood patients of being part of the CGH group. This presentation formed part of the Health Update meeting, called by Maria Miller MP, on Saturday 16th July 2022, at 10am – 11am, at the Beggarwood Community Centre. This meeting was to meet representatives from Operose and to find out more about their model of healthcare and how this will impact Beggarwood surgery. Attendees were able to ask questions and give their views. Our next update will include a precis of the meeting and any actions agreed.

Staffing

We discussed the current staffing of Beggarwood surgery, which is at the right level for number of patients. Some of the doctors are locums but they are long term having stayed on after NHUC's contract expired. A new clinical lead for Beggarwood has been appointed commencing 4th July 2022.

DriQ

This has now been rolled out across all the Operose surgeries in our area and they report a good take-up of the service and an improved patient experience. What are your experiences using the app?
