JULY'S FARMING NEWS

Harvest started on July 16th and we have completed the Winter Barley and are nearly half way through the Winter Oilseed Rape. Yields so far seem a little above average but perhaps the seed bushel weight (seed size) seems slightly lower than usual. We have now been on hold for four or five days due to the recent inclement weather with the rainfall measuring 82 mm in the rain gauge.

On the 18th July we all welcomed a new arrival to the farm. This is a lovely white Charolais cross heifer that can now be viewed above the cricket pitch with the remainder of the beef cattle.

We have noticed a dramatic increase recently in the number of Red Kites in the area and there were in fact 15 following the Topdown cultivator last week!

Let us hope summer returns very soon.

COUNTRY NOTES

18th July

The bridleway above Starveall farm leading up to Old Down has steep banks, in places five feet high, cutting off views across the fields to the sides. The passage of countless human feet, horse and sheep hooves, cart wheels, and the erosive effects of water have cut through the soft chalk to create a holloway, an ancient sunken track. The steepness of the banks make it impossible to cultivate resulting in a profusion of wild flowers, a riot of colour! The purples of knapweed, the blues of meadow cranesbill, scabious and tufted vetch, the yellows of common toadflax, ladies bedstraw, birds foot trefoil and agrimony. Only red flowers are missing from this palette, although the older cranesbill leaves are turning crimson and make up for this shortfall. All these plants have created a "butterfly alley" frequented by small heaths, marbled whites, gatekeepers, ringlets and the rare sighting of a fritillary, exact species unknown but possibly a dark green fritillary. More time spent watching no doubt would have increased the list. The flowers and foliage of these plants are a source of nectar for the adults and a source of food for their caterpillars.

PUMP HUNT FOR SEWAGE STATION OWNERS

- **Thames Water to take on the responsibility of 4,000 sewage pumping stations from property owners and managers**
- **Utility will take over electricity and maintenance costs under new legislation, potentially saving customers thousands of pounds**
- **Firm appeals for help tracking 1,800 'missing' stations**

Thames Water is appealing to customers to help identify privately owned sewage pumping stations. The utility, which serves 15 million customers across London and the Thames Valley, will take responsibility for around 4,000 pumping in October 2016, but needs to track down 1,800 currently off its radar.

New legislation means sewage pumping stations, which power wastewater away from properties and out into the public sewer pipe network, currently owned and maintained by customers will become legally owned and operated by the local water company.

The pumping stations are found in all shapes and sizes, and can be in places where there are a number of properties needing to connect to the public sewer network. Customers will know they have one as they'll be paying to maintain and power them.

Jerry White, of Thames Water, said: "This is really good news for customers. We'd urge anyone who thinks they may have one to get in touch so we can check they are eligible for the transfer of ownership. In some cases, as well as

electricity savings, maintaining and replacing pumps can cost thousands of pounds so it's an excellent deal for them.

"We believe we know where approximately half of the stations we need to take over are, but really need help to find the other 1,800. Please get in touch if you think this applies to you and we can take on the responsibility forever."

A sewer pumping station is likely to be 'adopted' by Thames Water if it:

- was in use before July 2011 (and)
- serves a single property, and is outside the property boundary (or)
- serves two or more properties
