	consultation as it questioned the need for a Local Gap, which in turn					
	underpins a significant part of the NDP. The NDP is required to be compliant					
	with the Local Plan. Cllr Shah would be seeking Cllr opinions and may need					
	to seek advice from Dr D Nicholson who advised on the NDP.

	savings proposals Hampshire County Council is reminding local residents that					
	they have just under two weeks to give their views on proposals to save					
	£680,000 from its Adult Social Care budget to help meet the County Council's					
	overall budget shortfall of at least £80million by April 2023. The proposed					
	changes, which could contribute £320,000 towards this target, would end grants					
	currently provided to voluntary, community and social enterprise organisations					
	across Hampshire:					
	1.1. the Neighbourhood Care and Support grant scheme					
	1.2. the Community Based Support grant scheme					
	1.3. the Rural Connections grant scheme.					
	Additionally, a further £360,000 could be contributed by reducing funding for					
	commissioned non-statutory services that support people who are homeless or at					
	risk of homelessness. Homelessness support would continue to receive some £2					
	million of County Council discretionary funding, focused on prioritising help in					
	accommodation-based settings, and those services that work with the most					
	vulnerable - as well as delivering outreach and community-based support in					
	those areas where accommodation is not available.

	contribute some £40.6 million to the Local Authority's overall £80 million savings
