7	Invite Hampshire Constabulary to a meeting, with a computer available, to show the group residents how to volunteer for a speed checking project. Re-examine the relevance of existing speed limits and will consider the impact of long stretches of road without pavements. The group to liaise with other similar groups in the area in order to pursue common aims. The above mentioned community group to keep abreast of funding opportunities (such as house insulation), regularly publish findings and assist with applications where required.
