OPEN VILLAGE HALL MEETING ON 16 JULY AT 8 PM. Dries Hagen

Further to my article, Call to Arms, as circulated in early May I would like to update you on the status of issues surrounding our Village Hall.

As an asset which is virtually gifted we still have some way to go before a sustainable solution is in place to ensure the Village Hall survives. We need to raise funds to the tune of £1,300 per annum over and above current revenues if we want to keep the Village Hall as it is. Many members of the community also agree that the Hall needs additional "TLC" if it is to remain a valued asset of the community. By additional TLC I mean upgrading where for instance the West Ilsley under Fives club don't have to keep their coats on when they convene once a week during winter months. Harsh words you might say. Yes, is say! If you knew me you would understand.

I mentioned in the May report that our hall has in the past benefitted from well supported management committees. Unfortunately in recent times the committee was not that well supported by the community and as such was effectively disbanded along with any fund raising initiatives.

A big thank you to the 5 volunteers who turned up on the 11th of June to discuss the issues at hand. Whilst the discussion was fairly general with some good brainstorming we were all in agreement that we need more interested parties. The Village Hall will not survive if the management as well as fund raising falls to only half a dozen people.

LAND GIRLS GATHER WITH THEIR MEMORIES

Land Girls who helped to keep the people of Berkshire and North Hampshire fed during the last war were celebrated on Sunday (23 June) when survivors from a bygone age gathered with their memories

The get-together happened at the initiative of the Royal County of Berkshire Show which will say a formal thank you at this year's event on 21 and 22 September to women whose role is often forgotten. In the meantime, the organisers decided to hold a tea party so that those who will take part in the show could meet one another in advance.

Amongst them was Meg Stone from Compton.



Some 100,000 Land Girls took over in Britain's fields between 1939 and 1950; while they did not prevent food rationing they did help the nation avoid famine. Some joined straight from school at 17. Others left roles as barmaids, secretaries, maids, hairdressers and factory workers to learn new

skills on farms, earning 28 shillings a week, of which half was deducted for board and lodgings. More than 30 former members of the Land Army from all over Berkshire, Oxfordshire and North Hampshire responded to an appeal from Newbury and District Agricultural Society earlier in the year. Given age and infirmity, some are no longer able to travel, but more than a dozen made the journey on Sunday to the home of Show President Sally Stockings near Wallingford.

In an address to the former Land Girls, Sally Stockings, who runs a successful pig farm, said: "You changed things for women in agriculture. And for that we will be eternally grateful". Ali Brown, Berkshire Show chairman, added: "It is only in the past few years that the nation has given proper recognition to the Women's Land Army from both world wars in growing food at a time when men were fighting. As the modern face of farming in Berkshire, we were keen to contact those who are still alive and make a bit of a fuss of them."

92-year-old Meg Stone was born in St Albans. Meg's grandmother thought she should do something to help the war effort and Meg knew the lady running the Women's Land Army in Berkshire so she volunteered in 1942, working as a land girl in Shropshire, Warwickshire, Berkshire, Cambridgeshire and Devon. She overcame a fear

of cows to become a dairy maid and grew to rather like them before too long. Meg would rise at 4.30am ready to start milking at 5am. She had to work 7 days a week with only three days leave a year. It was hard work and tiring so after a year Meg moved to another farm that allowed her one weekend a month off. While working at Manor Farm, West Ilsley, Meg had a milk round, using a pony and cart to deliver the milk.

The Land Army girls will be just one of many attractions at this year's Royal County of Berkshire Show at the Newbury Showground where they will on one day meet RAF parachutists and on the other take a salute from the RAF Battle of Britain's Memorial Flight as wartime bombers fly overhead.

Competition amongst livestock is looking as strong as ever and there will also be opportunities for families to enjoy a host of rare breeds amongst the ever-popular cattle, sheep, pigs and poultry. Favourites returning include the captivating Sheep Show, in which the woolly stars dance to disco music, and Sports Zone with its host of hands-on activities for children and electric displays of BMX and skateboarding from Team Extreme.


