Decision regarding application for designation of the Lilleshall Parish Council
area as a neighbourhood area

Borough of Telford and Wrekin (“the Council”) received from Lilleshall Parish Council an application under Regulation 5 of the above Regulations for the Council to designate the area comprising the Lilleshall Parish Council administrative area as a neighbourhood area within the meaning of section 61 G of the above Act (see explanatory note below).

NOTICE IS GIVEN that on 8 June 2016 under section 61G of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and all other enabling powers and after consultation and being satisfied that the area is appropriate for designation as a neighbourhood area, the Council has designated the administrative area of Lilleshall Parish Council as a neighbourhood area (for the purposes of section 61G (1) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 as amended).

The name of neighbourhood area is the administrative area of Lilleshall Parish Council.
