### 31 **WELCOME & APOLOGIES**

### 32 **PUBLIC SESSION** – No members of the public present.

#### **County Councillor Report**

- Tim Davies noted that Hampshire County Council is shortly to appoint a new leader.

- News is not good re the No7 bus. The service was initially suspended with the road closure (South East Water) but when the road reopens the service won't resume between Hartley Wintney and Riseley.

### 33 **MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING** of 21st February agreed and signed.

### 34 **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST** in items on the Agenda – none.

### 35 **HOUND GREEN**

- .1 **Goat Willows** coppiced 2nd March – on corner of Hound Green Close and Hudsons Meadow. Work undertaken on behalf of the Parish Council by groundsman PGGM and tree surgeon in response to resident requests. Log piles left (logs collected by residents); smaller brash left for wildlife as tidily as possible. **APPENDIX I**
- .2 **Hound Green Trees** – A check of all other Hound Green trees showed some works required. Undertaken (again by PGGM and tree surgeon) on 7th and 8th March.

AGREED Identified safety work complete, further work to follow in accordance with arboricultural survey (date tba) and plan of works.

Arboricultural survey – Advice received – Generally, if it can wait, when the trees are in leaf is optimum time to inspect. But it can be undertaken anytime of the year. Quotes received so far for full survey of Hound Green trees – £1,250 plus VAT and £995 plus VAT.

- .3 **Moles** – Price quoted for moles is £50 for first mole, £15 each one after that (for related group of visits). Mole catcher will visit the Green this coming week.

#### .4 **Phone box**

i Location Following confirmation at last meeting (February 2022) that the phone box is to be rehomed to the former bus shelter base, HCC Highways have confirmed that this site is not covered by Highways Rights

'The back edge of the footway is assumed to be the extent of the public highway (shown hatched red on the attached plan **APPENDIX II**), meaning the base is outside the highway and we would have no comment on the box being placed on it.' Email of 21st March 2022, from Principal Highways Engineer.

ii Restoration should recommence with the summer. Suggestion to use a commercial company to 'sand blast' ready for repainting.

- .2 Jubilee bench** Discussion – Support expressed for carved bench – as provided by Hart’s supplier and as existing Hound Green furniture which receives positive feedback. Price for hand crafted benches is premium (c£2K plus installation). Tim Davies noted longevity of wrought iron bench which would have a life expectancy of at least 120 years, citing the 1897 Queen Victoria Diamond Jubilee bench on Dunley’s Hill between Odiham and North Warnborough – the inscription is still clearly legible.

ACTION Chairman to attend meeting scheduled for 31st March

Emailed letter from Steering Group 9th March 2022

‘A Steering Group is aiming to re-form Hartley Wintney Twinning Association (HWTa). A few years ago, HWTa was dissolved as it was unable to form a committee, and care of the Twinning arrangement passed to Hartley Wintney Parish Council (HWPC). In November, a group of people interested in resurrecting the Association met and we now intend to reconstitute the Association at an Inaugural Annual General Meeting on 31 March 2022.

‘Hartley Wintney’s relationship with Saint-Savin in France and Malle in Belgium is proclaimed by the road signs around the Village. However Mattingley, Winchfield, Rotherwick, and Heckfield are also parties to the Agreement.

'The Twinning started in 1981 with Saint-Savin in the Vienne department of France, a beautiful commune boasting a UNESCO World Heritage Site abbey. In 2000, we extended the Twinning to include Malle in the Antwerp region of Belgium, which was already twinned with Saint-Savin. This made twinning visits abroad much easier to achieve, as Malle is more accessible than Saint-Savin, and resulted in the sale of Westmalle Trappist beers at the annual Hartley Wintney festival. Over the years, numerous events were organised to bring the communities together, but after 2011 the emphasis changed to organizing twinning events for members of the youth community. Thereafter, interest waned, and the Association was dissolved.'

'Our aim now is to introduce a much lighter form of Twinning, casting off major, expensive twinning events requiring serious fundraising, and to promote smaller liaisons between groups of individuals and organisations. Over the years, local organisations have got involved with our twinned communities, including Hartley Wintney Football Club, St John's Church, Hook Eagle Morris Men, and Hartley Wintney Fire Station and we hope that these and more may explore the possibility of visiting or hosting like-minded people from similar organisations in Saint-Savin and Malle, with HWTa assisting where possible.

'We on the Steering Group feel that it was often overlooked that the Twinning Agreement included not one but five parishes. The draft Constitution states that the principal aim is: To promote and foster friendship and understanding between the people, organisations and interest groups of the Parishes of Hartley Wintney, Winchfield, Mattingley, Rotherwick and Heckfield (the Parishes) and the people, organisations and interest groups of the canton of Saint-Savin (France) and Malle (Belgium). All residents aged 18 and over of the Parishes are automatically considered to be members of the Association (the Members) and as we relaunch HWTa, we want to ensure that the residents of all the Parishes are kept informed of Twinning news and have equal access to Twinning events.

'To this end, we expect that HWPC will create an HWTa web page on its website and we would ask that your Parish considers doing the same. HWTa has a noticeboard in the High Street in Hartley Wintney and we would ask that your parish might display HWTa notices on your noticeboards. By taking these and possibly other actions, we hope that all five parishes will feel equally involved in Twinning.'

'The Inaugural AGM will take place at 19:30 on 31 March 2022 at the WI Hut in Green Lane, Hartley Wintney.'

- .3 Greening campaign** Due to urgency of Climate Emergency and energy crisis, the Greening Campaign is combining its Phase I with Phase II 'Retrofit' to enable support from the funded packages more quickly. Full set-up instructions are included within the pack and we recommend a trial set-up and lighting before the actual event to familiarise yourself with the set up and operation. ## Traditional country inn The Shoulder of Mutton in Hazeley Heath set to open under new owners

16 February 2022

Savills, on behalf of Tavern Property Company Limited, has completed the freehold sale of The Shoulder of Mutton in Hazeley Heath, Hampshire to Hidden Gem Restaurants for an undisclosed sum off a marketing guide of £600,000.

The detached traditional country inn spans 3,918 sq ft (364 sq m) across ground floor trading and ancillary areas and first floor living accommodation. Located to the rear of the property is a terrace and beer garden. The first floor is configured to provide four bedrooms, reception, kitchen and bathroom. There is a tarmac car park with space for approximately 30 vehicles. It occupies a plot measuring approximately 0.957 acres (0.387 hectares).

The Shoulder of Mutton, which closed permanently before the pandemic, is one of 21 properties listed as an Asset of Community Value by Hart District Council.

The Shoulder of Mutton is located in the village of Hazeley Heath approximately 2.5 miles north-east of the larger village of Hartley Wintney and 11 miles from Reading and Basingstoke. The green space of Hazeley Heath area is a designated Site of Special Scientific Interest and within the Thames Valley Basin Heaths Special Protection Area.

Jon Taylor, Director at Hidden Gem Restaurants, says: "We are delighted to have acquired The Shoulder of Mutton. My family have lived around the corner from The Shoulder of Mutton for 15 years and were saddened to see this local favourite close during Covid. We have bought the pub with a family friend who is a chef at one of the top restaurants in the country and have a vision to transform it back into a warm, inviting pub offering good quality, locally sourced, food and a extensive range of local beers and spirits. We look forward to welcoming everyone back, and feel sure they will be pleasantly surprised by what awaits them."

Chris Bickle, Director in the Licensed Leisure team at Savills Southampton, says: "The sale of The Shoulder of Mutton was concluded after receiving multiple offers. It was evident that people wanted to see the pub returned to its former glory and so it is a very pleasing outcome to hear of the new owner's plans. We wish them every success."

### PHASE 3

### PHASE 4

#### Adapting to a different climate

A Community Adaptation Toolkit which helps you evaluate the risks climate change will bring to your community. Understand climate, and understand weather. The Packs together lead you to possible solutions so your community can adapt and flourish.

## PHASE 1

The idea of Phase 1 is to answer 'What difference will it make if I change the way I live my life?'

Well this Campaign is about demonstrating (and quantifying) how much – collectively – small individual actions make the big difference.

'The power of the individual lies in the community. By acting together, your voice becomes an effective tool – an effective community response to an international problem – both in reducing CO<sub>2</sub> and also, your £s affecting what products are sold on the shelves.'

'10 people putting in renewable energy now, is not nearly as effective as 200 people conserving energy now and later replacing that with renewables. This is not meant to be an eco town running eco events. It is about small changes.'

So... Each Phase contains an Information Pack, on-line resources, videos, and supports you by email. You can sign-up to one Phase at a time... and having achieved, or be *en route* to achieving, Phase 1, the scheme brings access to a wider network of support.

## PHASE 2

2. 'Retrofit' supported by the Sustainability Centre, and
