Making the most of the river in our village!

As some of you may remember, the highway at the end of Ferry Lane was changed last year, such that villagers can walk along the route of the Thames Path but no longer access the river from the wharf area. To clarify, the Thames path goes past the entrance to the Beetle and Wedge and then crosses in front of the restaurant, with the river to your left. It then carries on past Thames Reach and the Egyptian House towards Streatley.

The only bit from which the public can now access the river is the area to the left of the wharf, directly behind the willow tree. This is at right angles to the area marked for ferry use and abutting the river frontage for Beetle and Wedge House.

This area includes quite a short bit of landing stage and has not been regularly maintained. However, with the growth in popularity in wild water swimming, kayaking, and paddle boarding, we would like to get your thoughts as to how we can make best use of this area going forwards.

At this stage, we are looking to gather ideas and get some approximate estimates for necessary work. Anyone interested in being involved with this, please contact myself (spowell@moulsford-pc.org.uk) or Hilary Shaw (hshaw@moulsford-pc.org.uk).

OCC's 20mph initiative

OCC are rolling out a 20mph initiative across the county as part of their traffic policy and some of you kindly completed an initial survey. The results of this survey indicated that the majority of villagers who completed it would prefer the speed limit through Moulsford to remain at 30mph rather than change to 20mph. Instead, we were asked as a council to look at alternative traffic calming measures, as well as general issues with potholes, etc.

This is just to let you know that I have got the ball rolling on the alternative measures and have some indicative costs to us as a village. However, I do not yet know projected timescales for such work (likely to be 2025 onwards) so will report back when I have more information. You should also be aware that we have now received a revised design for a 20mph speed limit in Moulsford from OCC, which as a council we are reviewing. This encompasses the central part of the village only and may be acceptable to a wider range of villagers than the original proposal. Again, more about that shortly.

Potholes (including Underhill and Halfpenny Lane)

I have been communicating with the OCC Highways Engagement team, regarding both the state of Underhill (including the section formerly flooded) and Halfpenny Lane. Progress as follows:

- They have now agreed to prioritise the work in Underhill and I have sent them details of exactly where the
 problems are, as well as an explanation of why the drains are blocked. I have also copied our OCC councillor,
 Felix Bloomfield. I hope they will get to the potholes within the next couple of weeks but am not yet sure
 who will resolve the problem with the drains.
- There are plans to resurface Halfpenny Lane in the financial year 2024-25. See Map (highway-iams.uk) which leads to the map of proposed works.
- I suggested that OCC consider installing additional passing places which are tarmacked but have been informed that there is insufficient highway land width to install these. Unfortunately, until this is sorted it is likely we will continue to have problems with damaged verges, particularly to the left of the road as you leave from the village.

Neighbourhood Priority Statement (NPS) - Pilot Study

There was a lot of work carried out on this pilot study in 2022-23 (in fact, we were the first village to complete the scheme!). Just to give you an update on what is happening with it now....

The document is almost complete; I just need to update the section on river access in the light of the decision made by OCC to alter the highway at the end of Ferry Lane in May 2022.

However, the NPS will not be fully operational in SODC until the government have passed the legislation relating to this. This was due in in October last year but has still not been approved. In the mean time I am in regular contact with SODC Planning to monitor progress.

However, our draft plan has already been referred to in several recent planning decisions, so is proving useful.

Note that the Neighbourhood Priority Statement is not the same as a Neighbourhood Plan. Specifically, it is a much briefer document and has an advisory role only. Creating a neighbourhood plan from the Neighbourhood Priority Statement would be possible, since it already covers similar topics, but is not yet something that as a council we have time to take forward.

Wallingford Local Producers Market (WLPM) is held every Saturday morning from 10am to 12:30pm.

Markets are held in St Mary's Church in the centre of Wallingford. Usually, our food stalls can be found outside with our craft stalls inside.



WLPM hosts the best of locally-produced food and crafts that are grown, harvested and made within 30 miles of Wallingford. We champion local farmers and vegetable growers, cheese-makers, bakers, and makers of honey and preserves. Every market has a range of craft stalls including textiles, jewellery, ceramics, art and photography, all hand-made by local people.

Wallingford Emergency Food Bank

We are a registered charity operating a food bank based in the centre of Wallingford with the aim of providing emergency food packages to those who need them. Wallingford Emergency Food Bank was set up by Churches Together in the Wallingford Area and we began serving the community in 2011.

Moulsford Author to release Song of Love

On March 1st, I had a book published with my co-writer, Pat Abercromby, who is already a published author. £1.5 million grant from the Government's Species Survival Fund to boost nature recovery in the North Wessex Downs National Landscape

A £1.5 million grant has been secured by the team at the North Wessex Downs National Landscape Partnership from the Government's Species Survival Fund. The grant is for the Partnerships for Nature programme – a suite of projects across seven sites which will restore and enhance a range of important habitats for a diversity of species, making the landscape a better place for nature.

Last year, the North Wessex Downs team published a Nature Recovery Plan which identifies priorities for restoring nature in the protected landscape. The funding will focus conservation effort on the programme's seven sites and kickstart delivery against the Plan.

Work within the Partnerships for Nature programme will help to restore and enhance heathland and wood pasture at Bucklebury Common, chalk grassland restoration at Tidcombe near Marlborough, chalk stream and river bank improvement on the River Kennet, also benefitting wet woodland and floodplain meadow, wetland creation at Pangbourne, new cultivated field margins near Lambourn for arable plants, ash management and hazel coppice restoration at Moor Copse, Tidmarsh and regenerative arable field management at the Earth Trust at Little Wittenham.

DEFRA Minister Rebecca Pow MP visited one of the seven sites, Bucklebury Common, earlier in March to learn about the proposals and heard first-hand about how the grant will impact nature recovery.

Match funding from other sources takes the total value of the programme to £1.7 million which involves multiple partners including farmers, private-landowners and environmental non-government organisations. Partnerships for Nature will run until March 2026.

The Government's Species Survival Fund was developed by Defra and its Arm's- Length Bodies. It is being delivered by The National Lottery Heritage Fund in partnership with Natural England and the Environment Agency.

Work within the Partnerships for Nature programme will include introducing grazing and other habitat features to lowland heath (the largest remnant of this rare habitat in the North Wessex Downs) and wood pasture at Bucklebury Common, benefitting birds such as nightjar and woodlark and other vulnerable species such as crickets and lizards.

Chalk grassland restoration at Tidcombe will provide more homes for butterfly species such as the chalk hill blue and Duke of Burgundy butterflies. Chalk stream and riverbank improvement on the River Kennet SSSI will support the unique and threatened ecology of these globally-important and rare habitats, helping species such as water vole and Desmoulin's whorl snail and other declining invertebrates.

Other project outcomes such as wetland habitats created at Pangbourne, new cultivated field margins at Sheepdrove Organic Farm and regenerative arable field management at The Earth Trust will encourage a range of wildlife including threatened arable plants and declining farmland birds such as lapwing.

Corinna Woodall, Project Development and Funding Officer for the North Wessex Downs National Landscape Partnership said: "We are really thrilled to have been successful in our bid to the Species Survival Fund and are very excited to be working with our partners on this ambitious and far-reaching partnership programme. Through this grant we will make some real progress towards achieving some of the key priorities identified in our Nature Recovery Plan and help to bring nature back into our National Landscape.

The Partnerships for Nature programme will be co-ordinated by the team at the North Wessex Downs National Landscape Partnership. Programme partners include Action for River Kennet (ARK), the Benham Estate, the Bucklebury Estate, BBOWT, Earth Trust, Southern Streams Farmer Group and the Farming and Wildlife Advisory Group South-East, the Sulham Estate, Sheepdrove Organic Farm and Plantlife.

The Species Survival Fund, a partnership between Defra and The National Lottery Heritage Fund, has seen grants of up to £3 million awarded across England for habitat creation and restoration projects to run over the next two years. The Fund will help halt and reverse the decline in species abundance by preserving vital habitats. The new funding is supporting projects that tackle habitat loss, safeguard our fragile ecosystems, and create and restore nature-rich landscapes full of wildlife-friendly habitats within precious chalk streams, wetlands, heathlands, grasslands and scrublands. The fund will create and improve natural habitats, helping Defra to meet their target to protect 30% of land for nature by 2030 (known as 30by30).

The Species Survival Fund builds upon the success of similar initiatives like the Green Recovery Challenge Fund and will create the foundations for ongoing expansion of habitats to support our wildlife. In 2020 North Wessex Downs National Landscape was successful in bidding for £400K from the Green Recovery Challenge Fund for their Sparkling Streams partnership project which was completed in March 2022.
